

Not only do hearing dogs have to walk well in the heel position, they need to learn to be reliable even when surrounded by distractions and temptations! In order for the hearing dog and handler to be a successful team, it is critical that the dog and partner have a solid bond. Consequently, a hearing dog should not demonstrate interest in, or garner attention from, other individuals. Jagger recently accompanied his Foster to the salon which provided a perfect training opportunity for Jagger to demonstrate his "Place" cue while ignoring all the new distractions, smells and people! This was also a great exposure outing for all that salons have to offer; the capes, multiple hair dryers, the silly smells and lots of activity!

"Leave it" is the cue to remind the dog to ignore things that a dog may typically find interesting. Here at IHDI we use it to tell the dog to ignore other animals, food, objects, smells, and people. This cue is also very important for a dog's safety in ignoring and leaving potentially harmful items they could come in contact with while in public. In these photos you can see Jagger demonstrating his "Leave It" cue--even when tempted with a delicious dinner right in front of him! How do you think he did?!

When traveling in the car, due to his small size, Jagger is buckled up in the back for his safety. We promise, he will be the best back seat driver you could ever ask for!

These new environments & ways of travel are built into a Hearing Dog's training curriculum to help ensure a safe & stress free travel for teams regardless if it's by air, foot, or wheels! During these outings Jagger experiences, and grows comfortable with, rolling suitcases, trucks driving past, the hustle and bustle of a busy airport, escalators and elevators, trains and overhead sound systems saying loud messages like "the doors are closing", crowds of people in smaller spaces, car washes, gas station stops... the list goes on and on. We will try to introduce and de-sensitize Jagger to the vast array of lights, sounds, smells and experiences he is likely to encounter as he travels with his person through out their world.

### **International Hearing Dog Report (IHDI)** 4/28/21 PCC Andy Smith/IHDI State Chair

Hello Lions! International Hearing Dogs is doing well. Both the handler and the dog training are newly designed and adhere to ADI standards. The first graduation will be the first class for ADI Review towards IHDI's ADI certification process.

### The training and graduation, provides many "Firsts" for IHDI.

- First time IHDI has implemented their practice of handlers coming to us
- First time handlers will have completed Pre-Match Training
- ♦ First time handler/dog teams will spend 10 days in training together
- First time handler/dog teams will be required to pass a Public Access Test
- First time handler/dog teams will be required to pass a Sound Alert Test
- First Time IHDI will have a Passing of the Leash and Graduation Ceremony

Their 2<sup>nd</sup> On-site Training and Graduation will be late August/early September. Four dog/ handler teams may be in that class.

The Volunteer Foster Project is starting to take off. IHDI has two dogs in full-time Foster care 24/7. Rather than just on the weekends the dogs come to IHDI Monday through Friday so trainers can work with them. The dogs go home to fosters each afternoon/evening and also spend the weekends with their Fosters.

New adaptive technology is being used with IHDI clients to better serve them.

A new trainer had been hired to replace Karrisa. her name is Taylor Smith. She comes from Service Dogs Inc outside of Austin TX. She brings over 9 years of dog training experience with her. She is deaf and has trained a hearing dog for herself. She is also fluent in American Sign Language.

Staff Morale is high, and the staff is operating as a productive and effective team.

Thanks for all who are following Jaggers Journey. So far, the campaign has raised over \$10,000. The goal is \$20,000 with 8 more weeks to go. This signed certification form must be received by the District Governor postmarked no later than August 1, 2022.

- All Membership and Activities Reports MUST be filed online or postmarked by the last day of the month (or with in 3 days of their last meeting of the month which ever is later).
- Completed adding New Club Officers to MyLCI or Officer Report form (old PU101) filed out online or postmarked no later than April 15th of the current Lion year.
- Must have participated in one club service project and one fund raiser during the Lion year.
- All club dues must be paid within 60 days of billing.
- Have attended at least two of your clubs Zone meetings during the Lion year
- Must have done at least Two of the following events
