### LEADERSHIP

6C LCIF Chair Report PDG Lion Gwen "Cookie" Balk May 20, 2022

### To: District Governor Ted Pederson and Cabinet:

As you may know, Lions are in the last few months of Campaign100 - - it all ends on 6/30/2022. However, you still have time to make a donation or a pledge for the next few years that would count toward this Campaign. What are you willing to give to a world in need?

The good news is that the Lions of 6C have done an outstanding job of giving and supporting LCIF through their service and volunteerism over this four-year campaign. I thank you from the bottom of my heart for all you have done.

STATUS of 6C Monetary GIVING to LCIF: Since the beginning of Campaign100 through 4/30/2022, the 6C Lions have given a total \$85,308.52 to LCIF or basically an average of \$150 per Lion in our district based on 566 members at the start of the campaign and \$168 at the current level of 507 members. We are at 78% of the campaign goal of \$110,000 set by us at the beginning of what turns out to be a 4-year Campaign. By 6/30/2022, I expect that we will be closer meeting that goal by 85% or more.

- District Monetary Giving since 7/1/2021 In the first 10 months of this Lion's year, donations total \$13,765.28. With just 2 months remaining and your continued support, I am confident that 6C will reach \$20,000 for this Lions Year.
- Zone Monetary Giving Since the beginning of Campaign100, Zone A represents 8.2% of all monetary giving; Zone B represents 7.5%; Zone C represents 33.4%; and Zone D represents 49.6%; Miscellaneous donations attributed to 6C makes up the remaining 1.3%.
- Campaign Model Clubs We have five model clubs in the district.
- Club Participation is at 81% which means 21 of our 26 clubs have made donations so far this year. Let's see if we can reach 100% club participation by 6/30/2022!

Let's not forget Melvin Jones Fellowships. In this Lions year so far, there have been 2 Melvin Jones Fellowships awarded and 3 Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowships awarded; and I am sure there are more to come before our year is over.

STATUS OF DISTRICT /COMMUNITY GRANTS (DCG) FUNDS: District 6C has about \$6,700 in DCG Funds available for a grant for a district project. By the end of this year, we hope to boost that to

\$8,000. Funds do rollover from year to year so that we can save for a bigger project; however, if we don't do something before 2034, the amount available will be reduce.

STATUS OF HELPING! Thank you to all Lions who helped to serve the disaster victims of the Marshall Fire whether you were a leader, a planner, a buyer, a volunteer, or a donor, you all played an active role in helping the victims of the Marshall Fire. A great big THANK YOU and a loud ROAR to all of you that helped and will continue to help as that community moves forward to rebuild!!

Your donations of time and money not only helps our communities, it reaches others around our globe and makes it possible for LCIF to address their 8 global causes which includes Disaster Relief, Vision, Humanitarian Efforts, Diabetes, Youth, Childhood Cancer, Hunger, Environment.

We were a little worried after canceling the last two years due to Covid and moving to a different stadium, we might experience some glitches this time, but I think everything went pretty smoothly. We ended up with a total of 22 elementary schools (tying the record) and 1,423 runners racing in 78 heats. This event was first held in 1984 and other than the last two years and one additional year when a late-season blizzard forced us to cancel, the relays have been held every year.

It's quite the undertaking with a total of 35 full and part-time staff from the City, 22 P.E. Teachers with 3-6 assistant volunteers each, and an additional 6-8 Lions Club volunteers all working together to ensure the event's success. It's the best example I can think of where the City, School District, and a local service organization work together to benefit the community. Money raised from entry fees helps support the Lions Club Vision Services Programs which provide eyeglasses, exams, and other services to local elementary school children in need. 
