### **Used Eyeglass Recycling Program**

I am sure everyone is interested in what is happening with the Used Eyeglass Recycling Program. On October 23rd at the Council of Governors meeting, the council agreed to send the 350,00 pairs of glasses to ReSpec Recycling Center in California that are in storage in Sterling. This way it cleans up the storage fees and space. The council is putting together guidelines for clubs to sort the used eyeglasses, so everyone is doing it the same way. Clubs will be asked to pre-sort, separate the good glass from the glasses that will be sent to be recycled. Then clubs will have to clean and dry the glasses that will continue to be processed to Sterling. I have delegated our district chair to form a committee to see if it is feasible for our district to have our own processing center. We still need to process the glasses we have in our district, and nothing can be sent to Sterling until their storage sheds are cleaned out. The other part of this is Sterling prison is no longer reading the lens, so we must decide what we are going to do that. I would like to thank every club that responded to my survey, I will give the committee everything you sent me. I will try to keep you inform on what is going on with this matter as we make progress.

### Other News

I have held two President's Coffee Talks, August 14th and October 9th, the first coffee talk was well attended. We discussed a lot of different things dealing with Lions. The October coffee talk was virtual, there was only 5-6. I addressed the idea of Priority Clubs with a Certified Guiding Lion to assist the club leadership.

The district has training schedule for Lions Refresher on November 20th. We are looking at doing three workshops, STOP the Catch & Release Program, Club Membership: It's a TEAM Effort, and Lions Ladder Climbing. We are looking at another Midwinter Lions Learning in January or early February 2022.

The district is sitting at a -3 in membership gain/loss. That is good beings it started the year out with a -9. We are looking at starting two Club Branches in the next few months. More on these as the branches develop.

District 6 C had at least 9 Lions attend the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum in Des Moines Iowa in September. PDG Rick Argotsinger and Lion Janice Davis receiving their master's degree for Lions University. It was a tremendous time of learning and renewing friendship, beside making new friends.

We had three Lions attend the Paul Barbour Regional Lions Leadership Institute October 15-17. 2nd VDG Dianne Christian, Golden Lions; Lion Carol Young, Arvada Lions; and Lion

Bill Lutz, Pleasant View Lions. Thank you all for attending this MD6 training.



### Ideas for Recruiting new Members

Some Ideas to help you get new members - A Signup sheet is so important

1) Have a membership chair then create a membership committee. This core group will develop and oversee your recruitment plan. Then find the natural connectors in your group, the folks who seem to know just about everybody. Appoint them as "ambassadors" to help get the word out about your group's terrific programs and services.

### 2) Look for contact opportunities

Try to determine how and where to easily contact potential members, either online, through snail mail or best of all, in person. Some great in-person options can include organizational and community events, local festivals & YOUR FUNDRAISER'S. Then make a specific plan for outreach and recruitment, with dates, methods of contact, and the specific information you want to share about your organization. Have a signup sheet to get NAMES & PHONE NUMBERS.

### 3) Make it personal

Whenever possible, contact potential members directly, meaning by phone or in person, so you have a chance to talk with them about membership. Extend a personal invitation to join your group and make sure to smile!

### 4) Describe specific benefits

After inviting them to join, begin to describe some of the specific benefits they will find appealing. Whether they admit it or not, they're thinking "What's in it for me?" Talk about well-known advantages of joining the group, whether it's personal satisfaction for supporting a worthy cause, gaining valuable information to further one's career, or meeting new friends or colleagues.

### 5) Tailor it to the individual

Mention one or two benefits that could be particularly meaningful to the potential member. If the person has some special areas of interest, emphasize how the group provides focused activities in those areas.

### 6) Sprinkle in some fun with the facts

Some people make decisions from a rational viewpoint, while others are more feeling-based. As you talk about the group's benefits, don't forget to mention some of the enjoyable social and relationship-building aspects of membership along with all of the impressive facts and figures about member programs and services. Talk with enthusiasm about some of the personal benefits you have derived from being a member.

### Ideas for Recruiting new Members cont.

### 7) Remove barriers

Make it easy for the new member to join the group. Point them to an online page for signing up or offer to have someone from the group call them to help them with their MEMBERSHIP AP-PLICATION. If there are dues, offer various payment methods and payment plans (e.g., affordable monthly installments). Many groups will also offer a new member discount. Right now Lions International is waiving the 35.00 fee to join.

### 8) Follow up

Certainly not everyone you approach will sign up to be a member the first time you contact them. Wait a little while and then check in to see if they have any questions about the group or would like further information. Make sure they know they can contact you at any time if questions arise. (Always the reason to get their name and number).

### 10) Send a thank you

After each contact with a potential member, remember to thank them for their time. If they do decide to join your group, be sure to follow-up with another word of appreciation. Again, do this in person if at all possible. Or, as one of my dear colleagues so often reminds me, a handwritten thank you note sent in the mail is definitely memorable, since you almost never see one of these any more.

Hopefully these tips will help you attract new members.


