### **Colorado Lions KidSight Program 6C**

I hope everyone had a very Happy New Year! So far I haven't broken any of my 2015 resolutions! Here is what is happening with KidSight in 6C.

**KidSight Screening** – Screening is well underway for the 2014-2015 school year. 17,807 children have been screened in 6C and 2,037 children have been referred. That rate of referral is 11.4%. 29,729 children have been screened throughout the state and 3,151 children referred, a 10.6% rate of referral.

The funds were donated to purchase new Plusoptix screeners in Durango and eastern Colorado.

**Report on Colorado Gives Day** - KidSight Colorado participated for the third time in Colorado Gives Day which was December 9, 2014. Our goal was \$6,500. We raised \$4,350. Thanks to all from district 6C who made donations to our program.


