KidSight Now Has a Plusoptix Screener:

Thanks to a generous donation from the Denver Westwood Club KidSight now has a new Plusopotix screener. Thanks so much for helping us purchase this new machine! If you are interested in reserving the new screener please call and specify that you want to reserve the new Plusoptix screener. I am happy to do training with clubs on the operation of the new machine. It doesn't take long to learn how to use it and the machine doesn't rely on sound so volunteers who were unable to screen with the SureSight may find that the new machine is much easier to use. I will be working to raise additional funds to purchase additional machines for KidSight. We will also use our current Welch Allyn SureSight screeners as well until new equipment can be purchased.

KidSight Screening

31,628 screenings have been processed since July 1 with 4,429 children referred. The rate of referral is 14%. My goal this year has been to screen 35,000 children in Colorado so keep up the great work screening and let me know if I can help in any way!

Guest Speaker International Director Esther LaMothe

Esther LaMothe, from Jackson, Michigan, USA, was elected to serve a two-year term as a director of Lions Clubs International at the association's 96th International Convention held in Hamburg, Germany, July 5-9, 2013.

Director LaMothe is a retired school administrator. A member of the Novi Lions Club, and a Lion since 1995, she has held many offices within the association, including secretary, president, district governor, zone and region chairperson, district and multiple district leadership development chairperson and council chairperson. She has also been a moderator and presenter at several USA/Canada Forums and international conventions.



In recognition of her service to the association, she has received numerous awards including the 100% Club President, the Certified Guiding Lion Award, the Member Key Award, two International President's Medals, two International President's Leadership Medals, and four International President's Certificates of Appreciation. She is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to her Lions activities, Director LaMothe is active in numerous professional and community organizations, including the Midwest Eye-Banks and the Ladies Professional Golf Association Wendy's Charity Classic.

Born in Mexico, Alex Sierra started taking piano lessons when he was 8 years old. At the age of 17 he decided to join a church choir and from that moment on, singing became his passion. After taking private voice lessons with various teachers through the years, he worked on his BM at the Sacred Music School in Guadalajara. After that, hje started working as a voice teacher and joined the Choir of the State of Jalisco, having the opportunity to participate in quite a few operas.
