

Centennial Banner Program for 2016-17 District Governors

Lions Clubs International celebrates its 100th anniversary in 2017. There are many programs underway to generate excitement and participation by Lions around the world. Our 2016-17 International President Chancellor Bob Corlew would like each of his district governors to take part in the centennial celebration in a unique way by carrying a specially designed banner as they visit Lions throughout their year as district governor.

Each 2016-17 district governor attending the DGE seminar in Fukuoka, Japan will be given one banner with their registration materials, as well as 5 signature pens. All banners are identical in design. Each banner measures 3 ft. by 5 ft.

Throughout the year, as district governors' travel to visit Lions throughout their district, they will carry the banner with them and invite Lions to sign their signature on the banner. Both sides of the banner can be used for signatures. The goal is to provide all Lions within the district the opportunity to sign the banner.

District Governors are asked to bring the banners with them to the 2017 International Convention in Chicago. All district governors gathered in Chicago will march together in the international parade carrying their respective banners. In addition, district governors will carry the banners during a special ceremony at the first plenary session in Chicago.



"33 For 50"



Lions Club International Foundation is the humanitarian arm of Lions Clubs International and is often the first "boots on the ground" during disasters and emergencies around the world.

LCIF will turn 50 in 2018, and to celebrate this upcoming anniversary, the 5 District Governors of MD33 for 2016-17, will be celebrating LCIF's achievements by embarking on the first ever state-wide and multiple district-wide fundraiser encompassing all clubs in Massachusetts.

"33 For 50" is our Multiple District 33 celebrating 3 LCIF milestones:

- LCIF is turning 50
- LCI estimates that each Lion personally touches the lives of 50 people per year
- It was the discovery and invention of a 50 cent part that drastically mitigated the lives of
 premature infants who were going blind due to over oxygenation in incubators in the 1950's
 and 60's, it was after this revelation that LCIF was born. This effort began right here in
 Massachusetts

So, how do clubs participate?

We are asking every club to donate, in the form of NEW funds raised, the equivalent of 50 cents per member for each meeting in 2016-17, totaling 10 meetings in all.

For example, a club of 50 members, would find a way to raise \$25 per meeting, or, \$250 for the year for this campaign. Clubs can do this by initiating a separate raffle, 50/50 or having the tail twister come up with fun ways to raise the funds, so that each club can meet its goal.

Another option is to have one extra basket or one extra raffle at a pancake breakfast and raise the entire amount at one event. Based on the above example club, that would be \$250

Each club will account for these funds as LCIF funds, and the good news is that thanks to IPIP Joe Preston, these funds will count towards a Melvin Jones Fellowship.

For accounting purposes, the funds raised for "33 For 50" will be separately donated by each club at advisories or midwinter conferences as LCIF 33 For 50 donations.

If we achieve our goal, Massachusetts will be the first in the world to conduct such a fundraiser and we will donate over \$36,000!

Let's all put Massachusetts on the map by making this incredible effort a huge success...and let's have some fun while doing it!



Lions Club International Foundation

Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF) is the humanitarian arm of Lions Clubs International. LCIF will turn 50 in 2018. We are asking every club in Multiple District 33 Massachusetts to donate, in the form of new funds, the equivalent of 50 cents per member for each meeting in 2016-2017, totaling 10 meetings in all. For example, a club with 50 members will raise \$250. These funds will count towards a Melvin Jones Fellowship.

For accounting purposes, the funds raised for what we will call "33 for 50" will be separately donated by each club at cabinet advisory meetings or at the Mid-Winter Conference as LCIF for 50 donations.

In addition to this project, I, as your district chairman of LCIF, am also challenging the clubs of District 33-S to achieve the goal of 33 Melvin Jones Fellowships as a way of celebrating Lions Clubs International's 100th anniversary.

A THANK YOU FROM OPERATION SHOE BOX

This year we mailed out 62 boxes (down from 117 last year) to our service men and women. We also had the capabilities to share items with our two VA Hospitals in the area (Brockton and Providence), and we supplied the Homeless trailer at the VA in Providence with items also.

I have 15 extra boxes and several dog item boxes that will be delivered to "Cape Cod Cares 4 The Troops.com in Falmouth, Ma. This is an organization that mails out boxes on a continuous basis during the year and will mail out the dog items to the dogs and their handlers.

