

[Shooting For The Stars With Lions.](#) District 6C has left the launch pad in spite of the obstacles that existed. We have entered the area of maximum stress and all systems are GO. Our District goals remain the same, an increase in membership and an increase in donations to LCIF. The Club Health Assessment for our District, considering all the limitations and obstacles is good.

I am glad to report that our goals were reviewed to determine where if any place they required tweaking or changed due to our limited ability to travel within our communities. Although no changes were recommended, it was decided that we would increase our communications to each other to ensure that all are well. It was also decided that we would ensure that members would get the training required to accomplish their jobs in spite of the travel and occupancy rules of the locality they live in via ZOOM. Many of our members are finding ways to provide service to our communities, assisting food banks, blood drives, donations, and virus testing

We have 28 clubs, all participating and performing to the best of their capabilities to serve physically, financially, or in other ways safely. A Loud ROAR for PDG Gwen Balk (LCIF Coordinator)(Centennial Airport Lions), who has made over 1,000 virus masks for essential workers, the homeless and friends and raised \$1,200 since March 202 and donated all of the proceeds to LCIF. Recently, she has also started making Lions masks for club members and other interested Lions.

I would like to remind all clubs that there are funds in the budget to assist in the payment of dues if needed. A reminder to all clubs that we have Lion Ann Marie Morgan as District Administrator (Nederland Lions) who will gladly assist you in reporting in MyLCI and club officers.

For those of us anxiously awaiting news of the 2021 Lions Clubs International Convention, it will be all virtual due to continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. More information will be forthcoming on how to register.

Our District 6C convention will be held on April 10, 2021. Our Committee Chair Lion Janice Davis will provide additional information in the near future. I strongly recommend that each club ensure that they take appropriate action to elect their club officers as early as possible for the 2021-2022 year. Encouragement of new members to get involved is highly recommended.

I am also happy to announce that 72 members received Charter Monarch and Monarch Chevron Awards recognition from LCI. The awards were sent to each club to be presented at an appropriate time. Our schools are about to reopen and we may have an opportunity to have a speech contest. More information is forthcoming.

This Month: **A Challenge**

I have participated in four weekly Zoom sessions with LCI leaders of the NAMI campaign. Their message was clear--we do a pretty good job of recruiting members, but we have to do a much better job of retaining our existing members. How's your club doing?

Keeping in contact with all Lions who are not attending meetings is step one. A simple postcard saying "you are missed" can go a long way. If they continue to miss meetings, follow up with a phone call. When a member requests to be dropped or is not paying dues, call to find out why they have lost interest in Lions and see if the club can do anything to keep their membership. Listening to your members is critical to retention. Keep records of why members lose interest and incorporate changes into your programs. Do you have a club Scorecard that tracks your goals? If so, ensure retention is high on it.

Another growth opportunity we are not taking enough advantage of is clubs chartering new clubs. Our efforts to charter a district motorcycle club may be an example that individual clubs can use to establish new clubs. Have you thought about sponsoring a special interest club? How about a club for runners or bicyclists of some other activity that attracts groups of people that might be interested in Lions? Special interest clubs may be easier to start as they provide a focus for prospects. I encourage each club in the district to really consider taking on this opportunity. If you do so, you will have lots of support from me, the district, and from LCI NAMI. Give me a call and let's discuss.

Retention Efforts: Calling Tree to keep in touch with members. One Member has resigned effective 2/1/2021 – Attempts to retain that member have failed.

Meetings are both live and virtual:

12/3/2020: 12 attending – Reported that Centennial Airport donated \$1,300 to the Club to put to their best use. Identified Aero Angel, Canine Companions, Lions Camp, International Hearing Dogs, Kidsight and LCIF to receive donations totaling \$9,000. Several members reported personal donations of money and items to a number of different organizations. Discussed fundraising and service ideas, how we might use our community grant funds as well as future meeting speakers. LP Mark advised that he is making desks for needy families so that children who must learn from home will have a place to study (the "Desks for Kids" Project).

