Our Latest Success Story

Earlier this year we screened a four year old girl at a preschool. In February I received an evaluation sheet from the eye doctor who conducted her complete eye exam. She had 20/200 vision and was also found to have congenital cataracts in both eyes. She may also have amblyopia. She has been referred to a pediatric ophthalmologist at Chidren's Hospital for further treatment. This is how we make a difference in childrens' lives. Every time I hear a story like this I want to screen even more kids!

News from the Colorado Department of Education

KidSight Colorado screenings meet all state requirements for vision screening! Please share this information with school districts in your area. There is no need for school districts to consider our screenings as "supplemental" only. This information should be help-ful in recruiting new districts to participate in our program. We have several districts in the state that have chosen to make us an "affiliate" of the school district through a document called a memorandum of understanding. This allows us to screen all the pre-school and kindergarten children in the district without a standard parent permission form. Most districts allow parents to opt out of the screening during the annual registration process if they choose. If you think that the school district you work with would be interested in doing this please contact me for more information.

KidSight Screening

28,542 screenings have been processed since July 1 with 3,998 children referred. The rate of referral is 14.0%.

District 6C 17,207 children screened 2,418 referred 14.0%

Carousel Volunteers Needed

Calling for all volunteers for the Thornton Carousel this summer – here is a brief summary: First of all, it's really fun! Second of all, it's easy.

There are two required trainings which will hopefully be in late March or early April. I have attached the application which must be submitted with a copy of driver's license to the Thornton Rec Center (108th & Colo. Blvd. in Thornton). The training is at the Rec Center and then at the Carousel, where you learn the operations and be hands on.

Lion Cindy handles the scheduling, your members either call or email (prefer) their availability and the person's schedule is added to the google calendar. If the Lions have a gmail address, they can see the calendar to know what's available. We put people in back up positions as well as first position.



The Carousel is open and 2 persons are required on Friday's from 4 until 7 p.m., and then from Saturday 11 a.m. until 7 p.m., and Sunday 11 a.m. until 7 p.m. That's from Memorial Day until Labor Day. The Carousel is not open July 4th, but it is open all other holidays.

From May 3 until Memorial, the Carousel is not open on Fridays and is 12 until 6 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. Same hours for after Labor Day until the last Sunday in September. These are weather permitting.

There are also about 6 or 8 Thursday evenings when the Carousel is open from 4 until 7 – prior to concerts and special events.

Saturday May 17th is the Thornton Fest, and about 35,000 people attend, we'll need lots of volunteers for that day, it will be very busy.

Lion volunteers can be scheduled for the Carousel for as little as one hour, or as much as 4 hours, as long as I have two people there at all times.

If you are scheduled to open you need to be there about 20 minutes early to get set up, and closing shift will take a few minutes extra to close, also.

The Boathouse is about 50 yards away, and they are our backup and go to for help people (City employees) but we never needed them last summer.

Lastly – and probably most importantly, the Lions that worked the Carousel last summer earned for their club on average \$15/ volunteer hour.

We need to know who is going to help us with the Carousel this summer, and who has submitted their applications to the City of Thornton Rec Center as soon as possible. The easiest thing to do is to get your application to the City of Thornton, and when the background check is complete, they notify me and you are added to the list for requested scheduling and updates to procedures. Guest Speaker International Director Esther LaMothe

She is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.