The committee received a request for a soldier who was in a tent with 20 other guys in Afghanistan. Since we had plenty of items we mailed 20 boxes to that soldier. I got word he emailed his Mom "Holy Boxes" and he passed them out to his fellow comrades.

PDG Roland and Lion Paula had purchased items and brought them to the Veterans Transition Home in New Bedford. They were very grateful for what we gave them last year and even more grateful this year.

In summary, I have received several Thank you cards and even one from a soldier who recently got out this year who received a box last year and still thanked us. We also received a US Flag that was flown during combat. As a thank you, the South Attleboro Village Lions were invited to meet some of the homeless to share a hot meal and pass out Christmas gifts.

The committee cannot thank everyone enough for your generous support whether you purchased, gave money or donated your time as they are all equally important.

Easton Lions Club Centennial Legacy Project

&

The Avery Lee Williams Family Farmhouse Renovation Challenge

Through the generosity of the Easton Lions Club in support of their Centennial Legacy Project, and of The Avery Lee Williams Family, Smith Farm at Borderland State Park is launching **the Easton Lions Club Centennial Legacy Project & The Avery Lee Williams Family Farmhouse Renovation Challenge** to help renovate the Asahel Smith Farmhouse. The Easton Lions Club and Mr. Williams have teamed up to match the funds we raise up to \$20,000—making a total of \$40,000 available for construction costs related to the physical structure of the farmhouse.

Matthew Cioffi, President of the Easton Lions, says of his desire to get involved with Smith Farm, "It was nearly 20 years ago when I first saw the Smith Farm homestead. My family and I had recently moved down from Vermont. On a brisk winter day, while skiing at Borderland, I saw this quaint old farmhouse far across the field for the first time. As I approached the farmhouse, I began to see its character. I wondered how old the farmhouse was and who once lived there and maintained the fields and fences years ago. At that time, I figured it would eventually fall and become another piece of history lost to time. Over the years, I've learned more about Smith Farm and its history. On my recent hikes through the trails I've been watching the progress on the farm restoration. It truly is a Zen-like island within Borderland, providing a respite for all who walk these grounds. I am very glad that the Easton Lions can be a part of the project during our 85th year serving Easton and the Centennial year of Lions International. I look forward to the day very soon when the house is restored for all to enjoy, inside and out."

Beyond the goal of raising \$40,000 in cash donations, Smith Farm will actively seek in-kind donations of supplies and materials to help us toward project completion. The Farmhouse Renovation Challenge will last until May 31, 2017 with the goal of raising \$40,000 and breaking ground in the Spring of 2017.

In addition to the support of the Easton Lions Club and Mr. Williams, Smith Farm has secured a significant partner in Clarke Construction for our renovation efforts. Clarke Construction (Trevor Clarke, President) will complete the physical structure and woodwork restoration of the Asahel Smith Farmhouse. Alongside contractor Ernie Smith, who approached Smith Farm through our veteran partnership with the American Legion Post 7 in Easton, MA, Clarke Construction will serve as our contractor on the Asahel Smith Farmhouse Renovation.

To make the Farmhouse Renovation Challenge a success, we will need the support of the Easton and area town communities, businesses, wellness groups, and citizens who have an interest in preserving history AND in providing a place of wellness for all to take advantage of. Certainly anyone who has had the fortune of spending time at Smith Farm knows the value of its serenity, location, and programs that will continue to run throughout the coming year.

One such developing partnership which will benefit from the Asahel Smith Farmhouse renovation is Smith Farm's partnership with the Center for Integrated Wellness (CIW), located at the VA Boston Healthcare System's Brockton Campus. Smith Farm will be providing space for the Center to offer their creative treatment options, such as art and music therapy, as well as to build a Veteran's Community Garden to help area veterans who are facing mental health challenges. Smith Farm will make our facility available to CIW as an alternative site for their existing programs—providing a serene and peaceful setting for Veterans who seek creative pathways to mental health and wellness.

Smith Farm's engagement with veterans was a driving force for Avery Lee Williams, "I have been aware of Smith Farm since I was a kid. In the late 1940s and early 1950s I was a regular at Borderland as a camper. We lugged our jungle hammocks and fishing gear to the dam area and spied on the Ames offspring as they rode around in a Ford jalopy. Since then I, as a poor example of Army veteran (I was a Company Cook), have developed a special feeling for those with PTSD. I am Past Commander of Post 7 American Legion in Easton and, as such, I've been witness to the toll PTSD takes on those who have served us."


