Hello Lions of 6C. Good to know that you are there. Thanks for all you do for your club and community and the district and the multiple and the international movement. 100 years of team work and community service. We have come a long way. As we are planning our 99th annual convention in Chicago we have a lot on our plates. Our problem, though is that we are still kind of keeping it to ourselves. I have been tasked with arranging for some PR for our combined convention this year. It is an assignment I relish, given my background in the media and I look forward to it. As I have been renewing acquaintances in the press, I have been reminded that as clubs we have not been diligent in shining our lights so that non-Lion members of our community know more about us.

"Oh, Governor, everyone in my community knows what Lions do and who the Lions are," say many of you.

But, I ask you to think about it. When you go to a Lions meeting, how do you dress? At a minimum, you wear a polo shirt or a tee shirt with a Lions logo on it or some club promotions. Many of you are club officers or have been officers and you wear a name badge proudly proclaiming same. Many club members wear vests, either yellow or purple or green, with a big logo and your club name embroidered thereon. But here is the rub; as you look around the room, almost everyone in the room knows you are a Lion and, in fact, is also a Lion. Whether your club is a quiet business-like club or a you are singing and telling jokes and telling stories about your activities, you are "preaching to the choir". I admire that. That camaraderie is part of why we remain as Lions. It has kept me around for going on 20 years. But we are not a secret society and our membership is not meant to be a secret.

The only other time we dress anywhere near that way is at a special event where we are already announced as and presumed to be Lions. Other times it is low profile.

I have a couple Lions decals on my car. They don't show well because of tinted windows, but they are there and people have noted them. I am not a big jewelry guy but I do, much to the chagrin of some of my contemporaries, wear an earring or two, and one of them is usually a Lions logo. I do have a variety of hats and caps but I am selective about where I wear each cap and so now I am beginning to identify that my behavior is the same as that which I am criticizing. I find my behavior is the same with my dresser full of polo shirts. I have KidSight shirts and Lions Camp shirts and plain Lions shirts and Lions denim shirts and USA/Canada Forum shirts and Lord knows what other and how many others I have. The point is that I am -we are- selective about where we wear our brand as if we are proud to be a member of a secret society, not the world's largest voluntary service organization. I talk about elevator speeches as if that just happens, but they don't. There must be a cause and effect thing about the elevator speech. There must be a trigger. The trigger is often the shirt and logo. The KidSight shirts beg for comment because they are so attention demanding. My most used recruiting effort is triggered by vision related logos. Until I lost my white cane pin, that was an attention getter. Over time it has led to a lot of new members. KidSight gets a lot of attention, as does the Forum. So I am wearing more shirts more places.

It is not that you are going to sign them up right there in the elevator, but it is a way to give them your business card and ask them to join you at a meeting of a special event.

Help me spread the word. Wear a Lions shirt to more than a meeting. Hand out those business cards. Be the cause. Make a membership invite be the effect.

Promoting Lions Proudly

During our Centennial, i.e., RIGHT NOW!, Lions around the State of Colorado have the opportunity of a lifetime to promote their Clubs in specific and Lionism in general.

Lions take their motto *We Serve* seriously. They serve proudly, but they practice too much humility when it comes to displaying their service for others to see. It's time that we change this perspective and think outside the nine dots. We've got a number of Club-specific activities that are worthwhile to promote; it's just a matter of figuring out how best to promote and display one or more of these activities and then just do it.

The one that's most likely to have broad appeal is, of course, Kidsight. That's all it took for my wife Susy Osorio Kinsky to do her thing. Kidsight is a natural for her to promote. She and I have been active in volunteering to do Kidsight screenings in the past, and we've used the Plusoptix for some of our recent international and domestic eyesight screening campaigns. Plus, Susy is on the Colorado Kidsight Board currently. So, she contacted a Latino station in Denver, Educa Radio, to ask if she could come on one of their programs and be interviewed about Kidsight. The station asked her to submit a list of a dozen or so questions and answers to act as the substance of the interview, and she did so dutifully. All it took was asking who, what where, when, why and how, and the questions came easily, e.g.:

- Who: preschoolers and kindergarteners, primarily;
- Where: public schools, private schools, daycare centers, etc.
- When: during the school/work week for the schools and daycare centers, on weekends for special events such as health fairs, etc.

All that remained for Susy to do to complete the interview was to step outside a discussion of what we do as Lions and talk also about who we are as a result. This is information on the Lions Clubs International web site and includes such facts/events as:

- chartered in 1917 and now enjoying its Centennial;
- challenged by Helen Keller in 1925 to become "knights of the blind";
- dispenses millions of dollars worldwide for disaster relief, immunizations, etc, through its Foundation, formed in 1968;
- with 46,000 Clubs with 1.4 million members in 200+ countries, it's the largest service organization in the world;
- etc.