12/17/2020: 7 attending – Business meeting. Celebrated over our successful ringing the bells for the Salvation Army.

1/6/2021: 11 attending - LS Gwen advised that the Dues Statements were sent out and that she has been making nearly 1,000 mask for essential workers, the homeless, friends and other Lions since the pandemic began. She gives them away but if people insist on paying something, she asks them to donate to LCIF. She advised that she has raised over \$1200 since March 2020. Most recently, she made Lions logo masks for club members and other interested Lions. Our newest member, Lion Vicky volunteered to work on setting up a website for the Club. Will continue to keep in touch with members though our calling tree and by sending cards on birthdays or for significant anniversaries.

1/21/2021: 13 attending – Kendra from International Hearing Dogs was our speaker for the day and she brought along Umber. The rest of the meeting was dedicated to general club business. Talking about Golf Tournament scheduled for 8/30/2021; and the Friday Food Booth. LS Gwen advised that since Thanksgiving, she has given away 50 masks and received \$450 in donations for LCIF from several individuals both Lions and non-Lions. PDG Roy instantly, raised \$111 from members for a donation for the dogs needs.

Service Projects:

12/3/20 – Present date	3 desks for Desks for Kids project completed by LP Mark. Making more.
12/18/2020	Rang the Bell for the Salvation Army at the King Soopers at Holly & Orchard from 10 am. To 7:30 pm. 9 Lions Volunteers served for a total of 24 hours. The Lions wore their Lions Vests and Lions Masks throughout the day. Raised \$1,129.01 in Donations for the Salvation Army.
12/21/2020	Distributed 380 masks and 500 sanitized hard glass cases to the homeless at the Denver Rescue Mission.
12/28/2020 through 1/17/2021	Collected several bags and boxes of used eyeglasses and glass cases through Lions Gary, Bob, Mark, Mark and Gwen. We are currently sorting, counting, and cleaning. Estimate about 500 glasses and 350 cases.
1/12-1/3/21	LS Gwen provided 6 hours of transportation shuttling 2 Seniors to 5 different doctors appointments.

Service Opportunities

An awesome volunteer service opportunity is available to help adults in our communities! I have been in this program, provided by the Douglas County Libraries (DCL), for about 6 months, and I enjoy it very much!!

Note: This program is **not limited to residents of Douglas County**. The program coordinator, Tiffany Curtin (tcurtin@dclibraries.org) is very flexible with engaging volunteers, wherever we live.

The Adult Literacy Program with DCL serves adult learners preparing for their High School Equivalency Exams, and Adult English Language Learners. DCL pairs learners with volunteers from our community who are passionate about learning, teaching, and developing genuine connections. The program is learner centered: volunteer tutors work with the student to help the student develop and reach their learning goals as appropriate to the individual learner. The learning partners meet for a minimum of one hour per week for at least six months. Many develop lifelong connections. DCL provides materials and training.

Tutoring can be done virtually (via Zoom, etc.) or in-library (when Covid restrictions allow). There is a real need for volunteers. For example, my student was on a waitlist for several years. My student is improving her English skills, and I've enjoyed learning about her native country. I have also gained an appreciation for how difficult it is to learn English as an adult. International Convention



Lions Clubs International

Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Although we are disappointed that we won't be able to host this event in person, we are excited about hosting our first virtual international convention that can safely connect Lions from around the world. We are still finalizing the details of your new convention experience, and will share those with you as soon as they are ready.

Here are some important details about the 2021 virtual convention we'd like to share with you:

- **Everyone's invited** – Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.
- **Registration fees** – The registration fee will be US\$50 until March 31, then US\$75 beginning April 1. The registration fee for Leos will be US\$30 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29. Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.
- **Current registrants** – Lions who are currently registered for convention will receive an email soon with more information about their registration options.

This global health pandemic has forced us all to make decisions and changes that place health and safety first. However, we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions, we continue to find new ways to stay connected, safely serve our communities and continue our global mission of service.

We appreciate your understanding during this challenging time for our organization and the world, and thank you for your incredible service as a Lion.

