

Hello, 6C Lions!

I'm proud to be your District Governor for 2017-18 and look forward to a productive year. I've just returned from a DG-Elect Training Session and the Centennial Convention in Chicago, refreshingly motivated and even a bit inspired by the experience.

First, let me tell you a little about the Convention. Overall, I was pleasingly overwhelmed. I was inspired and encouraged to do a lot of self-reflection and should become a better District Governor as a result.

Our training consisted of morning entertainment and motivational presentations by accomplished performers and speakers, followed by breakout classroom training sessions in the afternoon.

Two of the morning speakers stood out. Nick Vujicic founded Life Without Limbs. He has no arms or legs. He taught me not to *expect* things to ease up once you've reached a goal; your status as an achiever merely brings on new challenges and concomitant emotional stress, so don't get stressed out about the constant presence of stress in your life. Just the opposite: embrace it as a sign that you're doing your utmost. Sister BK Shivani taught us how not to let negativity slow you down: the way to combat the "emotional terror" that you must deal with is to consider yourself as "royalty," not to be bothered by those from the rabble trying to drag you down for the wrong reasons. Her tranquility was impressive ... the quieter she became the more she had the audience in the palm of her hands.

At the classroom sessions I was fortunate to meet DGs from Bulgaria, Israel, Russia, New Zealand and many other locales. Lions focuses on leadership, and I received among other things an assessment of whether I tended to lead from Heart, Mind or Gut. (Maybe you're interested in the results. My preferred style was Gut, but Head and Heart were a close second.) In actuality, my ability to "lead by example" and "raise tough issues" was rated as good. But my ability to empathize and "think like a potential member" was a most significant shortcoming, so I'll need to work on this.

I learned the importance of soliciting feedback from 6C's leadership team of Officers and Zone Chairpersons (Rick, Holly, Barb, Nancy, Stokes, John and Willa) and encouraging them to find better ways for us to pursue 6C's stated goals. And I learned the importance of delegating responsibility, which is why we have so many different Committee Chairpersons in the areas of Public Relations, Global Membership and Leadership and now Service, LCIF Coordination and a whole host of other functions that 6C carries out. There is just too much stuff to do, and it requires help in each of these areas.

Inspiration was easy to come by. As to 6C's goal to charter new Clubs, the Districts from Asia and California were remarkable. In Asia, one District has already this year chartered 29 new Clubs! And in California, MD4 added 1,000 members last year!

Different forms of well-developed service activities were highlighted. But I concluded that this doesn't necessarily mean that we need to expand our service reach horizontally to find new ones; maybe it's just as well that we focus on the vertical - improving the ones that we currently consider *Signature* and working to improve those. Finally, I discovered that many Districts around the world pay more attention to their Leos than we do; it's common sense ... Leos are our future.

On a social note, Susy and I were pleased to connect with Nepalis Sunit Shrestha and Krishna Sharma from our twinned Clubs Kathmandu and Ecuadorean Nicolas Orellana, whom we met twice on our eyesight campaigns in Ecuador. Nicolas was elected an International Director for 2017-18.

Two new Service Areas were added to Youth, Hunger, Sight and Environment: Diabetes (knew this one was coming) and Pediatric Cancer (didn't see this coming). Children with cancer can evoke some of our strongest emotions. Some of you may see fit to place these two new Service Areas in the spectrum of service that you perform. Maybe there's even a way to create a Club to highlight and provide service for pediatric cancer. Is anyone interested in doing a *Community Needs Assessment* on this, say, at Children's Hospital on the medical campus in Aurora??? If so, please let me know - I'm all ears!

I heard American Idol's David Archuleta sing John Lennon's *Imagine*. The timing was just right, and I took to heart its message: "You may say that I'm a dreamer, but I'm not the only one." In a way, all of us Lions are dreamers, hoping to make the world a better place through our service.

We were introduced to MyLion, LCI's endeavor to customize social media to its own purposes. It's forward-thinking to believe that within the new software Lions will better be able to communicate as they create and implement their service projects.

Finally, I was exposed to numerous guiding aphorisms and mots, but the best was: "Great people do not make great journeys, but great journeys make great people." LCI President Naresh Aggarwal's message is the *Power of We: We must take Action in order to Serve*. There simply couldn't be a better call to *Action* than the quote above.

