The following are action steps to accomplish this goal:

Advertise district and club activities in local media outlets and social media platforms.

Organize and accomplish two membership growth events (one for each half of the year).

Accomplish club officer training.

Visit each club to check on wellness and identify opportunities for growth.

Each club is asked to establish its own plan of action to support those of the District. To assist us all will be a Global Action Team that includes the Global Leadership Team, chaired by PDG Donna Sly-Redd; the Global Membership Team, chaired by PDG Rick Argotsinger; and the Global Service Team with this position being open. Second Vice District Governor Elect Robert Storrs will be the Champion for the group and coordinate all of their activities.

Again, thanks to all and a great big shout out to DG Holly for the support she gave me in learning how to be a DG. I am sure that we can reach the stars and achieve our goals in spite of the current obstacles.

Again, we need to develop new clubs in areas where we presently do not have a club. As of the end of May, we had 592 members in the district. Last year at this time we had 638 members. LCI would like to have a district with at least 1,250 members but we are presently in transition. What does that mean? There are several things: we do not have 35 clubs and 1,250 members. There are also a few financial things LCI will not assist with our district. My question to you "Are you willing to work to get our district back up to the 35 clubs and 1,250 members in the next five years?" 2nd VDG Bob Storrs will be asking for your help this year. Let's work together to make this district the best in the State.

Clubs ask your district officers to come out to your club for a visit. Ask them to give a 10-15-minute talk on club satisfaction or any other topic that will help your club become the best it can be.