TIME LIMITATIONS:

Contestant's speech should last no less than five (5) minutes and no longer than seven (7) minutes.

DISQUALIFICATIONS:

Failure to comply with the General Instructions are grounds for disqualification, as well as the following:

- Use or display of props
- Uniforms or any other form of identification, including Lions emblems, to obtain an unfair advantage;
- Inclusion of partisan politics or sectarian religion in the speech;
- Publication of the speech in local media, etc., prior to the contest;
- Same speech is NOT used throughout the competitions.

Judging:

At every level, 3 judges will use the following standard with the "weighting" of each indicated in parentheses:

The Text Alone (Thought Content)

- A. Originality (5)
- B. Quality of Material (5)
- C. Did speech adhere to subject / topic (10)

Delivery Alone

- A. Emphasis, voice control (5)
- B. Enunciation, pronunciation (5)
- C. Sincerity, enthusiasm, poise (5)

Effectiveness of the effort as a whole

- A. Was the speech a well rounded, cohesive effort? (5)
- B. Did it have logic and organization? (5)
- C. Did it have emotional impact? (5)

Judges total score could add up to 50, maximum

6C LCIF Chair Report January 23, 2021

To District Governor Stokes Anderson and Cabinet:

STATUS of 6C GIVING to LCIF: Since the beginning of Campaign 100 starting with the lookback year beginning 7/1/2017, the Lions of 6C have given a total **\$61,020** to LCIF or basically an average of **\$108** per Lion in our district.

Year 1 or 7/1/17 – 6/30/18 = \$16,368.52 (\$29/Lion)

Year 2 or 7/1/18 – 6/30/19 = \$15,701.10 (\$27/Lion)

Year 3 or 7/1/19 – 6/30/20 = 18,764.12 (\$33/Lion)

Year 4 or 7/1/20 – 6/30/21 = \$10,186.50 (\$18/Lion so far) (through 1/17/2021 only)

I am so very proud of all the 6C Lions who have made this possible - - we still have nearly 6 months left in this Lions year! Thank you all so very much!

Zone Giving as a percent of \$61,020 for the period from 7/1/17 to 1/17/2021 is as follows:

Zone A = 8%

Zone B = 7%

Zone C = 37%

Zone D = 47%

Other Donations = 1% (includes District & cancelled Club donations in the timeframe)

Club Participation is high at 78.6% which means 22 of our 28 clubs have made donations so far this year. Let's see if we can reach 100% participation. **THANK YOU! ROAR!**

STATUS OF HELPING! Your donations help our communities locally and globally. Together, our donations have helped LCIF respond to the requests for help from eleven different US club districts, each one has received \$10,000 Emergency Grants related to COVID-19! **Thank you! ROAR!**

Many of you may know that I have been making masks during to the Pandemic to give to essential workers, to the homeless, friends and other Lions....nearly 1,000 masks so far. Although I do not sell the masks, if people offer to pay, I suggest that they send a donation to LCIF instead. Since Thanksgiving, I have given away 50 masks and LCIF has received \$450.

Do you know what LCIF can do with \$450? Well.....

LCIF can fund 9 cataract surgeries; or

LCIF can provide immediate relief to 18 individuals in the wake of a natural disaster; or

LCIF can provide measles vaccinations to 445 children; or

LCIF can provide diabetes screening for 82 at-risk individuals; or

LCIF can help purchase equipment to diagnose and treat cancer for 36 children; or

LCIF can give access to food for 63 disabled, elderly, low-income or homeless adults; or.

LCIF can provide 63 people with access to clean water.

Status of District /Community Grants (DCG) Funds: District 6C has a total of \$5,432.78 in DCG Funds waiting for us to request a grant. Funds will rollover from year to year so that we can save for a bigger project; however, we must request them before they expire. Here is a list of the 6C available DCG funds:

Year 1 Funds =	\$1,350.45	Expire 2034
Year 2 Funds =	\$2,355.17	Expire 2035
Year 3 Funds =	\$1,355.17	Expire 2036




