Six Important Reasons to Attend the 6C District and State Lions Conventions!

This year in my travels I have discovered that there are many Lions who have never attended a district or state convention. When I ask why they often mention that they think only district and state "leaders" attend and that they don't need to attend as they are only a "regular" Lion. The fact is that we are all Lions "leaders" and attendance at a district or state convention is important for all Lions. Here are six reasons to attend a district and/or state Lions convention.

Elections for your District Vice Governors and Governor take place along with Trustees and Directors for our statewide entities. Other ballot measures can include changes to our District or State Constitution and Bylaws. Each club has the opportunity to elect delegates to vote at these conventions and each club gets one vote for every ten club members (or fraction thereof). This is your club's opportunity to make your opinions known and have a voice in the district. Delegates must have paperwork from their club secretary certifying them as an official delegate. Please take the opportunity to talk about ballot measures and candidates at a club meeting before the convention to make sure that your club members voices are heard. As with voting in local and national elections your vote can make a difference!

District and State Conventions provide an opportunity to learn more about Lions efforts in your community as well as throughout the state and the world. Speakers at conventions can include our own Colorado entities, as well as speakers on focus areas for Lions Clubs International. Examples include information on diabetes, vision, disaster relief and more. At our upcoming multiple district (State) convention we will host Brian Sheehan, the candidate for Third Vice President for Lions Clubs International. What an opportunity to meet a future President of Lions Clubs International!

Conventions provide an opportunity to gather for fellowship with other Lions. These events are the perfect opportunity to meet with Lions that you don't see on a regular basis and get updates on how things are going. This is also a great place to share ideas regarding club projects, service opportunities and events. You can even steal (I mean borrow!) a few great ideas that would work well for your own club. No need to reinvent the wheel!

You can help build Lion leadership by inviting a new(er) club member to attend with you. You never know when a presentation or speaker at a convention will spark a new passion one of your club members. Conventions also provide new members with a look at what happens at the district or state level. This can often spark an interest in stepping up to additional leadership opportunities that are available at the district or multiple district level. This allows us to identify potential candidates for future leadership positions.

Conventions are also a great place to say **THANK YOU!** We all know that service in our communities doesn't happen without a lot of work on the part of Lions. The district and state conventions are a wonderful opportunity to recognize the incredible work that Lions and Clubs have done throughout the year. **EVERY Lion** deserves to be recognized for their efforts and we want you to come so we can celebrate that.

Colorado Lions KidSight Program March 2018



KidSight Screening - We have definitely been busy with screening! 44,456 children have been screened and 4,428 children referred, a 10% rate of referral. Screening is ongoing in all districts. We have screened about 3,000 fewer children than last year at this time.

In District 6C 27,078 children have been screened and 2,758 referred for a 10.2 percent rate of referral.

Two Positions Open for KidSight Colorado Board of Trustees Two KidSight Trustee positions are open in District 6C. These new KidSight Trustees will begin their terms in July 2018. Terms for these positions are two or three years.
