






































Parade of Nations

My First Experience with Type One Diabetes

My name is Lion Patty Byrne and I am the incoming Diabetes Chair for District 29-I. The first time I became aware of Type 1 Diabetes was in third grade as one of the characters' of my favorite book series, *The Babysitter's Club*, was diagnosed with the disease. It seemed horrible; getting daily shots, having to say no to treats due to high blood sugar, passing out, and even hospitalization. The character found success, but it was a hard battle. It certainly never occurred to me at eight years old that Diabetes would become a daily part of my reality.

After I outgrew those books, I rarely thought about Type One Diabetes. It wasn't important to my world. But six and half years ago, it suddenly became very important to my world when my eighteen-month-old daughter was diagnosed with Type One Diabetes. My family's life turned upside down as we suddenly found ourselves counting carbs, administering shots, and realizing that we could never stop thinking about it.

As your Diabetes Chair, I hope to bring three things to the table, personal experience as a mother of a child with Type One, practical ways that you can support those with Type One Diabetes, and Advocacy. Type One Diabetes is often misunderstood with misinformation guiding people's responses. If I can pass on information about what Type One Diabetes really is then the people who have it, including my daughter, have a better chance at getting the services they need to live the best lives possible.

It doesn't need to only be in fiction that Type One Diabetics win. I look forward to being your chair this year.
