My fellow Colorado Lions, as we continue in the stay at home order, thank you for your service to your communities. I would like to ask if your club has members you are going to drop for nonpayment of dues. Have you contacted them to see if it was just a mistake? Or that they genuinely want to quit Lions. Please touch base with them before just dropping them. If you do not wish to contact them, I would be happy to give them a call on your behalf. I have seen too many Lions dropped from clubs over my years in Lions that by just giving them a call would have reminded them it was time to renew their membership. We need to do a better job with Retention. That is done by staying in contact with our members on a regular basis. You can have interesting service projects that meet the needs of our members and communities. If your projects do not interest your members, you will not have members to affect your communities in a positive way.

Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF) - Empowering Lions' to Serve!

STATUS of 6C GIVING to LCIF: In the first year of Campaign 100, the Lions of 6C Lions donated \$15,701.10, which equates to an average of \$25 per member.

Our giving in the first nine months of this second year of Campaign 100 totals \$13,247.10 which is approximately \$1,721 or 15% more than what we collected in the first nine months of the first year of the Campaign. These donations came from 13 of our 28 clubs or a participation rate of 46.5%.

Zone giving breaks down as follows:

Zone A = \$ 550.00 Zone B = \$ 1,254.55

Zone C = \$ 5,055.00 Zone D = \$ 6,387.55

There are three months left in this Lions year for you and your Club to make a difference. Your donation can be made by your club, your individual members, corporate sponsors, or from fundraising events through your Club, your Zone or your District.

Donating as little as \$8.33 per month (\$100 per year), can empower LCIF to provide the following:

- Fund 2 cataract surgeries.
- Provide immediate relief to 4 individuals in the wake of a natural disaster.
- Provide measles vaccinations to 100 children.
- Provide diabetes screening for 18 at-risk individuals.
- Help purchase equipment to diagnose and treat cancer for 8 children.
- Give access to food for 14 disabled, elderly, low-income or homeless adults.
- Provide 14 people with access to clean water.

STATUS OF HELPING! Your donations help our communities locally and globally. Together, our donations have helped LCIF respond to the requests for help from eleven different US club districts, each one has received \$10,000 Emergency Grants related to COVID-19! Thank you! ROAR!


