Lions Club International Grant

I have written a grant to LCIF to fund new Plusoptix screeners. KidSight Colorado is requesting \$45,000 in funds to match funds we have received from grants and donations for new screeners. A decision is expected in April. When we receive the grant (it always pays off to be optimistic) we will purchase about 13 screeners for our program. A number of them will be located in 6C.

Plusoptix Screener Training and Certification

As we begin to replace our equipment with the new Plusoptix equipment I will be scheduling training throughout the district. Stay tuned for more information about locations for training as well as dates and times. My goal is to complete training by August 15 so that everyone will be trained prior to the start of the next school year. Plusoptix has developed a screener certification program. Everyone who completes the training and certification process will receive certification as a vision screener and will receive a Plusoptic certified screener pin!

KidSight Screening

38,331 screenings have been processed since July 1 with 4,479 children referred.

District 6C 23,790 children screened 3,128 referred.

We have lots of screening going on in 6C and need more volunteers! February 2015 Update:

The **Aurora Lions Club** has a new collection location for clubs to drop-off their used eyeglasses. Lion Michelle Ramsey at 26612 E. Calhoun Pl, Aurora 80016 will store your glasses and then get them to Golden for the ride to Sterling. Michelle's email ID is ramseymm@aol.com and her phone number is 325.340.2856. Please give her a call at least a day ahead of time to arrange a time for your visit.

Eyeglass Cases: Sterling doesn't need any more cases. If you have a contact that can use them, by all means give them what they need.

Sorting the Glasses You Collect: The only thing Sterling can use are non-broken glasses, non-prescription sunglasses and any broken frames that are gold or titanium. All the rest of what you collect can be tossed/recycled or donated to any group that can use them. Sorting out the trash means a lot less that needs to be shipped to Sterling.

Box's Versus Trash Bags: Large trash bags full of all that material that comes out of a collection box has a lot of weight and will have some damaged glasses just due to the multiple trips in and out of car trunks. Safeway will gladly let you have boxes and any liquor store usually has some they don't want. Plus boxes are so much easier to stack in a truck for the final trip to the CO Lions facility in Sterling.

A very big **Thank You** to all the clubs that collect glasses because every pair that gets reused makes a huge difference in someone's life.
