WELCOME TO MARCH 2024! March will see the beginning of Day light saving time on March 10, St Patrick's day on March 17, First Day of Spring on March 19, Palm Sunday on March 24, and Easter on March 31.

By this time, the Club Presidents, Secretaries, and 1st Vice District Governor should have seen my emails concerning position training available through the Learn Portal. Please do not ignore the opportunity and benefits of completing the training available to you in the Learn Portal. It is part of your training package. Each module takes about 20 minutes. If you think you know everything about the duties of the club officers, you might be surprised. As I visit the Lions clubs in my district, one of the first questions I ask is, "do you have a copy of your Constitution and By Laws?" Most say "Yes." The second question is, "do you know where it is and have you read it?" Most answer in the negative. The bylaws of a Lions Club starting on page 17 describes the duties of the club officers. If you have not read the bylaws, you may be missing some of your duties. As I visit the clubs in the District, I have been giving each President a copy of the current Club Constitution and By Laws.

We have established a policy of presenting each new member a Welcome Certificate along with an Orientation Manual and a copy of the current Standard Club structure along with other information. This is a start of providing our new members with knowledge about being a Lion. As of this date, over 140 new members have received a welcome package. We have sent out 79 for 2023-2024 and the rest to new members in the previous year. Every new member having email access was emailed a copy of the Club Constitution and By Laws. This was also done for Presidents, Secretaries, and 1st Vice District Governors. If by chance you did not receive an email from me, please let me know. When we do an Induction Ceremony, Sponsors should be asked to "Be a sponsoring "Mentor" for their Lion, and arrange for orientation sessions for the new member.

The status of all Clubs in the District can be seen through the Club Health Assessment. For every club, there is a Report called "Club Achievements" that the Club Secretary can pull up. Go into my LCI, click on "My Lions Club" and scroll down to report. Click on reports, this will bring available reports. Scroll down to the last report called "Club Achievements." Click on "Club Achievement" and this will show the following: List of Club Officers, awards received by active members, club recognitions, recent servicing activities and donations made to LCI. Click on "View Print." Sometimes, it takes a little to bring up the information.

The best part of being a District Governor has been visiting each club in the district. In march, due to the loss of two Zone Chairpersons, I will put on my old Zone Chairperson hat and conduct Zone Advisory meetings for Zone 4 and Zone 9. In the month of February, I had a combined visit with Pikeside, Hedgesville, Martinsburg, and Inwood Bunker Hill Lions Clubs. I held a District Cabinet Meeting on the 10th and visit to Short Gap Lions Club on the 19th. As of this writing, a visit to the Shinnston Lions Club is scheduled for the 27th.

Today, February 21, I have the first blooming flowers outside of my home. It is a sure sign of Spring coming. However, winter is not over yet

NOTE: District Constitution and by-laws, Article 11 section 2, DISTRICT GOVERNORS ELECTION PROCEDURE. Any qualified member of a club in the district seeking the office of district governor shall file his/her intentions to run, in writing with Nominating Committee prior to the day of its report to the convention, and furnish evidence of his/her compliance with the qualification for said office set out in the International Constitution and By-Laws. The Nominating Committee shall place in nomination at the district convention the name(s) of all candidate(s) so qualified. If none are received and/or so qualified, then, but then only, nominations for the office may be made from the floor. A candidate shall be allowed one nominating speech of no more than five (5) minutes duration, and one seconding speech of no more than three (3) minutes duration.


Section 3, <u>FIRST AND SECOND VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR ELECTION PROCEDURE</u>. Any member of a club in the district seeking the office of first or second vice district governor shall file his/her intention to so run in writing with the Nominating Committee at least thirty (30) days prior to the election, and furnish evidence of his/her compliance with the qualifications for said office set out in the International Constitution and Bylaws. If none are so received and/or so qualified, then, but then only, nominations for the office may be made from the floor. Each candidate shall be allowed one nominating speech of no more than five (5) minutes duration and one seconding speech of no more than a duration of three (3) minutes.

Clarification Regarding "Discounted Member" Definition and Its Implication for District Elections By Steve Glass, PID 29-I

On November 18, 2023 Lions International Membership Development Division issued the following message to club officers across our Association: "As you may be aware, a vote of the delegates during the 2023 international convention resulted in a new "Discounted Member" category.

This category includes all members paying discounted dues, such as a discounted family member, Leo-Lion member, student member, or young adult member. Discounted members have all of the same rights as an active member paying full dues, but do not count towards their club's delegate entitlement for district, multiple district or international conventions.

In addition, during the October board meeting, a resolution was passed to update the interpretation of what constitutes "one year and one day." This constitutional interpretation adjustment now requires members to be full dues-paying members of a single club for a continuous period of one year and one day before they count towards their club's total delegate entitlement.

For members to count toward the delegate entitlement for conventions during the 2024 calendar year, convert discounted members to a full dues-paying membership by December 15, 2023."

What are the practical implications of this ruling you might ask? There are two important take aways:

First, if a club has 20 members on the first day of the month preceding the month in which the convention is held, and the club has six family members, the club only has one delegate vote. Why? If you subtract six discounted dues members from twenty, that leaves fourteen members so that gives the club only one delegate vote. Please note that current district governors and past district governors automatically can be delegates, if certified, and do not count toward their club's delegate entitlement.

In the example above, if the club had converted those same six family members to full dues-paying members by this past December 15^{th.,} the club would be entitled to two delegate votes.

Second, members must be full dues-paying members of a single club for at least one year and a day before they can count towards their club's delegate entitlement.

Club presidents and secretaries, as well as district cabinet secretary-treasurers, should familiarize themselves completely with these new changes before assigning and certifying delegates.
