


Fun Dedication Service

Has it really been a month already? I'm having a blast as your District Governor. I have hit the ground running for our district.

LCI has partnered with Anthem (the old Blue Cross Blue Shield). The program is called Anthem-Lions National Day of Service. Denver has an Anthem facility and LCI has chosen 6C along with other parts of the country to come up with service projects. Anthem will provide 50 or more of their employees to work with each selected Lions clubs in 6C. Broomfield, Golden and Denver 5 Points have submitted their projects. Keenan Plate said he has been contacted by Louisville, Lafayette, and Englewood Lions Clubs who are planning projects. Keenan is in charge of coordinating this from Chicago, IL. I was part of a conference call

Thursday, July 24 with Keenan and Lions from across the country. July 27 was the soft deadline, but LCI is accepting bids thru the end of August. Grants will be given out to help start the project going. The National Day of Service will be in October. I do not know the date. This is in line with my goal of doing service projects with non-Lions who are helping out. At this time, I do not know how many clubs will be selected, so get your bid in now!

1st Vice District Governor



As District Governor Andy Smith wrapped up our budget workshop and planning session on July 25, I sat back for a second with a sense of fulfillment and accomplishment and at the same time excitement and optimism. The District Governor has put together a Cracker Jack leadership team of cabinet and advisors. Certainly not all cut from the same mold, the team is experienced and outspoken and dynamic.

What did I learn this month? I learned that we have to grow. That has been a common theme in the entire North American region of Lions, so District 6C is not alone. District 6C lost four members since July 1. What I have learned though, more sig-

nificantly, is that when we say "Club", people hear "meetings". When we say "club" we <u>mean</u> "action and service" not "meeting". We have to learn a new way of asking. When we ask people to join Lions, we are really saying, "I could really use your help on this KidSight project or this playground project or this literacy program of this school supply program." Basically it says is do it your way. Find creative ways to enjoy the meetings you have and do your service projects. If half your club wants a breakfast meeting and half want a dinner meeting, create a branch club or a second club. It is not adversarial, it is flexibility. And both groups will likely grow as a result. If the morning club wants to work on community literacy and the evening group wants to work on diabetes and you all want to work on Kid-Sight, go for it. The only real limitation is your imagination. The needs of the community <u>AND</u> the needs of the members are equally important.
