Along with the club members were LCIF Chair PDG Gwen "Cookie" Balk who made a presentation on LCIF, two members from the Cyber Lions (Myra Bradley, Leader Dog Chair and Henrietta Jones) visiting and me. My discussion again centered on the need to increase our membership and the marketing program that is under development I also, discussed the need for us to meet our goal in support of LCIF. 2nd Vice District Governor **Robert Storrs NAMI Champion** This Month: Is Your Club Ready for New Prospects?

Last month we spoke about the types of prospects that each club can see as opportunities to grow. This month let's look at how prepared we are to convert a prospect into a member. A prospect can come from any of the three groups we identified last month – Friends and Family, Community and Business Leaders, or Community Citizens.

Before a prospect even shows up at your meeting, you want to start the recruitment process. Do you have a nice brochure that you can hand out? Do you at least have Lions business cards that have your website and contact information for your membership chair? Is your web site focused on inviting new prospects into the club? It can be a first step in the sales process. Does it say Lions is fun and a great opportunity to serve the community? Do you have a Facebook page? Are you keeping it up-to-date with all your service projects and fun activities? Are you posting about the next meeting with contact information and guest speakers or projects you will be working on? Do you post this same information on other community Facebook pages?

When a prospect arrives at the meeting, who will meet them and show him around? The sponsor for sure, but another member of the club should be assigned to help. When introduced to an existing member what will the member say – "Welcome, thanks for coming" or will they say "Welcome, Lions is great. I am a member because ... ". Does each member have an elevator speech that they can use during the introduction?

Hopefully, the meeting a member will talk about all the service projects the club is involved in.

After the meeting, will the president and a few others take time to talk to the prospect? Get to know them. Ask them about their family and interests. See if they would be interested in working on one of your upcoming projects. Prospects don't join to attend meetings; they join to serve and fellowship. Do you have material that the prospect can take home? There are plenty of materials from Lions Clubs International that you can use or if you have a stock of old Lions magazines, they are great.

After the meeting, who calls the prospect and when? The sponsor yes but someone else should also be assigned to do this follow up also?

KidSight in the Time of Coronavirus

KidSight Colorado has established guidelines for vision screening which are directed towards protecting the health and safety of the children we screen as well as that of the Lions performing the screening. Any volunteer who does not wish to conduct screenings during this coronavirus pandemic is not obligated to conduct any screenings as we care about the well being of our volunteers. KidSight volunteers can choose to resume screening with new safety procedures which have been developed. "At risk" Lions may want to consider not participating in the on site screening but are encouraged to participate in the KidSight program by scheduling screenings by telephone or participating in other at home activities.

KidSight Colorado will follow all National, State and Local guidelines on social distancing and the use of personal protective equipment (PPE). All KidSight Colorado volunteers must wear masks as required under



volunteers must wear masks as required under Colorado guidelines. KidSight Colorado will provide reusable Face Shields which should be worn by all volunteers operating the Plusoptix equipment (please contact me to have them sent to you). Face Shields should be sanitized with a Lysol (or other similar brand wipe) after each use. Face Shields provide an extra measure of safety for volunteers and an extra level of comfort for vision screening sites.

If your club works with a school district or Head Start screening under the Colorado state mandate or Head Start guidelines please contact the school district or Head Start to determine if schools will be held in person and whether the district wants to schedule screening. Most districts schedule vision screenings in the fall so they may already have screening dates in place. Head Start is required to conduct vision screenings within 45 days of the start of the school year. If a district wants to schedule screenings and your club does not feel comfortable conducting screenings, please contact me and I can arrange for the screening to be completed.

Daycares and early childhood education sites are usually more flexible regarding screening dates. You can certainly contact all previous screening sites and suggest an appropriate date when you plan to conduct screenings. I have spoken to several clubs who plan to do this kind of screening beginning in January 2021 or later. I recommend contacting sites you have previously visited so that you can let them know about the delay or you can schedule this fall for a future time period.

Hello everyone,

I hope you all had a great and safe holiday weekend and today you are staying dry and warm during this random cold front after the beautiful weather we've been having! I wouldn't expect anything less from Colorado.

As you all know, during the stay at home orders, we were so grateful we had a community that banded together to support IHDI and our dogs in training by fostering all 22 dogs for the 6 weeks of quarantine. We learned so much during this pilot program and have taken all feedback on how to improve even further and here we are... I would like to introduce you to IHDI's Inaugural Weekend Foster Program!

I have attached a foster position description with a concise outline of what qualifications, responsibilities, and time commitment we are looking for in a foster family. To start this process, please go to our website: https://www.hearingdog.org/how-to-help/ foster.html where you will find the overview of the program along with the requirements and process to foster, FAQs, and the application to fill out. The process will go: after I receive their application, I will schedule an interview with the primary foster (via Zoom or phone call for now), then will follow up with a home visit in which we will be meeting all family members and pets in the home, required by PACFA. After an approved home visit, we will complete a background check, which will be paid for by the foster family. Once all those items are completed and approved, the foster can sign up for our orientation class which will include the basics of the service dog industry, the Deaf community, along with all things IHDI like how to sign into the foster portal and log reports, as well as learning about the hearing dogs that will be in their care. After completion of this class, we will be having a hands on class on how to loose-leash walk, what behaviors to look for, what commands each dog will eventually know at the end of their training and overall how to effectively communicate and teach a dog new commands. With all of this training, there will be accompanying manuals and additional resources to help the fosters really understand our program and what an impact they are truly having on our dogs in training. Overall, we want to ensure that our dogs are in good hands and their training will be maintained over the weekend or over a more extended stay for more advanced fosters. We will be following up with each foster continually, having them fill out reports each week, and staying on top of communication and ongoing training for both the foster and our dogs.

By this extremely thorough and in depth vetting process, our goal is to find fosters that truly support IHDI's mission and our purpose of providing a top-notch, fully-trained service dog to a person with hearing loss. The success of this program would be an all around win-win situation for all of IHDI, most importantly the dogs we train and the clients we serve for priceless in-home experience.

Please forward this information on if you feel like you have a good family or friend in mind that would want to take this journey and commitment with IHDI and our wonderful dogs in training. Also feel free to forward me any of your contacts that you think would be interested in this opportunity and I would be more than happy to reach out personally to answer any additional questions you or they may have! Finally if you have any connections with organizations like churches, corporations, clubs, homeschool groups, etc. please let me know and I will reach out to them and see if they would be interested in being a part of our new program!

I look forward to getting in touch with your contacts and my hope is that we will have a wait list of foster parents for our wonderful hearing dog candidates! Let me know if you have any questions!


If you think this could be a good idea, please reach out to the club members and ask them to save their Lions magazine and bring them to a meeting.
