With that heeding comes a rather fast-paced year of district events, increased marketing, and club growth. We're going to be moving fast and aggressively this year in District 33 S. As with every year, your Governor has a message to supplement the International Theme and International President's message and this year's district message encompasses that bold attitude of aggressive growth: Voyage Ahead! It serves as an idea and an imperative.

As an idea, it harkens to the golden era of adventure, expedition, and discovery. Consider the names Vespucci, Lewis & Clarke, Gagarin, Shira, Curie, Armstrong, and Carver. As we are a service organization, service projects are our best tool for marketing ourselves. You can work with our District LCIF chairpersons to help you file for those grants. If your club doesn't qualify for a grant, let this be a call to increase your support of our foundation! We're targeting \$100,000 in donations this year. If donating to LCIF is the biggest unknown for your club this year, consider starting or increasing your donation – Voyage Ahead!

As with any voyage, there are many things for us to think about and plan. It's key to do that as a team! It is the highest privilege and honor to serve as your District Governor this year. I promise to give you my fullest effort this year and humbly ask that you do the same to propel our District to the heights and merits that it truly deserves. We have officially set sail on our one-way expedition into the future. There's no slowing down and there's no standing still. Lions and Leos, I'm with you and ready to serve at your pleasure. Voyage Ahead!



TO PROMOTE the principles of good government and good citizenship.

TO TAKE an active interest in civic, cultural, social, and moral welfare of the community.

TO UNITE the clubs in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship, and mutual understanding.

TO PROVIDE a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest; provided, however, that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by club members. **TO ENCOURAGE** service-minded people to serve their community without personal financial reward, and to encourage efficiency and promote high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works, and private endeavors.

Lions Code of Ethics

TO SHOW my faith in the worthiness of my vocation by industrious application to the end that I may merit a reputation for quality of service.

TO SEEK success and demand fair remuneration or profits as my just do, but to accept no profit or success at the price of my own self-respect lost because of unfair advantage taken or because of questionable acts on my part.

TO REMEMBER that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down another's; to be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.

... meets regularly with fellow Lions and through the common denominator of "Friendship" confers, plans, and carries out the objectives of Lionism.

... is an ordinary individual, enjoys fun and good fellowship, and, although not perfect, is ever mindful of "Human Concern".

... is faithful to family and uncompromising in one's principles.

MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES

- Active Active membership is the "typical" category of Lions membership. Active members who meet all requirements of Lions membership receive all benefits.
- Affiliate An affiliate member is someone who is not able to participate as an active member of the club but desires to support the club and its community service initiatives.
- Associate An associate member has active membership in one Lions club and associate membership in a second club in their community of residence or employment.

MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES (cont.)

- **Honorary** An honorary members is not a member of the Lions club but may be granted honorary membership by a Lions club for having performed outstanding service.
- Life A life member is a Lion who has maintained active membership for at least 20 years, or at least 15 years if the member has reached age 70. Life membership may also be granted to a Lion who is critically ill.
- **Memberat-Large** A member who has moved or for health or other reason cannot regularly attend meetings. They can't seek office, must pay all dues, and can vote on club matters when present.
- **Privileged** A privileged member is a Lion who has been a member 15 or more years but must relinquish active status because of illness, infirmity, advanced age or other reason.

MEMBERSHIP TYPES

In addition to regular membership, Lions International offers special membership programs for families, college students, former Leos and young adults.

- New Members pay an entrance fee of US\$35 or must submit the proper waiver certification form. International dues total US\$48 annually. Dues are billed on a semi-annual basis. Additional club, district multiple district dues may apply.
- **Transfer** Transfer members in good standing pay no entrance fee when transferring to an existing club within 12 months.
- **Family** The Family Membership Program provides families with the opportunity to receive a special dues discount when they join a Lions club together. The first family member (head of household) pays full international dues (US\$48), and up to four additional family members pay only half the international dues (US\$24).

All family members pay the one-time entrance fee (US\$35). The Family Membership Program is open to family members who are (1) eligible for Lions membership, (2) currently in or joining the same club and (3) living in the same household and related by birth, marriage or other legal relationship. Common household family members include parents, children, spouses, aunts and uncles, cousins, grandparents, inlaws and legal dependents. Submit via MyLCI, or include the Family Unit Certification Form with the Monthly Membership Report (MMR).

Student A privileged member is a Lion who has been a member 15 or more years but must relinquish active status because of illness, infirmity, advanced age or other reason.

MEMBERSHIP TYPES (cont.)

Current/ Former LEO (Leo-Lion) Current or former Leos seeking membership, who are through the age of 35 and have served as a Leo for at least a year and a day, pay half international dues and receive an entrance/charter fee waiver under the Leo-Lion membership program.

Leo-Lion should be selected as the membership type in the Lions Portall. Leos over age 35 who have served as a Leo for at least a year and a day receive an entrance/charter fee waiver.

YoungYoung adults through the age of 30 receive an
entrance fee waiver and pay half international
dues when joining a LeoLion club.

