


Fun Dedication Service

Summer is just about over and the kids are back in school. It's time to get in gear. Vacations are winding down.

By the time this article is printed in the newsletter, the 1st Cabinet Meeting will have taken place. I predict it will go well.

As of August 25, 6C is down -23 in membership. The state totals are -46. What are we going to do about this? Your DG and VDG's are working hard to do our part to reverse this. We have obtained approval from LCI to hold a combined Campus/Traditional work-

Hi Lions of District 6C. A huge Roar to all of you. In fact, let's stand up and stretch and do one more "Roar". Thank you so much for all that you continue to do. Thank you for the community and for making my job easier.

First I want to congratulate Immediate Past district Governor Carl Gentzel for leading the district to a Lions Pride Gold Paw Award. For those who don't remember what that is, it is for having positive growth that is higher than the previous 5-year average. It was a tough battle for IPDG Carl as our whole North American Lions growth pattern is a little anemic. But we shall prevail. Well done Carl.

I have a goal and you all can help me. Lions Clubs and the service we do are the best kept secret in the hemisphere. We do a lot. You do a lot. We spend a lot of money and we use a lot of blood, sweat, and tears. We do KidSight and we refer about 13 percent of those kiddos who we screen in 6C and almost 12 percent statewide. In many cases that referral SAVES THE VISION of those kids referred. Wow. I mean WOW. Saves the VISION of a five year-old. How does that feel? But nobody seems to know that LIONS do it. Sometimes Lions don't know that their brother and sister Lions do it.

We coordinate a whole lot of 9Health Fair events, especially in the metro Denver area. We act as site coordinators and screeners and cashiers and docents and any number of special activities for the Health Fair. And people don't realize that we do it and we have done it since "the git go". Lions have been involved so Health Fair Number 1. When the Bailey Lions Club recently fell on hard times and cancelled their charter, no one realized that the Health Fair cancelled right along with it, until it was too late. The community is without until be can reorganize.

We have a diabetes awareness program in 6C that is very aggressive and very productive, thanks to Lion Lisa Kelly and the Rocky Mountain Cyber lions Club that saves lives every time someone becomes aware of their risk and gets tested. Very few people remember that the Lions Clubs did the awareness program and showed the people where to go and what to do.

We do things for kids going back to school. For example, the 5 Points Lions club has a community appreciation day that just blows me away. Hundreds and hundreds of school kids receive a bundle of supplies that will help those kids with their basic needs for learning. And that club does it *year after year after year*. And they do it with hot dogs and ice cream and games. They have fun. Most folks don't remember Lions did it.

We talk a lot about membership, and that is important. We want more Gold Paw awards. The DG team and the Global membership team is working on that. We are building a five-year plan that can actually get us over twelve hundred members and keep them. But it takes all 721 Lions in the district to do it. How? I am glad you asked. First, practice your elevator speech. In 30 seconds tell someone what Lions does. Wear a Lions logo: lapel pin, earring, collector pin, decal on your car, neck tie. Whatever. When someone asks "What is that about?" you can tell them just a small part of the

story. You can ask them to a meeting or to a service project. It is all one step at a time, my Lion friends. Ask One! Keep One! Help One! Teach One! One step at a time. Thank you, again, thank you.

KidSight Screenings Exceed 43,000 for 2014 - 2015 Year

As you know, our KidSight program would not exist without the dedicated work of all of our Lions volunteers throughout the state. The number of children screened in Colorado increased by almost 15 percent this year thanks to your efforts. Because of the introduction of the new Plusoptix screener we were able to screen more accurately and identify even more types of vision problems. I want to express my sincerest THANKS to all who helped to make this program a tremendous success. With your help we will ensure that Colorado's young children are identified and treated for vision problems that can impede learning and prevent vision loss associated with amblyopia (lazy eye).

The Lions KidSight USA Committee has been busy. From developing suggested standards for screening and forming partnerships with outstanding manufacturers like Welch Allyn Spot and Plusoptix, to launching our website and Facebook page, a lot has happened in the past year. Here's an overview of what's new with Lions KidSight USA:

- Social Media The word is out. Our <u>Facebook page</u> is more popular than ever, with over 900 likes and nearly 1,600 impressions every week. - Fall Vision Screenings As summer winds down, it's time to reach out to school districts and

 equipment is clean and ready to go, all of your forms are updated with proper dates and that your
 supply is sufficient for the fall season.
- Special Thanks I want to extend a special thanks to the Lions of Oregon and Colorado. I had
 the opportunity to visit to the Oregon Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation, as well as the
 Colorado Lions KidSight Foundation in early June. Both programs are very active—last year
 Lions in Oregon screened 142,000 children, while Lions in Colorado screened 45,000—and I
 wanted to learn firsthand how they operate. While each program is unique in its approach, they
 are both doing wonderful work on behalf of Lions Clubs International and Lions KidSight USA.

We had Bonnie Barlow come to our club a few weeks ago. Bonnie has given voice to the Arts for the Visually impaired for more than twenty years. She has described movies, plays, rodeos, art exhibits and more. She currently writes audio description scripts for films such as "Homes" which came out in theatres in June.

Audio Description provides description to the visuals to the audience member who is visually impaired making the production/performance alive and on equal footing with their sighted peers. In a sound-proof booth, the describer describes on a microphone to the patron through ear phones the sets, costumes, colors, scenery, who is speaking, program notes and much more.

Our club was so impressed with Bonnie and audio description that we decided we would like to go out as a group and have a "Lions Night out at the theatre" and we would like to have you—all lions in the front range--Cyber and Littleton lions join us. In this way, you could choose to wear headsets and see how this amazing service provides opportunities and access to the visually impaired patron.
