It is good for your club to rotate officers on a regular basis, especially the club president. I think it is Golden Lions Club who have not had a repeat president in their 80 years of service. We pride ourselves for not having a repeat district governor in 6 Central, and yet we have Lions serving consecutive terms as president. Clubs need to break the cycle by electing a different Lion into club officer positions each year. There are district cabinet positions that require a Lion must serve as club president before they can serve on the cabinet. I know of a Lion who wanted to serve on one of our entities, but the entity required they serve as club president first. That club president stepped back to allow the other Lion to serve as club president so they could run for a position on that entity. I just wanted to put that out there as fruit for thought. Our district needs to grow, and it won't if we stay in status quo. We need fresh ideas and new Lions stepping up to take on leadership positions. I know it is hard to fill positions if your club does not have many members, then it is time to get up and go out to recruit new members. If you need help with that, we have district Lions who will help you put together a recruiting meeting. You just have to ask. I want to see our district grow, how about you?

Our district convention will be April 2^{nd.} Have you registered yet? It will be held at the Holiday Inn Lakewood. Our

guest speaker will be PID Bruce Beck from Minnesota. You won't want to miss what Lion Bruce will have to share with us. I first met Lion Bruce when he was Council Chair Elect in 2008. He is a seasoned Lion, great speaker, great teacher, and just a lot of fun. I hope you see you at our 2022 District 6 Central Convention.

Wising You All a Blessed and Successful 2022.

Can you believe we are already halfway through this Lionistic year? Time just seems to fly by. Are you looking ahead? Now is the time to put out feelers for your 2022-2023 Board of Directors (BOD). Approach those members you feel have potential to be good leaders for your club.

Your incoming president should already be set. The 1st Vice President should be preparing now to be moving into that position July 1st, 2022. This should be a smooth transition. A 2nd Vice President is nice but seems like it is harder to fill. Here is a synopsis of the club BOD positions to run a club efficiently.

- President: Is the chief executive officer of this club; presides at all meetings of the Board and the club; issues
 the call for regular and special meetings of the Board and the club; appoints the standing and special
 committees of this club and cooperates with chairmen thereof to effect regular functioning and reporting of
 such committees; sees that regular elections are duly called, noticed and held; and cooperates with and is an
 active member of the district governor's advisory committee of the zone in which this club is located.
- Vice President: Under the direction of the president, oversees the functioning of such committees of this club
 as the president shall designate. If the president is unable to perform the duties of his/her office, the vicepresident next in rank shall occupy his/her office and perform his/her duties until the president is able to
 perform said duties.
- Secretary: Keeps the club running efficiently. You provide important support of all business operations for the club and board of director meetings, maintain the club minutes, roster and member contact information as well as support the club service and social activities, and submit reports to the District & LCI. This is a position of great responsibility.
- Treasurer: Keeps the club's financial records to ensure the club operates within a proper fiduciary capacity. You
 manage all the financial operations of the club, including invoicing and payment of dues. This can vary from club
 to club. In some clubs, the secretary does the invoicing, recording, and processing receipts and payments for
 both the administrative and public service accounts.
- Membership Chair: The responsibilities for this position are to oversee the recruitment and orientation of new
 members, to recommend to the Board for approval or disapproval all membership applicants, and to develop
 strategies to retain and increase involvement of existing members
- Lion Tamer: Shall have charge of and be responsible for the property and paraphernalia of the club, including
 flags, banners, gong, gavel, song books, and button board. He/she shall put each in its proper place before each
 meeting and return the same to the proper storage area after each meeting. He/she shall act as sergeant-atarms at meetings, see that those present are properly seated, and distribute bulletins, favors, and literature as
 required at club and board meetings. (Responsibilities can vary from club to club.)
- Tail Twister: Promotes fun, harmony, good fellowship, life, and enthusiasm in the meetings through
 appropriate stunts and games and the judicious imposition of fines on club members. The max fine is not to
 exceed an amount fixed by the BOD. There can be one or more tail twisters.
- Directors: How many directors depends on the club. Typically, there are two 2-year directors and two 1-year directors. The two-year directors become one-year directors the following year. The directors are voting members of the BOD. Their assigned responsibilities vary with each club.

Good luck in filling all these vital positions. Don't be afraid to offer to step up to the plate, you may be just what your club needs. You don't need to wait to be asked! Make your intentions known.

Last, but not least be sure and attend the Officer Trainings the District offers. This will help you be prepared to be the best you can be at fulfilling your new position on the BOD.

KidSight Screening Numbers

We have screened 19,842 children in the state as of December and referred 2,799. The rate of referral is 14.1 14.1 percent. District 6C has screened 9,886 with 1,909 referrals (19.3%)! Vision referrals are at an all time high. This is most likely due to the fact that many children have not been screened in two years and spent a lot of time last year in front of computer screens. THANK YOU to all of our KidSight Colorado volunteers for screening this fall during the coronavirus and please continue to be safe when screening during this year.


