Dr. Robert S. Littlefield from Oviedo, Florida, USA, was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of Lions Clubs International at the associations 97th International Convention held in Toronto, Canada, July 4 through 8, 2014. Following his term on the LCI Board, he was appointed to a three-year term (2016-2019) as a Trustee on the LCIF Board of Directors representing Constitutional Area I (largest constitutional area membership). He is Chairperson of the 2019 DGE School scheduled for Oak Brook, IL, and Milan, Italy.



Director Littlefield is Founding Director of the Nicholson School of Communication and Media at the University of Central Florida in Orlando.

A member of the Fargo (ND) Lions Club since 1984, and associate member of the Oviedo Winter Springs Lions Club (FL) since 2016, Littlefield has held many offices within the association, including district governor, LCIF district coordinator, GLT district coordinator, council chair, multiple district convention chair, multiple district public relations chair, and is a certified guiding Lion. He served as president of the North Dakota Past District Governors' Association and was inducted into the ND Lions Hall of Fame in 2017.

In recognition of his service to the association, he has received numerous awards, including the District Governor Excellence Award, nine Presidential Certificates of Appreciation, an International Leadership Award, the Senior Builder Key Award, and five International President's Medals. He is Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow and a Second Century Ambassador.

In addition to his Lions activities, Director Littlefield is active in numerous professional and community organizations, including the National Communication Association, the American Forensic Association, the National Speech and Debate Educators Association, and the Pi Kappa Delta National Forensic Honorary.

Director Littlefield and his wife, Lion Kathy, have two children and two grandchildren.



WEST VIRGINIA LIONS SIGHT CONSERVATION FOUNDATION providing sight, hearing and low vision services to all West Virginians

Helen Keller challenged International Convention delegates at Cedar Point, Ohio, in 1925 to become "Knights of the Blind" in the crusade against darkness.

The West Virginia Lions Sight Conservation Foundation was formed on June 6, 1959, by delegate vote at the Lions State Convention in Charleston, West Virginia. Founder Leonard Jarrett dedicated the Foundation's purpose to meeting the sight and hearing needs of state citizens who do not have access to such services due to economic or other barriers.

In 1961, WVLSCF established a partnership with West Virginia University to benefit the lives that both have committed to serving, efforts which continue half a century later.

While 20/20 signifies "perfect vision", the year 2020 changed our lives drastically. We were not able to celebrate a Lions' Day at the Eye Institute in Morgantown. With hope, we move forward to a new normal, and envision such an event in 2021.

The Foundation can only continue its service to our citizens in need through the support of generous individuals and faithful Lions Clubs in Multiple District 29. Without their dedication and that financial support, we could not sustain Leonard Jarrett's dream and vision.

The Leonard Jarrett award is given as the highest honor to a worthy person whose efforts exemplify utmost service toward the sight or hearing needs of others. MD-29 Clubs who contribute \$1,000 to the Foundation should choose an awardee whose community service meets that criteria.

Due to the continuing concerns about the corona virus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Although we are disappointed that we won't be able to host this event in person, we are excited about hosting our first virtual international convention that can safely connect Lions from around the world. We are still finalizing the details of your new convention experience, and will share those with you as soon as they are ready.

Here are some important details about the 2021 virtual convention we'd like to share with you:

- Everyone's invited Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.
- Registration fees The registration fee will be US\$50 until March 31, then US\$75 beginning April 1. The registration fee for Leos will be US\$30 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29. Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.
- Current registrants Lions who are currently registered for convention will receive an email soon with more information about their registration options.
- **Elections** Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.
- Convention updates Check our convention website LCICon for convention updates and details as they become available.

This global health pandemic has forced us all to make decisions and changes that place health and safety first. However, we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions, we continue to find new ways to stay connected, safely serve our communities and continue our global mission of service.

We appreciate your understanding during this challenging time for our organization and the world, and thank you for your incredible service as a Lion.
