By the end of April Lions clubs will have elected officers for 2022-2013 and reported them to LCI on the PU-101 form which you can find by searching the LionsClubs.org site.

I hope you will take this opportunity to take a deep look at your club, where it is and where it is going. What path are you on? I suspect that many clubs are very comfortable with the status quo. I am reminded of the story of KODAK. You probably remember the company, a leader in photographic film. In 1976, they were in the process of developing a new digital camera but decided to drop the effort because they were comfortable with the path they were on. We know what happened to KODAK. I want to challenge every Lion in the district to not get comfortable but rather to step out of our box and become champions of change.

First, take a close look at the current situation in your club. You use one of two tools. The Membership Satisfaction Guide provides a questionnaire that you can send to each member as well as guidance on how to use the survey results. A very good read even if you don't decide to use it directly.

A second tool that you may consider is a SWOT analysis - Strengths, Weakness, Opportunities and Treats. This is a tool used by many companies to focus on the situation that faces the organization.

Having gained an understanding of where your club is today, image a vision of what your club should look like at the end of the year.

Establish a plan to get to your vision. Set goals for the coming year and then action plans to accomplish the goals. Not having goals means we move without direction. The goals should be stated as SMART goals -

- Specific
- Measurable
- Actionable
- Realistic
- Time-based

Once you have a Vision and a Plan to get there, use that plan to generate success.

## COLORADO LIONS KIDSIGHT PROGRAM April 2020

### KidSight Numbers for 2021-2022

Thank you and congratulations to all of our 6C volunteers for your help in ensuring that children can see clearly. 20,596 children have been screened in Colorado this year and 2,882 children were referred to an eye doctor due to detection of a vision problem (14 percent). In the 6C district 10,301 children have been screened and 1,953 referred for a 19 percent rate of referral. The rate of myopia (nearsightedness has increased substantially from 3 percent to 8 percent. This corresponds with studies that have shown the increase in the amount of screen time due to remote learning during Covid and the increase in <u>videogaming</u> among children. This increase began prior to Covid and has gotten worse with children being identified with myopia at a much younger age than in previous years. Thank you so much 6C volunteers! Your efforts on behalf of our program are truly appreciated.

#### To: District Governor Ted Pederson and Cabinet:

STATUS OF HELPING! The Marshall Fire burned down homes and displaced many families living in our communities. The Lions of 6C and its District Governor jumped in to help those families through an LCIF emergency grant. Planning and developing how we could help the community then putting all those ideas into action was a major process which involved many Lions! Whether you were a leader, a planner, a buyer, a volunteer, or a donor, you all played an active role in helping the victims of the Marshall Fire. A great big THANK YOU and a loud ROAR to all of you that helped!!

Your donations of time and money not only helped our community but reached others around our globe and makes it possible for LCIF to address their 8 global causes which includes Disaster Relief. Vision, Humanitarian Efforts, Diabetes, Youth, Childhood Cancer, Hunger, Environment.

STATUS of 6C GIVING to LCIF: We are in the last year of Campaign 100 and there is still time to make a donation. Since the beginning of Campaign 100 through 3/14/2022, the 6C Lions have given a total \$81,874 to LCIF or basically an average of \$144 per Lion in our district based on 566 members. We are at 74% of the campaign goal of \$110,000.

- District Giving since 7/1/2021 In the first 8 months of this Lion's year, donations total \$9,715. With just 4 months remaining and your continued support, I am confident that 6C will reach its goal of \$14,500.
- Club Participation is at 50% which means 13 of our 26 clubs have made donations so far this year. Let's see if we can reach 100% participation by 6/30/2022!

STATUS OF DISTRICT /COMMUNITY GRANTS (DCG) FUNDS: District 6C has about \$7,000 in DCG Funds available for a grant for a district project. Funds do rollover from year to year so that we can save for a bigger project; however, if we don't do something before 2034, the amount available will reduce.
