


January 2016 Fun Dedication Service

Applications must be signed by your Club President, DG Andy Smith, and the 6C GLT Chair Cathy Pergola.. Cathy will then forward your application to LCI. The cost is \$125. This is not paid until you receive confirmation that you have been accepted from LCI. Log on to www.lionsclubs.org and type ELLI in the search box (magnifying glass) in upper right hand corner to obtain your application.

Keep up all the good work you all do for Lions and your communities, but we must step it up to remain the world's largest service organization. Go out and spread the word of Lions and sign up those you have asked or show interest. Keep up the service work in the 4 areas of service Lions President Dr. Yamada has asked us to do (Sight, Hunger, Youth, and Environment). I hope that you have had a wonderful Christmas season with your family and friends. This is such a mixed emotion season for people but the happy should be the dominant feeling. And thanks for all that you do all year to give others a positive boost. Speaking of service, we have served 166,824 people in 6C so far this year. That earns a huge "ROAR" of appreciation from your DG team. That means that each member of the district volunteered more than $15 - \frac{1}{2}$ hours and each member served 234- $\frac{1}{2}$ people. I don't know about those "half" people, but that could be rounded up. That is impressive. In the non-LIONS world, 20% of the people do 80% of the work but here in the world's largest volunteer service organization it is pretty much 1-to-1, and that is what makes LIONS so great.

Last July 1 the temperature in Denver was 86. Andy Smith was the new 6C District Governor. LIONS membership in 6C was 740. Today it is 711. Not pretty, but a long way from the end of the world. We are working on a couple new clubs and we are exploring some leadership innovations and some ways to change the "business as usual" mindset that pervades. Help us out, okay? Now, in the cold of winter, half-way through the Lions year, it is time to evaluate and plan for the next LIONS year

One of the things we need is a realistic analysis of club performance. Are you doing what you planned to do? Are you doing it efficiently and effectively? Are you happy doing it? Are you meeting the community needs? This is basic business analysis and is easily performed, especially in small clubs. To my thinking, the most important part of evaluation is looking into the mirror. That means the members have an opportunity to express their opinions about their club or organization. There is a lot to be said for that for if the members are not happy the club cannot be happy or healthy or helpful to the community. To that end, Lions Clubs International has a wonderful questionnaire entitled "How are your Ratings?" It is a simple questionnaire that members can fill out and club officers can evaluate using the "How are your Ratings" Administrator's Guide.

The second critical element is the Community Needs Assessment. This can also be located on the LCI website. This is a deceptively short questionnaire whose effectiveness is dependent upon being answered by the right people. For example, social needs being assessed by community activists and government people in the right field, such as vision screening needs for school children being determined by school nurses and educators; diabetes screening and health education needs being determined by county outreach nurse programs; or ALERT partnership potential being evaluated by emergency management leaders.

Each club needs to do a Club Quality Initiative (CEP) based upon these processes. It is fun, not work. It is team building and goal setting. It puts tools in your toolbox and helps keep you on track. It is also an opportunity for zone team building and district building as discussion branches out, especially at zone meetings. It gives officers more depth when they are looking at club and zone stats. And from my perspective, it will help me help you build membership in your club, a branch club or a LEO Club or another club. The bigger the team, the better the service.

So to everyone, Happy and safe and fun New Year. I will see you at zone meetings, club meetings, district meetings or on the street, BE WELL. And again, thanks for all you do.

Hello, Lions!

I'm writing this on Christmas Eve, 4 days before my wife Lion Susy and I leave for Senegal for another eyesight campaign. Three years ago, as President of my Club I received an email from a local woman who wanted to know about our used eyeglasses program. She and two of her coworkers at Swedish Hospital were planning a humanitarian mission to a small village in the eastern part of Senegal and wanted to come with medical equipment and supplies among other things. Over time, we became more and more interested in accompanying them, until we decided just last month that it would be a worthwhile venture to go ourselves.



Since 2013, we've talked several times with Lions in Dakar, Senegal, to tell them about this. One of them, Lion Edjene Akouete, has been very proactive. He's written us a letter that should help with Senegal customs, and he and the Zone Chair for the area will be meeting us in Dakar when we land. He's also arranged for an optometrist to accompany us and to help with making custom eyeglasses for those whose needs can't be met by the used eyeglasses that we will bring.

I'll tell you more about how it went after I return, but for now please wish us luck as we extend our motto, "we serve," to yet another part of the world.

KidSight Screening BIG NEWS!

At the end of November we reached a milestone for KidSight Colorado – we screened the 300,000th child in Colorado since the inception of our program! This huge accomplishment is only possible because of the efforts of Lions in Colorado. I am planning a celebration at each of the district conventions this year as well as the State Convention. **WELL DONE!**

We have done more screening in 6C than ever this fall. Screening is well underway for the 2015-2016 school year. 17,011 children have been screened in 6C and 2,268 children have been referred. That rate of referral is 13%. 30,517 children have been screened throughout the state and 3,769 children referred, a 12.3% rate of referral.

3rd place is from the Broomfield Club.


We are very excited about our 1st place poster and feel it has a good chance to win state.
