

MLERF SIGNATURE PROJECTS ~ PENNIES FOR SIGHT, JOURNEY FOR SIGHT AND MEMORIAL or IN HONOR **CONTRIBUTIONS** ~ How does your Club motivate members to contribute to these important projects? ~ The **Pennies for Sight Program** was created as another vehicle for Lion's clubs to generate funds for MLERF, literally one penny at a time. Lions clubs distribute penny canisters containing the MLERF logo at local businesses or other venues. Program motto: "Your change changes people's lives". Any Lions club that donates \$100.00 receives a Banner Patch. Once a club has received the banner patch, in any year in which they make another \$100.00 donation, they receive a rocker patch for that year. We have new canisters and labels for old canisters. ~ The Journey to Sight Program began after the 1982 Lions Clubs International Convention. It was an idea created by Lions Clubs International designed to enable Lions Clubs and Districts to raise funds for sight related activities and increase Club and District visibility and reputation in their communities. Massachusetts Lions Eye Research Fund, Inc. adopted "Journey to Sight" shortly after the 1982 International Convention and later changed the name to Journey for Sight. The first Journey for Sight Weekend was held in May of 1983. The initial idea was for all Clubs to hold a Journey for Sight project on the same weekend of May each year. The purpose of this project was to generate additional funds for MLERF over and above a Lions Club's usual annual donation. Today, Journey For Sight projects occur all year long throughout the five Lions Districts (Y-A-N-K-S).

FEEDING HUNGRY NEIGHBORS



When Lions see their community members struggling, they feel compelled to make a real difference. In Lowville, N.Y., Lions volunteer at a food pantry that serves up to 300 families each month. In this

remote area, many people live below the poverty line. And many do not have transportation to the nearest grocery

store, 20 miles away. For these reasons, the town food pantry is a vital part of the community.

The lifeline of the pantry was a passenger van, which was breaking frequently, resulting in costly repairs. Lions need

it to travel back and forth to a food bank 90 minutes away, pick up donations, and make deliveries.

Just as the van broke down for the final time, Lions received a nearly US\$20,700 Matching grant from Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF). With the funds, Lions purchased a cargo van and trailer and now can continue being a dependable part of their community.

Locals are thankful the pantry received this gift. "They help me out a lot when I need it," said one pantry patron. With the larger cargo space, the pantry can now serve as many as 450 families each month.





Hunger...a Complicated Challenge

Despite global production sufficient to feed the entire population, chronic hunger remains a chronic problem. Political and economic instability, rising food and energy prices, and climate change all contribute to this sad truth: Hunger-related challenges are urgent – even in this part of the world.






Keep your eyes open for some training being offered on conducting virtual meetings and improving our marketing. The members of the leadership support group are eager to help.

LEHP COMMITTEE (Lions Eye Health Program)

January Newsletter

If you are visiting your eye doctor's office for routine eye care or for an urgent need, you may feel nervous about venturing out during the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). Rest assured that all medical professionals follow strict hygiene and disinfection guidelines.

New procedures for routine and urgent eye care during COVID-19

Limiting close physical contact is key to helping reduce the spread of the coronavirus. Symptoms such as fever, cough and shortness of breath can show up 2 to 14 days after a person is exposed. Although most eye care clinics are now scheduling in-person appointments, some may continue to offer "virtual" telemedicine visits over the phone or through video chat on a computer or smartphone.

For in-person appointments, staff will take several precautions to protect your health.

Expect changes to eye exams and procedures during the pandemic

- You should wear a mask to your appointment. If you do not have a mask, one may be provided for you. The clinic may ask you to wait outside, or in your car, instead of in the normal waiting room. This is to protect you, the other patients, and the office staff from possible virus exposure in crowded waiting areas. The clinic is likely restricting the number of people that enter. If you do not need someone to be there with you for the actual appointment, please do not bring anyone into the building with you.
- Your temperature may be checked on entry to the building.
- Your eye doctor may use a special plastic breath shield on the slit lamp machine they use to look into your eyes. They will also wear a mask, and may also wear gloves, goggles or a plastic shield over their eyes.
- Your doctor may ask you to wait to speak until after your eye exam is complete. Then they can talk with you and answer questions when they can be a safe distance from you.

