At its meeting on Saturday, January 27, the 6C Cabinet approved he funding of a District Public Relations effort for the remainder of the 2017-18. The efforts will take several forms:

We're still pursuing an Ethiopian Club, but it appears that it will likely be a Branch Club instead. Good news: Adams County Lionesses have decided to join the Broomfield Lions as a Branch; Broomfield will hold a celebration party in March.

St Pat's Day Parade on March 17.

Statewide tree planting project on Earth Day, April 22.

Statewide Recycle for Sight project in early June. This would come in 2 steps - one day to pass out brochures and tell people about our program, another day within the following week during which we collect the glasses.

KidSight Colorado Board of Trustee Openings

Both of our 6C Kidsight Colorado Trustee positions are open and will be be on the ballot at our 6C convention on May 5. One is a two year position and one is a three year position. Lions interested in running for these positions should submit a letter of intent and an endorsement from your club to Jack Beckfield, chair of the nominating committee, District Governor Steve Kinsky and Barbara Guest, Cabinet Secretary. We have two open Trustee positions in 6C. Candidates must submit all required paperwork thirty days prior to the election. Lions applying for these positions must be in good standing and have served as a club president. If you have questions regarding these positions or would like a copy of the job description please feel free to contact me.

KidSight Screening – We have reached the midpoint of the 2017-2018 school year. 40,698 children have been screened and 4,007 children referred, a 9.8% rate of referral. The following is a breakdown by type of referral:

KidSight Colorado Database (Seymour) – Our new database is up and running and almost fully functional. I have completed training for all database users and the followup portion of the database is operational. We are able to obtain much more statistical information than we could before. The report which I produced above is a good example of what we can now obtain from the dabase. These reports will be extremely valuable in evaluationg our program and obtaining grant funds. country. Since we have a statewide program KidSight Colorado will be responsible for all data entry into the database. This will allow for consistent and accurate reporting for Colorado.

January 27, 2018 District Governor Kinsky and 6C Cabinet Members,

This year, LCIF celebrates 50 years of unwavering support of Lions' compassionate works and they have created a website, www.lcif50.org, in order to promote this event. However, LCIF needs your help and the help of each Club LCIF Coordinator to spread the word and raise awareness. The website features images, videos, stories and the Together We Can contest series, which gives Lions a fun and educational way to interact with the foundation and a chance to win an exclusive LCIF 50th anniversary medal. Each month, LCIF will feature a new LCIF cause - - January is Measles and February is Lions Quest. Today, I will have LCIF 50th Anniversary Pins and Buttons to pass on to each LCIF Club Coordinator in order to help them promote the website and the 50th Anniversary to their club members.

Speaking of LCIF Club Coordinators, we have 14 clubs who have listed their club coordinators with LCI; and we still have 16 clubs who have not. When you are getting ready to elect your next club officers for the 2018-2019 Lions Year, please remember to fill the LCIF Club Coordinator position and make sure the Club Secretary notifies LCI through MyLCI. I will be concentrating on making presentations to the 16. I am proud to report that for the period from 7/1/2017 through 12/31/2017 that 40% of our clubs, or 12 out of 30, have donated \$9,294.52 to LCIF. This is a 45% increase over the same period in 2016. We typically, collect more in the second half of the Lions year so we may be on pace to reach \$18,000 which would be over my goal of \$15,000. By the way, out last year's total was \$13,643 which was above my previous goal. Thank you to all contributors.

I would still like to see Club participation at 100% instead of 40%. To reach that goal, each club would have to donate at least \$20 to LCIF. Major kudos to the 12 clubs that have already exceeded that mark. (FYI, the worldwide club participation rate is @30%; the USA is @41%.)

In August 2017, LCIF approved 48 Humanitarian Grants totaling about \$4.4M. About \$2M or 47% of those grants went to 11 different projects in the USA & its affiliates.
