6C LCIF Chair Report PDG Lion Gwen "Cookie Balk July 30, 2022

To: District Governor Bob Storrs and Cabinet:

I want to thank all the Lions of 6C and their Clubs for your service, time, and donations to Campaign 100 and being part of LCIF's success story as they exceeded their goal of 300 Million Dollars by raising nearly 336 Million.

In this final year of the campaign, our preliminary numbers indicate that District 6C donated a total of \$89,416 over the past 5 years. However, the number is still not final. I do believe that some last minute pledges have increased that total to approximately \$93,161 through mid-July. We do expect a final report within the next few weeks. The following breakdown graph by years totals \$89,416:

District Community Grant (DCG) Funds: Both District 6C and two separate Clubs in the district have DCG funds available and held in reserve at LCIF for each of them. When the District (or Club) finds a community project they need to fund, they can apply for these DCG Funds through LCIF. Funds do rollover from year to year so that 6C can save for a bigger project; however, starting 2034, the first year of those reserved DCG funds expires and will no longer be available to the District. Currently, the total funds available to 6C equal approximately \$8,838. The DCG Grant program was related to Campaign100.



Our daughter and 2 grandchildren, 20, and 17 went on a 10-day humanitarian trip in June to volunteer at a school in Kenya. While on the trip they took a day to go on a Safari. As they were traveling to the Safari our daughter saw a Lions Hospital and ask the driver to please stop she needed to get a picture for her mom. I not only was impressed at the photo, but that my daughter thought of me and had the driver stop the bus to take the picture.



Kim said this hospital was in the middle of nowhere. The LIONS NGOSWANI COMMUNITY MATERNAL and CHILD HOSPITAL it is located a mile West of Ngoswani Village in Kenya, it had just opened in 2021.

What you see in the photo is the entrance. The hospital, which measures around 6,000sqft, seats on a 7-acre piece of land with 12 staff sleeping rooms, adequate solar system, and a 600,000 liters rainwater cistern. The hospital comprises of 2 Ultrasounds GE Portable X-Ray with DR developer, a lab, 2 operating theaters, 5 patient rooms, 10 hospital beds, and 6 cots, a Pharmacy, 3 exam rooms, family planning, Laundry, and a sterilizer. All this in a remote area.

I just had to share this amazing photo. Doesn't this make one proud to be a Lion! Our LCI dollars at work, for the better good.