You will be asked to follow certain precautions

- If you have a cough or a fever, or have been in close contact with someone who has these symptoms, you must call your doctor's office ahead of time and let them know. If your visit is not an emergency, you may need to stay home.
- If you arrive sick, your doctor may ask you to return home. If you have a problem that cannot wait to be seen, you will be asked to wait in a special room away from other patients. The clinic staff and your physician may wear additional protective equipment, such as gowns and gloves.
- If you need to cough or sneeze during your exam, move back from the slit lamp microscope machine. Bury your face in the crook of your arm or cover your face with a tissue. Wash your hands with soap and water right away.

Eye doctors are always available for eye emergencies

Call your eye doctor as soon as possible in the following situations:

- You have macular degeneration or diabetic retinopathy and get regular eye injections;
- You notice changes in your vision (like blurry, wavy or blank spots in your field of vision);
- You have an eye injury, even if it seems minor;
- You notice new floaters or flashes in your vision;
- You suddenly lose some vision;
- You have a red eye or eye pain, especially if associated with headache, nausea or vomiting.

How can the coronavirus affect your eyes?

The coronavirus can spread through the eyes, just as it does through the mouth or nose. When someone who has coronavirus coughs, sneezes, or talks, virus particles can spray from their mouth or nose onto your face. You are likely to breathe these tiny droplets in through your mouth or nose. But the droplets can also enter your body through your eyes. You can also become infected by touching your eyes after touching something that has the virus on it.

It might be possible for coronavirus to cause a pink eye infection (conjunctivitis), but this is rare. Keep in mind that whether pink eye is caused by a virus or bacteria, it can spread if someone touches that sticky or runny discharge from the eyes, or touches objects contaminated by the discharge. Wash and sanitize your hands frequently, and do not share towels, cups or utensils with others.

How to protect your eyes and health during COVID-19

Guarding your eyes — as well as your hands, nose, and mouth — can slow the spread of coronavirus. Here are some ways to you can keep your eyes safe and healthy during this coronavirus outbreak.

1. If you wear contact lenses, consider switching to glasses for a while.

There's no evidence that wearing contact lenses increases your risk of coronavirus infection. Consider wearing glasses more often, especially if you tend to touch your eyes a lot when your contacts are in. Substituting glasses for lenses can decrease irritation and force you to pause before touching your eye.

2. Wearing glasses may add a layer of protection.

Corrective lenses or sunglasses can shield your eyes from infected respiratory droplets. But keep in mind that they don't provide 100% security. The virus can still reach your eyes from the exposed sides, tops and bottoms of your glasses. If you're caring for a sick patient or potentially exposed person, safety goggles may offer a stronger defense.

3. Stock up on eye medicine prescriptions if you can.

Experts advise patients to stock up on critical medications, so that you'll have enough to get by if you are quarantined or if supplies become limited during an outbreak. But this may not be possible for everyone. If your insurance allows you to get more than 1 month of essential eye medicine, such as glaucoma drops, you should do so. Don't wait until the last minute to contact your pharmacy.

4. Avoid rubbing your eyes.

It can be hard to break this natural habit, but doing so will lower your risk of infection. If you feel an urge to itch or rub your eye or even to adjust your glasses, use a tissue instead of your fingers. Dry eyes can lead to more rubbing, so consider adding moisturizing drops to your eye routine. If you must touch your eyes for any reason — even to administer eye medicine — wash your hands first with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Then wash them again after touching your eyes.

5. Practice safe hygiene and social distancing.

Wash your hands a lot. Follow good contact lens hygiene. And avoid touching or rubbing your nose, mouth and eyes.

If you have any questions about your eyes or your vision, be sure to ask your Eye Doctor.

- The Lions Eye Health Program ~ (LEHP) is a community-based education program that allows Lions clubs, community organizations and individuals to promote healthy vision and raise awareness of the causes of preventable vision loss. The mission of the LEHP is to empower communities to save sight through early detection and timely treatment of diabetic eye disease, glaucoma and age related macular degeneration (AMD), and to encourage the appropriate treatment of low vision.
