How does your Club motivate members to contribute to these important projects?

~ The **Pennies for Sight Program** was created as another vehicle for Lions' clubs to generate funds for MLERF, literally one penny at a time. Lions clubs distribute penny canisters containing the MLERF logo at local businesses or other venues. Program motto: "Your change changes people's lives". Any Lions club that donates \$100.00 receives a Banner Patch. Once a club has received the banner patch, in any year in which they make another \$100.00 donation, they receive a rocker patch for that year. We have new canisters and labels for old canisters.

~ The **Journey to Sight Program** began after the 1982 Lions Clubs International Convention. It was an idea created by Lions Clubs International designed to enable Lions Clubs and Districts to raise funds for sight related activities and increase Club and District visibility and reputation in their communities. Massachusetts Lions Eye Research Fund, Inc. adopted "Journey to Sight" shortly after the 1982 International Convention and later changed the name to Journey for Sight. The first Journey for Sight Weekend was held in May of 1983. The initial idea was for all Clubs to hold a Journey for Sight project on the same weekend of May each year. The purpose of this project was to generate additional funds for MLERF over and above a Lions Club's usual annual donation. Today, Journey For Sight projects occur all year long throughout the five Lions Districts (Y-A-N-K-S).

All donations are tax deductible as MLERF is a 501 © 3 organization. A donation to honor our first responders would mean so much to our communities.



TALES OF THE CAMPAIGN TRAIL UPDATE February 2021

Have you received your vaccine yet? Neither have Karol and I but we remain eternally optimistic. On the call list at the local hospital, but no call yet. We all pray that the vaccines can let us return to Lions somewhat the way we used to be.

In the meantime, the campaign continues to be conducted from home! Zoom is the new buzz-word in Lions, as it is in our lives. Most clubs that are still meeting are meeting virtually, but probably with fewer meetings each month. We do continue To Serve our communities, albeit safely - and fully masked! As I read the various District newsletters, I am always amazed at the variety of new ways that Lions have found to continue serving.

Not to repeat myself, the big advantage in the Zoom world is that I can see more of you more often - even if it is in a 2 x 2 square on the computer screen, and on multiple pages. This month has been, and will continue to be the time of the virtual mid-winter conferences most weekends. And I get to not skip your district in favor of a second district as when we were all live together. I can go to Western Massachusetts and New Hampshire on the same day. The weekend before was a trip to the Cape. Then the weekend following the double date, I toured Northeast Massachusetts. The next couple of weekends are Greater Boston and western suburbs, followed by Central Massachusetts.

At MD 33S, visiting the Cape with Lion DG Sandy's clubs, we enjoyed lots of old friends, watched a shark attack Sandy, and were inspired by their LCI guest, Lion Dr. Jose Marrero, ID from Arecibo, PR, and his story of Lions serving in the aftermath of hurricanes. We also had the first report of MLERF of Lion Roland Grenier, PDG and president of MERLF, as he makes the rounds of the MD 33 mid-winters as well. As is often the case in this Super district, the donations that day totalled over \$62,000! Way to go Lions!

In MD 33Y, I shared a few moments with the Lions of western Massachusetts and their LCI guest, our current ID from Connecticut, Lion Mark Lyon and Lion Lyn. DG Lion Jack (complete with the Dr. Suess's striped hat), and CST Jim ran an orderly and fun event. It was great to see so much fun. And the reports were good - some clubs are at a standstill in meeting, but 100% of first half dues had been paid and 75% of the second half dues already received. There is clearly strength in MD 33Y despite COVID.

Then I scooted back to NH for the 61st MD 44 State Mid-Winter Conference and their LCI guest, Lion Justin Faber, ID, from the "Thumb" of Lower Michigan. Having been introduced with Lion Karol before we ran to Massachusetts, we returned in time for various reports for CC Lion Steve, as well as the words of Lion Justin as he discussed LCI events and plans, as well as the USA/Canada Forum on which planning committee he is the US LCI representative. The discussion of the NH charity foundation was enlightening.

Louis Braille




French inventor and teacher, Louis Braille, created this method in 1825. Braille was blind. While at school for the blind in Paris, he met Charles Barbier. Barbier had created a system for writing for the blind where sample messages coded in dots were imprinted on cardboard. In 1825, Braille started adapting this system to create the writing system we now know as Braille.

> The dots under Louis Braille's name above are actually from the alphabet called Braille. Braille is a method widely used to read and write by people who are visually impaired. Each letter of the alphabet is represented by a different set of dots.

ACT // BEGINNER

- Plant trees. Consult your local environment authorities to determine the type and number of trees needed, as well as the location for planting.
- Meet on a monthly basis and clean up a beach, community space, or roadside area as a club.
- Hold an environment themed photo contest at a local school. Reward the winner with a tree planted in their honor or another green form of recognition.
- Challenge all Lions in your club or district to add at least one green habit to their daily lives. Inspire others by sharing your actions on social media. Habits might include:
 - Using a reusable water bottle or coffee mug rather than disposable products.
 - Changing to energy-saving lightbulbs.
 - Setting a time limit for your shower to reduce water consumption.
- Develop a Green Living Tip Sheet and share it electronically with members of your community or network.
- Recognize a local organization or community leader for their efforts in environmental conservation.
- Calculate your carbon footprint with an online calculator. If your footprint is bigger than you would like, purchase carbon credits that are Gold Standard Certified and brainstorm ways you can lower your carbon input.
- Volunteer with your local park service to maintain trails. You will help more people access and enjoy nature!
- Commit to "Meatless Mondays", or not eating meat one day each week.
- Collect used cellphones and donate them to individuals in need.

ACT // INTERMEDIATE

- Lead an after school nature walk for young students. Encourage them to make observations and ask questions, then have them draw a picture of their experience afterwards.
- Host a community viewing of an environmental film or documentary.
- Save water by surveying your homes and community for leaks in sinks, communal spigots or water fountains. Contact relevant officials if repairs are needed.
- Work with city officials to paint "no dumping" signs near road drainage areas.
- Identify where to recycle toxic items and share/advertise its schedule of collection campaigns.
- Organize an environmental mural competition. Paint the winner's artwork in an appropriate area to beautify your community and promote environmental awareness.
- Implement a community recycling drive where people donate gently used items to charity organizations.
- Share a meal with students at your school. Afterwards, teach them how to sort their recyclables and trash.

ACT // ADVANCED

- Develop a demonstration garden or landscaping plot using native plant species to encourage restoration of the local natural habitat and water conservation.
- Sponsor a training program for small farmers on how to make and use organic fertilizers and pesticides.
- Produce a monthly nature program on the local public radio station. Feature environmental topics of local interest, interview environmental activists in your community and promote Lions environmental projects.
- Host a public debate on controversial environmental issues in your community. Share the results with government officials.
- Partner with a local carpenter (or use a DIY tutorial) to build a rain barrel. Then, hold a training with community members to promote using barrels for watering and irrigation.
- Organize an alternative transportation incentive program in your community to encourage walking, biking, public transportation and carpooling.
- Work with local schools to establish organic school gardens and a composting program to improve the quality of school meals and reduce waste.


