Carousel - Serve & Enjoy the FUN

The Thornton Carousel



Mid-May through Labor Day Weekend Fridays: 4 p.m.–7 p.m. & Saturdays 11a.m. – 7p.m.

Throughout the summer, the Thornton Lions Club is proud to work with The City of Thornton at Carpenter Park to provide family entertainment on the beautiful Thornton Carousel. But we need additional Lion volunteers to assist us.

WHY VOLUNTEER?

It's simple, and can be summed up in one word: fund raising. Well, that's two words, but you get the idea. The carousel provides more than just entertainment value. It also generates funds for all of the Lions Clubs whose members volunteer to work on it with us. Over the past three years that the Lions have operated the carousel the revenues raised for Lions have averaged approximately \$12 per Lion hour volunteered. These funds have allowed clubs to continually increase their outreach.

HOW ARE THE FUNDS RAISED?

Tickets to ride the carousel cost \$1.00 per person and are sold by the City at a nearby booth. A child under 1 year of age rides for free although a parent must accompany each such child and purchase a ticket. The Lions do not handle cash or make change. From each \$1.00 collected, the Thornton Lions Club receives \$.50. The City pays the club monthly. After each payment, hours worked for each club's members are totaled and that club receives a check from us for its proportionate share of the hours worked/proceeds received.

HOW DOES THE CAROUSEL WORK?

Operating the carousel is not difficult, but two Lions must be present for each shift worked, although they do not have to be from the same club. One member works the power lever and the other collects tickets and makes sure all riders are set to go. Members rotate these functions as they see fit. That's it!

WHEN DOES THE CAROUSEL OPERATE?

Although we prefer to schedule 4-hour shifts on the weekends, some Lions work shorter and some longer shifts. We're flexible and try to accommodate your schedule as well as that of the carousel.

WHAT DO WE NEED TO DO TO VOLUNTEER?

The first thing you need to do is let us know that you want to volunteer. Contact our club president, Cindy Marlow, at 303-912-1478 or send an email to her at cindy@redheadproperties.com. The City also requires a criminal background check and some limited training for volunteers before they are able to operate the carousel. These things are generally done in April, so time is running short if you want to sign up to be a volunteer. Ask Cindy for more information

A Different Kind of KidSight

Perceptual Carnival, March 25, 2016 Douglas County Parenting Coalition

300 parents and kids visited the Perceptual Carnival held on March 25, 2016 at the Philip S. Miller Library event space in Castle Rock. Over 100 kids were tested for a combination of vision, hearing, speech, and motor skills as well as for vision therapy and visual processing disorders. Diagnosticians donated thousands of dollars' worth of free diagnostic services—testing that would have cost parents a minimum of a few hundred dollars per child if done privately. In the case of the Lions Club's new high tech vision equipment, the testing was far more comprehensive than that done at the optical store or pediatrician's office. Most kids went home from the event with a clean bill of health, much to parents' delight, but the testing did catch a number of children with issues that will require treatment or follow up. By catching these kids early, the prognosis is greatly improved.

In addition to a health scorecard, kids left with an armful of prizes, popcorn, peanuts, and crackerjack, thanks to the Castle Rock Town Council Community Grant. By turning diagnostics into a carnival complete with prizes, we believe we attracted Spring Break visitors who might not otherwise have come just for a screening.

We received many good comments on this program and hope to make it an annual event.

Tickets given to children for completing a diagnostic test could be redeemed for stuffed animals and other traditional carnival prizes. Children got a ticket for each diagnostic they completed so everybody went home with an armful of toys. Thank you Castle Rock Town Council!








A Different Kind of KidSight cont.

Nancy, one of the vision therapists from Highline Vision, tests to see if eyes are working properly in tandem with each other and with the brain. A child can have 20/20 vision and still need therapy for eyes to work as they should. Sometimes misdiagnosed as ADHD, vision problems can keep kids from being able to concentrate in school because their eyes and brains are exhausted from having to overwork to compensate.





Lions Club member, Jack Beckfield, helped parents fill out the testing form. If a child's eyes were good, parents got that information immediately. If the computer caught anomalies, the scan will be reviewed by an expert and parents will receive a written report. The Lions also provided information on free eyeglasses for those folks who need a hand.
