

We are pleased to announce the appointment of Past International Director Douglas X. Alexander to the office of International First Vice President.



Thank you to our clubs and KidSight Colorado volunteers who have been busy with screening! 36,350 children have been screened and 3,583 children referred, a 9.8% rate of referral. Our district has screened 16,261 children and 1,865 children have been referred due to detection of a vision problem (11.5%).
