PCC Marcinkowski made a motion to approve the agenda with Committee Reports moved after Approval of Agenda, Budget & Financials added after Club Reports & Club volunteer Opportunities added under New Business. PDG Blattner seconded. Passed.

Committee Reports (3 minutes)

Audit – The audit will be done at the end of the fiscal year and reported at the first Cabinet meeting of the next year.

Elections – The elections will be held from 9 pm on Friday through 8:59 am Saturday. Check your email at 9 pm and vote!!! Let's shoot for 100% participation.

Sight Conservation – We are partnered with ACBVI and always on the lookout for opportunities to send people there for training. Joy'ell shared her story. She closed by saying the facility is "very impressive and helpful" for everyday living.

LCIF – There are 5 "fill the squares" going around during convention to be pulled on Saturday to name new or progressive Melvin jones honorees. PCC Marcinkowski shared a list of club and member balances with LCIF. Please consider naming someone soon for this honor and clear your balance. There is a District Club Grant you can get 15% as a grant for a service project if your club donates \$5000 in a year. After discussion that D49B has enough money on account to present a Melvin Jones, a motion was made to gift a Melvin Jones to the family of Nancy Graff by CC Webb. Seconded by PCC Rixie. Much discussion followed and a motion was made to postpone this vote to the first cabinet meeting of 23/24 by PDG Hall. Seconded by PCC Marcinkowski. Not Passed. Back to the original motion on the floor. Ms Graff's obituary is attached. Original motion Passed. PCC Marcinkowski will fill out the paperwork and work with PDG Lane and CC Webb to present to the family.

Lions Quest — In working "outside of the box" we are starting small and implementing the Quest Program with a couple of sports groups (k-12 age range). It will start with 2 Arctic Lions Hockey teams. PID Quinn will discuss at the Quest Luncheon. Lion MacGregor said Quest Canada was very active in the late '80s. Nothing is happening currently in the Yukon. PDG Gerein is sharing with the Canadian Clubs to rebuild and support Quest. Administrative support, training

Lions and community buy in is needed. Cost can be roughly \$149,000. QBear and child Find is a very important part of the program.

DG Johnson welcomed PID Lewis Quinn to the room and asked him for any comments. He was glad for the in person gathering and seems like we are all getting back to normal. MD49 has always thought outside of the box, so keep doing what you are doing! Great to see the sun shining here and loves our laid-back informal meeting style.

Constitution & By-Laws – No changes presented. However – PLEASE READ the current Constitution & By-Laws and Policy Manual. Recommends that the clubs review and update. Next year the district should set up a committee and working day to review and update our Constitution & By-Laws. Any changes would need to be submitted at the 2nd Cabinet Meeting to put forth for voting at the Convention next year.

**PID Lewis Quinn reminded us that there are dues increase at LCI and will be implemented over the next 5 years. Review it and make sure your club is ready for the increase. There are interesting changes being voted on at the LCI Convention in July. Download them and review them with your clubs.

**CC Webb asked all Lion present to work on implementing the long-range plan.

A motion was made to accept the 3rd Cabinet Meeting Minutes with one correction by PCC Marcinkowski. Offroad Lions received \$50,000 not \$20,000. VDG Marcinkowski seconded. Passed.

**The minutes were correct in what was reported; however, it is the 1st VDG that goes to Forum. * A recommendation was that we should send the 2nd VDG if we can send more than one as class sizes are small.

Club Reports (3 minutes)

Anderson/Clear – the club has some major financial issues to work on but has a few ideas to reinvigorate the club. More to come later.

Delta – Stuffed lots of easter eggs, 2 \$1000 scholarships to issue, Sponsored a new club. Working on mentoring them. Will do the Concession during the Delta Fair in July. In December held their Angle Tree project for roughly 30 kids. Shared one of the deliveries over the years doing this project. Made him feel "we are making a difference".

Choice – The incoming BOD is all new! Very exciting. A cancer-walk and BBQ is on the slate soon for the club. The club needs Club Officer Training.

Host - The club Assessment and Retreat was a success. They are working on a "Lions Carnival" June 3rd. 12-4 outside the Civic Hall at Pioneer Park. A motion was made to use \$1000 from Undesignated Line Item to support this by CC Juanita. Seconded by Lion Bellows. After discussion the motion passed. They are holding their Mother's Day Pancake Breakfast on Mother's Day.

Offroad – Working hard on the ORV Park. Look at their Facebook page for their upcoming rides and work parties.

Fox – Talking to community is working to get new members. Their Souper Sunday is turning into a great fundraiser for the club. The Easter Bake Sale has been very successful. They are extremely ready for the snow to be gone and get into the community gardens and park. A recent donation from Fort Know is fluff for the kid area and disc golf.

Healy Valley – Moving forward with a rec center. The Lions Carnival will be fun to participate in. Sponsored 14U Girls Hockey to Nationals in CA and took 3rd place. Being Post Covid they will have their Charter Night in May.

Interior Baseball – the baseball season is starting. Coaches are needed. 6 new members. 4 new officers on board. Starting the 4-wheeler raffle. Got to participate in stuffing easter eggs with Delta Lions. They have Cash Calendars for sale. November 2023 will be the 20th Anniversary – will have a membership dinner celebration.

North Pole – Small Core of members are doing the business and keeping the club going. Accomplishments this year are NP Championships, Fun Run, Inducted a new

member (huge shoutout to VDG Bobby for a wonderful induction ceremony). Projects coming up: Cruis'n w/Santa 5/20, Sleigh it to Cancer Run 6/10, LEOs Mental Health Walk/Run 5/13.

Whitehorse – doing ok. 551 Squadron rec'd certificate for 75 years of service. Sponsoring a group of kids to a Christian camp (pay for their food for a week and a BBQ). Looking for a large project to get behind. Bill and Angie are doing ok. Can't travel. Bill had a stroke 2 years ago and is recovering. Bill has skin cancer now. Keep them in our thoughts and prayers. Bill is always with us in spirit. ROAR Bill and thank you for over 65 years of service.

Fireweed – Covid kicked our butt – down to 5 members. This was a Lioness Club that became a Lions Club when LCI "changed the rules". Looking at 3 potential Male members! But are adamant they want workers bees not just names. During Covid they couldn't hold Bosses Bash (Christmas Party focus for multiple small business at one setting). That will be held this year.

- 2). Club Volunteer Opportunities Volunteers are needed for Senior Recommendation Day on May 11 with Friday night set up. The event is from 10-1


Saturday. They are 400 volunteers short. Please email PDG Lane or search for the event in Fairbanks to volunteer.


For the Good of the Order – One comment made that the district needs a sound system for meetings.

I am looking forward to spreading my wings at forum. If anyone has ideas for trainings pleas pop me a note, text or email.








NANCY GRAFF OBITUARY