INTERNATIONAL DUES

New Membership Dues Billing and Fees Effective July 1, 2024 - \$48.00 per year

Standard New Member Billing

Billing for a new member begins on the first of the month in which the member enters a club at the average rate of \$4.00 per month and billed through the end of that semi-annual period. Billing is issued semiannually thereafter.

New Family & New Student Member Billing

Billing for a new Family or Student member begins on the first of the month in which the member enters a club at the average rate of \$2 per month and is billed through the end of that semi-annual period. Billing is issued semi-annually thereafter.

Note: For full members, Multiple District dues of \$3.00 per year, and District S dues of \$7.50 per year are not prorated and are not included in the International dues per year. Total full year dues are \$58.50 **excluding** individual club dues and the \$35 entrance fee.

RULES OF THE BORROWING GAME

The game of borrowing club equipment is a longstanding tradition in Lions Clubs to encourage interclub visits and have a little fun. However, there are a few sometimes forgotten rules that go with this game.

The game begins when the meeting is called to order and ends when the meeting is officially adjourned.

Limit your taking to the gong, gavel, or Tail Twister's bank.

PLEASE NOTE: The club banner is off limits at ALL times. It is too valuable and too easily damaged.

Cabinet members and Lions who are a part of the evening's agenda are not allowed to partake in the "Borrowing" Game.

Special occasions such as Zone or Cabinet Advisory Meetings or any public meetings and social meetings are off limits, including Mid Winter and State Conventions. When item(s) are borrowed, the borrowing club must notify the visited club within 48 hours as to what item(s) were taken and when the borrowing club meets again so the visited club may retrieve the item(s) for a small donation to a Lion's charity.

Above all, act in good taste, have fun, and enjoy the merits of the "Borrowing Game".



MEETING COURTESY HINTS

- 1. All Lions clubs should provide flags, gong, gavel, and other paraphernalia as necessary. The Lion Tamer should have these items in their proper place prior to the beginning of the meeting.
- 2. The President should start the meeting on time and follow the procedures recommended by LCI to open the meeting and to maintain decorum during the meeting. Programs should be interesting, informative, and well attended.
- 3. If a District Cabinet Member is attending your meeting, your greeter should acknowledge their presence and properly introduce them to the members.
- 4. At the appropriate time, the President of the club should ask the visiting Cabinet Member to make a few remarks concerning Lionism.
- 5. If you invite the DG to a Club function, send an email stating the type of function, and explain the duties you would like the District Governor to perform, as well as the date, time, and meeting place. The CS/CT should be included in the invitation as well.
- 6. If the spouse or partner-in-service of the District Governor is invited, include the spouse or partner-inservice of the CS/CT in the invitation as well.
- 7. Please DO NOT engage a speaker or have a program on the date of the DG's official visitation.
- 8. If a VDG is visiting, it is advisable to check if they require the whole meeting or only a portion (in this case, other programming may be planned).
- Always acknowledge visiting Lions and guests. A visiting Lion can be overlooked and made to feel like an unwanted stranger at a Lions Club meeting. Non-Lion guests should also be introduced and made to feel welcome.

HOW TO OPEN A LIONS MEETING: THE 5 POINT OPENING

- 1. One Verse of America
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance
- 3. Invocation
- Lions' Toast with water or holding hands "Not above you, not beneath you, but with you!"
- 5. Thought for the Day

A complete 5 point opening is not required for every meeting - in some cases, an abridged 3-point opening (points 2, 4, and 5) may be more appropriate.

DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S VISITATION PROTOCOL

- The visit of the District Governor is one of the highlights of the Lions year. Certain rules of protocol apply for the official visit. The Governor maintains a very busy schedule during the year and courtesy would suggest that the Governor be contacted, in writing, suggesting a minimum of three (3) dates for the official visit.
- The Governor is the only speaker to be scheduled for the meeting. Do not expect the Governor to compete with another speaker or with long, drawn-out business or board meetings. Usually, rules are suspended and all reports are tabled until the next regular meeting. Have an agenda to work from and start the meeting on time. Make sure all of the details are done in advance, greeters to be present, bell and banner displayed, region or zone chairmen invited, meal planned and, if a gift is being presented, make sure it is available at the meeting.
- Notify the Governor, in writing, of all special club events and extend an invitation to attend. If the Governor is expected to be a participant in the event, provide

advance notification, in writing, as to the level of participation requested by the club.

- When the District Governor is recognized at any Lions meeting, club or district level, all Lions should rise and remain standing until the Governor signals them to be seated Not only is this proper protocol, it is recognition of the office.
- If a club wishes the Governor to induct new members during the course of an official visit, again notify of the induction in advance and provide a list of names of new members, and their sponsors. Make sure new member kits are ready for presentation.
- The Governor can be introduced by the club president or one of the cabinet officers present. This should be done with dignity and include information concerning the Governor's home club, business, offices held, Lionistic activities and family, if appropriate. Introduction of the Governor should be done only once
 when being presented to the assembly for remarks. The Governor sits to the immediate right of the podium with the President to the immediate left. It would be suggested that thirty (30) minutes be allowed for remarks by the Governor.

