

Welcome to the 2021-2022 Lion year! I am excited to serve District 6C as your District Governor. We will continue to move forward off IPDG Stokes Anderson, Jr.'s lead. Our district goals are two-fold. First is to help clubs grow healthier and reduce our member drops. Second is to continue to contribute to the Lions Clubs International Fund (LCIF) Campaign 100 in helping to meet their goals of 300 million dollars. I would like our district to be a 100% giving district to LCIF. That means that each club gives something that could be as small as a dollar. I would like to see \$30 per member. As a reminder, it may not be equal giving, but equal sacrifice.

I am planning on doing what I call "Governor's Coffee Talks" six of them throughout the year. These will be with club presidents and they can join in at their convenience. We will cover a range of topics and have open discussions. I hope these will grow our leadership base and strengthen our clubs.

I would like to see 75% of our club officers go through some type of training this year. I will be working with our Global Leadership Team Coordinator, PDG Rick Argotsinger and his team to bring more training to the Lions club members. I am planning to do a Zoom training with Secretaries to explain the district membership and activities (M&A) report. The best example I have seen is PDG "Ole" Jack's report he sends to the district governor, vice district governors, and his zone chair. I will be sending out a spreadsheet to help the secretaries with reporting. Any questions, please contact me.

The Governor's Contest is being brought back this year. I plan on using the zone chairs to tally the points for this based on the district M & A report clubs send to them each month. Clubs do not have to participate in the contest, yet it is a good way to add to your administration account. I will be giving out cash prizes for the top three scores.

For District Governor club visits, I would like clubs to invite me to visit your club. I have a form that needs to be filled out. It is a PDF that you can fill in the blanks, then save and email to me. Put in several date choices for me so I can coordinate my calendar. Thank you very much. I know you have not done it this way before. This is what I would like you to do for me. I appreciate your efforts.

I would like the zone chairs to work with their clubs in doing a "How Are Your Ratings" survey this Lion year. It is a good way to gauge where your club is and how your membership feels about the direction the club is going. For our clubs to provide the best service to our communities, we need to know what our members are thinking and their desires for service.

I will be directing our Vice District Governors with different tasks throughout the year to assist our district and clubs. I have asked 2nd VDG Dianne Christian to work with the zone chairs. 1st VDG Bob Storrs will be looking into starting a club branch focusing on Special Olympics. I am hoping it can be based out of Lakewood.

Let us rise-up to shine the light of service this year with service from the heart. Again, I feel you have a good team working for you in the district. If you have any concerns or questions, please reach out to any one on the DG Team. We are here to help you be the best you can be.

6-C 100% Secretary's Award

A 100% Secretary's Award will be presented to club secretaries of 6-C who have completed all seven requirements listed below. Each requirement must be indicated on the activities report at the time of their completion. Club secretaries eligible for this award must be certified by their club's president. This signed certification form must be received by the District Governor postmarked no later than August 1, 2022.

- 1. All Membership and Activities Reports MUST be filed online or postmarked by the last day of the month (or with in 3 days of their last meeting of the month which ever is later).
- 2. Completed adding New Club Officers to MyLCI or Officer Report form (old PU101) filed out online or postmarked no later than **April 15**th of the current Lion year.
- 3. Must have participated in one club service project and one fund raiser during the Lion year.
- 4. All club dues must be paid within 60 days of billing.
- 5. Have attended at least two of your clubs Zone meetings during the Lion year
- 6. Must have done at least Two of the following events
