Let's try something New and Fun



Have you ever Tweeted on Twitter? More importantly have you ever created a Tweet that was seen by Lions around the world? Well, you can, and it is really easy. So, let's do exactly that.

First, if you don't have a Twitter account, set one up.

- On your PC, go to <u>Twitter.com</u>, click Create an Account, then select a username and enter the additional information requested. Twitter will send you a verification code via your phone. Enter it and continue through the steps. Remember your password.
- If you prefer to do this on your phone, download the Twitter app from your app store and open it up. The setup process is similar except you will receive a code via email to enter and continue the process

Now click on **Tweet** and type a short message about something going on in Lions. Next is the option to include a picture or a video (icon at bottom left). This significantly improves the interest created by your tweet. **Now the secret** to getting your Tweet shown on Lion's websites around the world. Include #Hashtags that Lions' websites use to find Tweets to show. You can start with a few local hashtags and then include those used by Lions groups around the world.

Post it. It will take a few hours for the post to propagate through. Then so wait half day to check the website that is going to show your Tweet. If you simply want to try this out, use #LionsDistrict6C as your post. It will only appear on the one site: <u>https://www.lionstorrs.info/photos</u>. The club that has the most Tweets posted to my site per member will receive a prize.

This same approach to use of Hashtags applies also to posts on YouTube and Instagram. **#WeServe** can be used to spread your Tweet across the Lions community.

<u>What should you Tweet?</u> Did you have an interesting speaker at your meeting? Did a Lion receive special recognition? Did you participate in a service project? Did you take a picture of a Lions activity? Did you take a video of a Lions activity? (Videos are highly effective at communicating and gathering interest). Or do you just have a thought about Lions that you would like to share? Every Lion can contribute.


It appears that the entire western half of the United States is having major issues with wild fires and the eastern half is being threatened with excessive rain, tornadoes, and tropical disturbances.

The good news is that in spite of COVID-19, all of you of District 6C were able to raise and donate funds to LCIF and I am happy to report the following results for the third year of LCIF's Campaign100:

STATUS of 6C GIVING to LCIF for the period from 7/1/20 – 6/30/2021 as follows:

- Donations totaled \$20,720 which was 10% greater than last year's donations of \$18,764. 6C had the HIGHEST district donations in MD-6.
- 100% Club Participation which means all 28 Clubs made donations by the end of the year -which means I met my goal of 100% participation. 6C shares this accomplishment with 6W. THANK YOU!
- Here are what some of our Clubs did in this third year of Campaign100:
 - 2 Clubs averaged greater than \$200/member.
 - 3 Clubs averaged between \$100 \$130/member.
 - 10 Clubs averaged between \$20 \$50/member.
- As a reminder, direct donations to LCIF can be made by your club, your individual members, corporate sponsors, or from fundraising events through your Club, your Zone or your District.

LCIF CLUB RECOGNITION / MEMBER RECOGNITION:

- 4 Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship (PMJF) recipients from our District.
- 4 Melvin Jones Fellowship (MJF) recipients from our District.
- Let's honor and recognize more Lions during this new Lions year.

District and Club Community Impact Grant (DCG) Program – This new program was introduced as part of Campaign100 and includes donations from the 2017-18 fiscal year as well. Essentially, 15% of unrestricted donations will be set aside for either a Club or District. To qualify for the set aside, a Club must give a minimum of \$5,000 within the fiscal year and the District minimum amount is \$10,000 from all other Clubs. Both have an opportunity for 6C to accumulate these funds over a 15-yr. rolling period to save it for a larger local project.

- In the first year of Campaign 100, no Clubs donated \$5,000 in order to qualify for a DCG; however, in the second year, we had 1 club gave slightly more than \$5,000. In this third year, things improved as we had two clubs that donated \$5,000 or more and qualify for \$750+ set aside for DCGs.
- On a District level, donations have exceeded \$10,000 for the last several years including this year. Cumulatively, we have \$7,024 funds already set aside and I expect that to increase to about \$8,615, an increase of approximately \$1,591.

Information on the District 6C's available funds for a District Grant will be announced by LCIF in late August after the year end donations are reconciled. I will let you know what our updated funds are at that time.

Your contributions are empowering LCIF to provide service to people and communities throughout the world and here in our own back yards! THANK YOU!

6C LCIF COORDINATOR'S CAMPAIGN100 GOALS FOR 7/1/2021 - 6/30/2022: Here are my goals for this new year.

- Raise \$38,568 in this final year of Campaign100. (My original goal for the four-year campaign was \$110,112. Through 7/26/21, we have raised \$71,544 total so far leaving \$38,568. Our per member average has been \$128 through 7/26/21. I would be happy if we could reach \$25,000.)
- 100% Club Participation
- 3 Model Clubs at \$5,000+ for this final year
- 4 Clubs that average greater than \$200/member
- 7 Clubs that average greater than \$100/member
- 17 Clubs that average \$20 \$99/member

Opportunity to Serve Our District

Zone Chair - We have need of two Zone Chairs in our district: Zone "A" and Zone "C". To be a zone chair, you must have been a club president. New constitution and by-laws change states: Have not previously served a full term or a major portion thereof as district governor and zone chair may serve no more than three (3) cumulative years in said position.

Childhood Cancer Chair – This is one of our Lions Global Causes. I have a lot of ideas this Lions could do to get this essential position going in our district. The chair would have a blank slate to start a program in our district with.

Convention Chair – This person would coordinate the planning and details of the district convention. They would interact with the district governor to confirm details of their wishes for the convention. Coordinate the registration and meal(s) and generally oversee the planning committee.

Hunger Chair – Another of Lions Global Causes. Most clubs work with their local food bank or shelf to help those in need. Other clubs may do food boxes throughout the year. There are project ideas on Lions Clubs International website that can help in directing this position.

Speech Contest Chair – The chair is responsible for getting the information out to clubs and seeing to it the club winners get to the district convention to compete. Then the district winner gets to our multiple district convention to compete.

Youth Exchange/Youth Camps – This chair would be working with the State chair to help with getting host families for the exchange students coming to our youth exchange camp. The Youth Camp side would work with those special need persons who would like to experience going to camp.


