

How's It going? I'm getting this question asked of me a lot. In responding to it I'm working off the principle that just talking constantly about something is motivation to get it done. Here are a couple of examples.

New Clubs. I'm told that Denver has about 30,000 Ethiopians and 10,000 Eritreans in it greater Metro area. Mel Tewahade in the Denver Lions Club has been interested in having Lions sponsor an eyesight campaign in Africa. Now, he and I have begun putting the pieces together to form an ethnic Club with that purpose in mind. Many of his connections are community leaders from the religious and business communities with followers who would form the catalyst for this Club. Our next step will be to have an organizational meeting to elect the leaders for the new Club and to begin to collect the funds required to charter the Club. Maybe we'll begin with a campaign here in Denver and shoot for a time in 2018 to carry the work overseas. We'll of course need to connect ahead of time with Lions Clubs in Ethiopia to organize things - find a place suitable for our work, recruit enough people from the needy people there to make the campaign a fruitful one and find eye doctors there to help with the work as well as do follow up. We'll need help from 6C Clubs and their members - volunteers who can commit to the time required.

Diabetes. LCI is placing increased focus this year on the diabetes epidemic here in the US and also worldwide. Diabetes and Pediatric Cancer have recently been added to three other service areas - Sight, Environment and Hunger - already designated by LCI as essential areas for Lions service. Rocky Mountain Cyber Lion Janice Davis has been the District Diabetes Awareness Chair, so it made sense to listen to her ideas about working with the American Diabetes Association here to reach out in the Denver Metro area and increase public awareness of this problem. She's put together a *Strides* event on Saturday, November 18, for District 6C to rally around and provide support to. The event will have a fund-raising goal of \$10,000 to be met, hopefully, by participants who will each walk 5K during the event. Our hope is to make this an annual thing, and it'll be a great way also to get the Lions Club brand out. Please save the date - Saturday, November 18. More details to come.

Call to Action. Please do me a favor. Start talking about these two things yourselves. Ask other Lions you know what they know about them and what they think about helping out to get them done. Thanks.

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Signing up with Twitter

To create an account on the web:

- 1. Go to http://twitter.com and find the sign up box, or go directly to https://twitter.com/signup.
- 2. Enter your full name, phone number, and a password.
- 3. Click Sign up for Twitter.
- 4. In order to verify your phone number, we will send you an SMS text message with a code. Enter the verification code in the box provided. Learn more about having a phone number associated with your account here.
- 5. Once you've clicked **Sign up for Twitter**, you can select a **username** (usernames are unique identifiers on Twitter) type your own or choose one we've suggested. We'll tell you if the username you want is available.
- 6. **Double-check** your name, phone number, password, and username.
- 7. Click Create my account. You may be asked to complete a Captcha to let us know that you're human.

Note: if you'd like to sign up with Twitter using an email address, you can do so via the "Use email instead" link at the bottom of the sign up page.