LCI OFFICIAL PROTOCOL

The following is the official protocol policy of The International Association of Lions Clubs. Only the principal speaker is required to acknowledge all dignitaries present. Lions should be recognized in the following order when present:

- 1. International president
- 2. Immediate past international president
- 3. International vice presidents according to rank
- 4. International directors (a)
- 5. Past international presidents (b)
- 6. Past international directors (c)
- 7. Chairmen, council of governors (a)
- 8. District governors

- 9. Association executive director.
- 10. Association secretary
- 11. Association treasurer
- 12. Past council chairmen (c)
- 13. Immediate past district governors (a)
- 14. Vice district governors
- 15. Past district governors (c)
- 16. Multiple district secretaries (volunteer) (a)
- 17. Multiple district treasurers (volunteer) (a)
- 18. District secretaries (a)
- 19. District treasurers (a)
- 20. Region chairmen (a)
- 21. Zone chairmen (a)
- 22. District chairmen 9a)
- 23. Club presidents (a)
- 24. Immediate past club presidents (a)
- 25. Club secretaries (a)
- 26. Club treasurers (a)
- 27. Past club presidents (c)
- 28. Multiple district secretaries (staff) (a)
- 29. Multiple district treasurers (staff) (a)

ORDER SPECIFICS

- a. When more than one is present, they shall be recognized according to the Roman alphabetic order of the first letter of their fully used family name. If the first letter is the same, go to the second letter, and so on. If the last names are identical, the same process should be followed with the first given name; if these are the same, then the middle name. In the unlikely event that the two names are identical, the one with the longest association membership shall be given precedence.
- b. When more than one is present, the one who served most recently is given precedence, and so on.
- c. When more than one is present, precedence should be the same as for past international presidents as stated in paragraph (b) above. In the event more than one past international director who served during the same

term is present, then the criteria specified in paragraph (a) should be used.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- When a Lion holds more than one title, that Lion should be recognized for the highest one. In areas that have positions in addition to those listed above, they should be recognized in accordance with local customs, provided that elective officers always have precedence over appointive ones.
- It is recommended that Melvin Jones Fellows be recognized as a group. In introducing speakers, their status as a Fellow should bementioned.
- Non-Lion dignitaries should be given precedence in accordance with local protocol and/or custom, keeping in mind that if the non-Lion is the principal speaker, that the dignitary should be seated directly to the right of the chairman.

HEAD TABLE SEATING ARRANGEMENTS

The presiding office or meeting chairman must always be seated at the most central seat at the table when there is no central podium, shown as seat number 1 in the following diagram (figure 1). The principal speaker would occupy seat number 2, then other Lion dignitaries in accordance with the general order of precedence. If possible, there should be the same number of seats to the right and left of the Chairman or presiding officer (who would normally be the Club President, District Governor, Council Chairman or International President.

When spouses are present, they should be seated to the member's left when on the left side of the table, on the member's right when on the right side of the table. Materials at the head table should include flags, sufficient lighting for podium if used, pitcher of water and glasses, scratch pads and pencils, gong and gavel, public address system (be sure to check to insure system is working prior to starting meeting), and place cards to eliminate doubt about seating arrangements.

MASTER OF CEREMONIES

At some events, the Master of ceremonies (emcee) will be someone other than the chairman or presiding officer. In such cases, the emcee should be seated in accordance with local customs or at one end of the head table. If, however, in the general order or precedence, the emcee dictates a specific seat (i.e. the person is a Past International President at a District function), then that should rule.

MULTI-HEAD TABLES

If there is more than one head table, the table at the highest level shall be considered the primary one. Care should be taken not to seat Lions of the same rank at different tables.

HEAD TABLE INTRODUCTIONS

Introduction of the head table should begin with the meeting chairman or presiding officer, then continue from the person with the lowest rank on the order of precedence to the person with the highest rank. When spouses are present at the head table, they should be introduced with the member (e.g., a Past International Director Joe Doe and his wife Jane).

NATIONAL ANTHEMS

When official representatives of the International Board of Directors (whether or not currently serving on the board) from another country are present at an event where national anthems are normally played, they should be extended the privilege of having their anthem played. The anthem of the host country is played last.

The flag of a visiting International President or Director should always be displayed - normally to the left of the United States Flag.

AUDIENCE ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Start furthest away from Lionism and build up (e.g. nonlions, local VIP's or dignitaries), Past District Governors who are not holding a cabinet position at the time, visiting Lion Presidents, President of your sponsoring Lions Club, District Chairpersons, Zone Chairman, Region Chairman, Vice District Governors. Start at the far end of the OTHER side of the table and work up to yourself. Introduce yourself now if you did not at the opening of the evening. Now, start at the far end of the FLAG side and work towards the Chair of Honor.