Onward and upward: let's make 2017-18 a productive year! What do you think?

Another year has passed, and a new one is just beginning! It never ceases to amaze me how fast the days whirl by and I am soon looking at yesterday, last month and last year. (Maybe the two snows we had in May helped confuse my mind...) In any case, it is always a good day to be a Lion in District 6C, as well as in Colorado and the world.

The service that Lions provide is not only incredible, it is in great demand, and is critical to the health and well-being of people everywhere! As of the date of this article (June 25, 2017), our district has reported 1,240 activities encompassing 18,685 Lion hours, serving 93,482 people with 740 participants, collected 38,811 pairs of eyeglasses, planted 273 trees, raised \$64,618 and donated \$97,500. OUTSTANDING! Here is the scary part... many clubs are not reporting everything they do, and twenty percent of our clubs have not reported their ANY activities! Our numbers are even greater than what is shown! The Lions of MD 6C truly live our motto, "WE SERVE," to its fullest. For every participant in a Lions activity, "WE SERVE" 126 people in our community!

For those who cringe when membership is discussed, there is a reason to re-evaluate. Run the numbers...just imagine what we can do. The district has a population in the range of 3,000,000. I KNOW we do more than we report, and when we induct a new member, we will impact 120 or more people in our community. This is when membership is so important. There may be some organizational reasons, too, however it is the people "**WE SERVE**" that matter the most. Add one, help 120 people. Lose one, 120 people don't get the help they need. It is simple.

Focus and passion are the crucial ingredients in any task or activity in which we engage. And, no task is too small or simple for which to use that focus and passion. When we act with focus and passion, better results are more likely, enthusiasm is generated, and people will be energized. That elevator speech that our Immediate Past District Governor, Lion Jack Russalesi, mentioned in June's Newsletter is not simply about more members. It is about the compassion for our fellow citizens. It is about giving back to our communities. Those reports that Secretaries submit, they are about sharing the great things that each club is doing. Each new member is 120 people receiving some kind of assistance they otherwise might not receive.

Liberty, Intelligence, Our Nations Safety. LIONS. We have the freedom to help others. We have the mindset, desire, focus and passion to use our intelligence for our communities. The safety of nations, throughout the world, are provided by Loving Individuals Offering Needed Service. LIONS. WE SERVE! Yesterday is a cancelled check. Tomorrow is a promissory note. The Latest Screening Results

Since July 1, 2016 we have screened more than 53,841 children statewide and referred 6,020. The rate of referral is 11.2 percent. In 6C 32,304 children were screened and 3,954 referred for a rate of referral of 12.2 percent. Great Work! I will publish the final numbers for the year in the August newsletter.

So how can I serve our 1.4 million Lions? I cannot give everyone senior positions. I cannot give you money. I cannot meet all of you. However, I plan to touch all of your lives with the power to serve.

So let's examine every stage of one's Lionistic career and how I can help. The first stage is becoming a new member. When I became a new member 43 years ago, I suddenly felt as if I had left my hometown and become a man of the world. This year, I want every member to download our new mobile app. This will connect all our members on one global platform.

The next stage is beginning to serve. As a member of the Batala Smile Lions Club in Punjab, India, I was proud of how the community began to respect me. This respect depended on the number of people I served and how many people were aware of this service. We now have a new Global Service Team. Your District GST leader will identify projects that serve the maximum number of people per dollar and per hour. They will also train Lions on how to convert a normal project into a Legacy Project via Lions branding and public relations.

The third stage is aspiring for leadership. While I enjoyed rising up the Lions' ladder, I sometimes wished that our leaders focused more on work than on long speeches. A new awards system will incentivize the efforts of Lion leaders in the right direction. We plan to reward retention of members, hence keeping the focus on you—our existing members. New awards will also be given for involving over half the club in service and for creating the most Legacy projects.

As a global leader of Lionism, I want to keep every Lion connected to Lionism. Our new Welcome Home program is an international online club for members unable to attend club meetings. Meetings and fee payments are conducted entirely online.

The last stage is now. I want to give every Lion the same goal for the next 12 months. My dream is that every Lion will serve 10 people each month. If this happens, we will serve 170 million people this year— a big increase from our current level of 100 million and a big step toward our goal of serving 200 million annually by 2020. This is the focus of all my meetings around the world.
