"Leadership, Experience, Opportunity." That is what Leo stands for. Leos are between the as of 12-18 for the Alpha Leos and 18-30 for the Omega Leos. I want to concentrate on the Alpha Leos. The manual will do a better job explaining the program: (leo65_handbook) – just type this in the search on lionsclubs.org).

TYPES OF LEO CLUBSther community-based or school-affiliated, Leo clubs provide members with the camaraderie and growth that comes from participation in community service projects, social functions, and leadership development activities.

Community-based Leo clubs offer membership to any eligible young person within the local area of the Lions club. These clubs meet at a suitable location in the community and a member of the sponsoring Lions club serves as the Leo club advisor.

School-affiliated Leo clubs draw on members from one school. These clubs often require the appointment of a faculty-advisor - usually a teacher, counselor, or school administrator to act as a liaison between the school and the Leo club and also to assist the Leo club advisor, who is a Lion. The school must agree to fulfill Leo Club Program responsibilities and the Leo club must agree to follow the policies, insurance requirements, and regulations of the school. The Leo club is subject to the same rules established by the school authorities for all student organizations and extracurricular activities. Before the Leo club is organized, the Lions club and school should agree on procedures for organizing club activities on and off school property which adhere to school policies and Lions Clubs International board policy.

Alpha Leo clubs are designed for youth between 12 and 18 years of age. This track focuses on the individual and social development of teens and preteens.

I am looking to find a Leo Chair for my cabinet next year if anyone is interested. Please contact me about this vital opportunity to develop young leaders.



New Website Option

New Lions Website Option - Google Sites

hn Spice, MD-6 Information Technology Officer, has identified a new approach for Lions Club's websites.

The e-Clubhouse and e-District approaches have been the recommended approach by Lions Clubs International for some time, but many have come to realize it has many restrictions and is not easily customized to meet a club's needs. Google Sites is a new approach that overcomes these limitations but **requires no programming and is FREE**.

Below are a couple examples of websites.

In many school systems, Google Sites is used to teach kids in school how to develop personal websites within the school system. If kids can do it, then maybe Lions can too.

You can read John's Lions Website Development Guidelines here. (You may need to "allow" the download).

I, Bob Storrs, used Google Sites to develop the website for the new Mile High Motorcycle Lions Club. Take a look at it. Several of the pages are Word documents that can be changed on your computer and then uploaded - Our Club and Calendar; others can be changed directly on the page.

The site also includes a Doodly video. If any club would like a similar video, let me know and I would be happy to develop for you.

One of the great features of Google Sites is that it automatically adjusts to the device being used to view it – PC, tablet, or smart phone. Look at one of the sites above on your phone to see how it works.

International Hearing Dog Report (IHDI) 4/28/21 PCC Andy Smith/IHDI State Chair

Hello Lions! International Hearing Dogs is doing well. Both the handler and the dog training are newly designed and adhere to ADI standards. The first graduation will be the first class for ADI Review towards IHDI's ADI certification process.

The training and graduation, provides many "Firsts" for IHDI.

- First time IHDI has implemented their practice of handlers coming to us
- First time handlers will have completed Pre-Match Training
- ♦ First time handler/dog teams will spend 10 days in training together
- ♦ First time handler/dog teams will be required to pass a Public Access Test
- ♦ First time handler/dog teams will be required to pass a Sound Alert Test
- First Time IHDI will have a Passing of the Leash and Graduation Ceremony

Their 2nd On-site Training and Graduation will be late August/early September. Four dog/handler teams may be in that class.

The Volunteer Foster Project is starting to take off. IHDI has two dogs in full-time Foster care 24/7. Rather than just on the weekends the dogs come to IHDI Monday through Friday so trainers can work with them. The dogs go home to fosters each afternoon/evening and also spend the weekends with their Fosters.

New adaptive technology is being used with IHDI clients to better serve them.

A new trainer had been hired to replace Karrisa. her name is Taylor Smith. She comes from Service Dogs Inc outside of Austin TX. She brings over 9 years of dog training experience with her. She is deaf and has trained a hearing dog for herself. She is also fluent in American Sign Language.

Staff Morale is high, and the staff is operating as a productive and effective team.

Thanks for all who are following Jaggers Journey. So far, the campaign has raised over \$10,000. The goal is \$20,000 with 8 more weeks to go. 

April 10, 2021



To District Governor Stokes Anderson and Cabinet:

your opportunity to HELP LCIF: Today, you can help District 6C first by social distancing and wearing your masks.....especially, the Lions logo mask you were provided at this 6C District Convention. Each mask in some way represents one of LCIF's global causes or our District Governor's theme of Shooting for the Stars". The mask is technically free to you; however, we ask that you consider a donation a \$5 per mask or any other amount you would be willing to give LCIF.

STATUS OF HELPING! Your donations of time and money help our communities both locally and globally; and makes it possible for LCIF to address their 8 global causes which includes Disaster Relief, Vision, Humanitarian Efforts, Diabetes, Youth Childhood Cancer, Hunger, Environment. Today, each packaged Lions logo mask addresses one of these global causes.

STATUS of 6C GIVING to LCIF: Since the beginning of Campaign 100 starting with the lookback year beginning 7/1/2017 through 3/31/2021, the Lions of 6C have given a total \$65,180.24 to LCIF or basically an average of \$115 per Lion in our district.

Year 1 or 7/1/17 - 6/30/18 = \$16,368.52 (\$29/Lion)

Year 2 or 7/1/18 - 6/30/19 = \$15,701.10 (\$27/Lion)

Year 3 or 7/1/19 - 6/30/20 = 18,764.12 (\$33/Lion)

Year 4 or 7/1/20 - 6/30/21 = \$14,346.56 (\$25/Lion so far) (through 3/31/2021 only)

As a District, our giving through the third quarter of this Lions year is 8% ahead of the same period last year.

Zone Giving as a percent of \$65,180.24 for the period from 7/1/17 to 3/31/2021 is as follows:

Zone A = 7.7% ★ Zone B = 7.1% ★ Zone C = 37.1% ★ Zone D = 47.3%

Other Donations = .8% (includes District & cancelled Club donations in the timeframe)

Club Participation is high at 89.3% which means 25 of our 28 clubs have made donations so far this year. Let's see if we can reach 100% participation by 6/30/2021!

I am so very proud of all the 6C Lions who have made this possible - - we still have nearly 3 months left in this Lions year! Thank you all so very much! ROAR!

STATUS OF DISTRICT /COMMUNITY GRANTS (DCG) FUNDS: District 6C has a total of \$5,432.78 in DCG Funds waiting for us to request a grant at any time. I estimate that \$1,865 will be added to this balance at the end of this Lions Year. Funds do rollover from year to year so that we can save for a bigger project; however, we must request them before they expire. Here is a list of the 6C available DCG funds:


