40,815 screenings have been processed since July 1 with 4,832 children referred. The rate of referral is 11.8%. My goal this year has been to screen 40,000 children and with all of your help we have done it! We still have more time to screen so keep up the great work!

#### YOUTH EXCHANGE NEWS

The 7<sup>th</sup> annual Colorado Lions Camp – International Week has accepted 28 international youth this summer. We are now rejecting any new applications. The youth need to obtain visas (where necessary) and purchase flight tickets before prices skyrocket for spring and summer. We need to identify and sign up host families now so we can designate an airport convenient to the host family and permit the youth to purchase their airplane tickets.

The target for placing youth with host families is April 30 and we still have 18 youth to place. Your help is needed. Placing 18 youth is an enormous task. Youth are from Japan, Italy, Mongolia, Finland, Turkey, Estonia, Hungary, Germany, Israel, Belgium, Spain, France and Netherlands. Youth from Austria, Brazil and Denmark have already been placed and are no longer available. Sorry.

We need host families for ONLY about 2 weeks, but in return you receive an experience of a lifetime. Please consider hosting this summer or find a friend in your community. About ¼ of our host families are not Lions. They have been recommended by Lions and Lions Clubs. Youth will arrive July 25 or 26 and return home August 16, 17 or 18. They will stay at the Colorado Lions Camp instead of with their host family August 9-15.

Contact any member of the Youth Exchange Team and they will match you with a youth and complete the paperwork. They will, also, answer any questions. Team Members are:


