LION DISTRICT 2-S3 Fourth Cabinet Meeting New Braunfels, TX May 1, 2015

The Fourth Cabinet Meeting was called to order at 4:33 p. m. by Governor Len Heimer with 30 Lions in attendance.

Lion Mike Smetanka, President of the New Braunfels Lions Club, welcomed everyone to New Braunfels.

Lion John Pruett, with the Milano Evening Lions Club, gave the invocation. Second Vice District Governor John Lyon led the pledges.

Governor Heimer appointed PDG J. P. Kirksey as the Parliamentarian.

Governor Len mentioned that a Birthday Card is being circulated for PCC Lin Rose who is having his 90th Birthday. He also mentioned that tomorrow another card will be circulated for a Get Well Greeting since PCC Lin is in the hospital.

The Governor welcomed PID Dr. Gary Anderson and his wife Cheryl who will be our guest for the weekend.

Cabinet Secretary Lion Nancy Handrick was called upon to present the Mid-Winter Conference and Third Cabinet Meeting Minutes. The minutes were approved as posted.

Cabinet Treasurer Lion Forrest McGlothlin – Mentioned that there is \$11,359 in the operating account and there are a few more things to spend and then drop monies into various accounts at year end. Dues are coming in pretty good but still have some outstanding clubs. Net income is \$16,093. Mentioned there are 43 clubs who are 100%. Copy of the report is attached. (Attachment A)

PDG Frank Kinald gave the Charities Budget Report – PDG Frank reviewed the attached District 2-S3 Charities Budget for Lion Maureen Kinald who was ill. (Attachment B)

Emergency Account Report by PDG Angie Nicholson – As of the end of March we have in the International Convention funds \$24,097.27 funds and the Contingency Fund which was called the Emergency Funds \$18,449.86 in the State Convention Fund we have \$10,779.36 and in the District Convention Fund we have \$6,626.21 and the Youth Opportunities \$9,735.12 for a total of \$69,687.82. (Attachment C).

Committee Reports:

Youth Camp and Exchange Program – Lion Bill Hull – Lion Bill gave an update of the Youth Exchange Program and submitted the following written report.

This has been a busy year regarding Youth Exchange for our district. Below is activity by Club:

Wimberley Club: Outbound activity – This club set a record for sponsoring outbound students. The club will send eight students to Europe this summer and one additional (New Zealand) in

January, 2016. The countries in Europe receiving our students this summer are Italy (3), Austria, Finland, Denmark, Turkey and Hungary. The club will fund five of the students. The additional four are self-funded.

Inbound activity – In November/December, 2014, the club received an Australian youth who was hosted for five weeks by a student who was an outbound youth in summer '14.

The club has agreed to host 30 students in mid-July for four days. These youth will travel from the Julian Hyer Camp in North Texas to experience Austin, San Antonio, San Marcos and surrounding areas.

University of Texas Club: Outbound activity – The club is sponsoring one of its members to a camp in Hungary. The student/member is funding her trip.

Lion Bill would also be willing to come to your club and give a presentation on the Youth Camp and Exchange Program.

Second Vice District Governor John Lyon – VDG John said he wanted say some kudos and thank yous. He mentioned that he recently attended the Charter of the new Lions at Texas State and wanted to thank PDG J. P. Kirksey and PDG Shirley Dillman and the Guiding Lions Leonor Marques and Lion Tommy Cowan. Kudos for the sponsor Club for the Mid-Winter. He also mentioned that he will miss Lion Kurt who took him under his wings and is truly a nice gentleman. He will be missed next year.

Governor Len mentioned that Lion Kurt has had to step down in running for Governor due to the illness of his wife Lion Faye. We truly respect his decision to put his family first.

PDG Gary Cocanougher – PDG Gary mentioned that the PDG Committee met which consists of PDG J. P. Kirksey, PDG Frank Kinald and PDG Gary who serves as the Chair of that Committee. PDG Gary made a motion to transfer \$2,500 out of the International Fund to the General Fund and to disperse checks for \$2,000 payable to District Governor Heimer and \$500 payable to District Governor Elect Michael Smith. These funds will help defer their expenses for the International Convention travel. Motion was second and motion passed.

Global Membership Team Leader - PDG Shirley Dillman - PDG Shirley mentioned that last year we were at 1,944 as of July 1 and this year we are at 2,034 members. At the Texas State Charter there were 4 more students that stated they wanted to join and in Kyle she stated that they have 16 members who have paid.

PDG Shirley also reviewed the 100th Centennial Membership Program which is coming up. It is an incentive to bring in new members and the member who brings in the new member will get a Centennial pin and the club will get a banner patch. If you keep the member in for one year you get another award and if you keep them in for longer one year and one day you get a higher level of recognition.

PDG Shirley mentioned that she also has a goal to reduce the drop-out rate. By reducing that our membership numbers will come up.

