I attended a DG Team Meeting with DG Stokes, IPDG Holly and the two VDGs. It is meant as a strategy meeting of what is going on in the district. Our attention should be focused on what assistance we can give to the clubs of the district. The goal is to have a healthy district with healthy clubs that are meeting the needs of our communities. Where there is a need, there is a Lion.

Leader Dogs for the Blind held Zoom meetings for 1<sup>st</sup> VDGs and District Leader Dog chairs for their Summer Visit. With COVID19, they could not hold in-person meetings, so it was done virtually. These meetings were held on three Mondays and were repeated on Thursdays if you could not make the Monday meeting time. Leader Dog had 224 people register for their virtual Summer Visits. Averaging about 186 Lions on the sessions each week from 28 states, Puerto Rico, and 2 Canadian provinces.

I also attended the Arvada Lions Club meeting in-person. Zone "C" held a Zoom zone meeting which I attended. I also sat in on District 6SE cabinet meeting.

I received an email the other day from my FVDG/DGE Group Leader who happens to be a personal friend from Minnesota. Now the work of online webinars and training starts. My group has 1<sup>st</sup> VDGs from Australia, Philippines, Canada, and the USA. I am Facebook friends with several of them already and am looking forward to getting to know the rest soon. The training is scheduled for the first week of February 2021.

I am looking forward at attending club meetings and service projects. Please let me know when your events are happening so I may put them in my calendar.







#### August 1, 2020

#### District Governor Stokes and 6C Cabinet Members,

This has been a challenging and exciting year inasmuch as COVID-19 has limited us in many ways and exciting because our Lions were not held back for long. LCIF announced it has extended Campaign100 for an additional year. Today, I am happy to report on the following District 6C results for the second year of Campaign100:

#### STATUS of 6C GIVING to LCIF for the period from 7/1/19 - 7/27/2020 as follows:

- 100% Club Participation which means all 28 Clubs made donations by the end of the year - - which means I met my goal of 100% participation. 6C did have the HIGHEST club participation rate in Colorado. THANK YOU!
- Donations for the period total \$18,764 which was 19.5% greater than last year's donations of \$15,701. This was the HIGHEST district donation in MD-6.
- LCIF's Campaign100 expectation or goal for our district was \$57,600 (based on \$100 X 576 members) over the 3-year campaign which has now been extended to a 4-year campaign. In the first two years of the campaign, we have donated a total of \$34,465 so we are about \$24,135 from our total goal.
- Here are what some of our Clubs did in this second year of Campaign100:
  - o 1 Club averaged greater than \$200/member.
  - 2 Clubs averaged between \$100 \$125/member.
  - 2 Clubs averaged between \$80 -\$99/member.

The Railroad Museum is hosting the "Thomas the Tank Engine" for the 18<sup>th</sup> consecutive year and the Denver Lions have an opportunity to be Thomas Volunteers and help with this year's program.