KidVision – Lion Karen Walker Ratcliffe – Mentioned that in 15 months that the District screened 6,000 kids and this month that we screened another 654 kids with a 12 percent referral rate. Currently we have 9 units in Dripping Springs, Round Rock/Hutto, Lago Vista/

Point Venture, Austin Downtown, Buda, Cameron, San Marcos, Bastrop, and the District has a unit and Wimberley's is on hold until we get the grant and Georgetown is also getting a unit. The reason they belong to the District is because of the 501C-3 Charities is under the Charities Committee and these units can be purchased without sales tax and also the insurance is purchased by the Committee.

District Leo Report – Lion Liz Bumguardner - Lion Liz mentioned that currently the District has 25 active Leo Clubs that are registered with International and that means that we have a little over 1,000 Leos in our District. Some are now doing the Leo to Lion transition and they get reduced dues.

Youth Contest – PDG Larry Nicholson – Mentioned that our two youth contest winners are Leos from Point Venture and Lago Vista and they are both State Officers. The point is that there are 25 Leo Clubs in the District and the District should have at least 25 entries in the Youth Contests. These two ladies will be competing in all three contests. They are excited about going to the State Convention and participate in these contests.

Lone Star Lions Eye Bank – Lion Mike Jackson – Lion Mike will be the President of the Lone Star Lions Eye Bank next year. Lion Mike stated that the Executive Committee and the Finance Committee just finished the budget for next year and it will be just over \$1.9 million. Mentioned that the Eye Bank has good personnel right now and the Executive Director is doing a good job in developing people that work for him. They just fully updated their automated system.

Zone Chair – Lion John Pruett – Lion John stated that it has been great serving a Zone Chair this year and in District Governor Len's Cabinet. He enjoyed the clubs in his zone. His last Zone Meeting was March 9 and end of the year issues were discussed. Buckholts is still busy with their reading action program. Milano finished the Club Excellence Process and came up with three very good ideas and he does not believe that they could have come up with these ideas without going through the Process. It is certainly a way to serve more people and increase membership.

District Governor Len mentioned that Lion John Pruett has been recognized for two quarters for Zone Chair recognition and will be submitted for the third quarter also. Zone Chair John has done a terrific job as Zone Chair.

District Governor Len mentioned that there are still some line items in the budget that have not been dispersed for this year. Another item is the Membership Grant. MD-2 this year put aside \$2,500 for every district to request to help build membership since the 7 point membership plan was developed. We have submitted our request for the \$2,500 and have been approved. Some of that money is still available. Submit your receipts to Lion Forrest to get reimbursement.

The District Governor then reviewed the slate of candidates for the District Convention elections.

The Cabinet meeting was adjourned at 5:55 p.m.

Environmental Report – PDG Gil Burrell – Lion Joan Smith has won the state entry and will compete at the International Convention.

Alert – PDG Mike Smith – There has been no reported emergency that needed to use our disaster relief fund, knock on wood, all year. There are some clubs that will take on as a service project alert this coming year. Look forward to seeing those club plans.

Newswire – PDG Mike Smith – This method of communication by email to the leadership in the District has and will remain a valuable tool in disseminating information District wide. The incoming cabinet has been inputted along with a breakout for the Zone Chairs for 2015-2016.

District 2-S3 Global Membership Team Coordinator - PDG Shirley Dillman -

+70 Members - Beginning membership on July 1, 2014 showed 1944 members. As of April 27, 2015 our District has a net increase of 70, or 2034.

Men/Women - .552/448%

Lions Club at Texas State - 28 members as of 4-27-15 - It is exciting to note that a Lions Club at Texas State University in San Marcos was chartered March 9, 2015 with 22 students and 1 Lion campus advisor. San Marcos Lions are the proud sponsor and Lions Tommy Cowan and Leonor Marques are the experienced Guiding Lions. Eighty-eight Lions and Charter member's families attended the Charter Celebration April 17, 2015 with PID Joe Al Picone as the outstanding International guest speaker. Additional students as well as parents of students strongly indicated they wished to join various Clubs within our District. One student family member from Blinn transferred to Texas State Lions Club.

Goals - A Kyle Lions Club has 19 paid Charter members as of April 21, 2015. Buda Lions Club is the proud sponsor and Lions Charles and Nancy Handrick will be the Guiding Lions. Charter by 5-5-15

PDG Michael Smith and I have met to establish goals for our 2015-2016 Lionistic Year. Lion Michael wants one new Lions Club Chartered for each quarter (locations not fully determined with sponsoring clubs nor Guiding Lions.

PDG Shirley has added a goal to reduce dropped members by 10% for next fiscal year with the assistance of Zone Chairs, PDG's, more exit interviews, and increasing orientation and mentoring of new members.

Youth Contest Chair Report – PDG Larry Nicholson - The youth contests were held during the Mid-winter Conference at Wimberley on Saturday January 17. The contest is open to high school juniors and seniors and results in financial awards for college expenses. Our district awards \$500.00 to each contest winner, and \$250.00 to second place. Contest winners compete at the MD-2 contest for \$3000.00/\$1000.00 in scholarship money.

Lily and Emily are entered in the MD-2 contests at the MD-2 Convention in College Station on May 23, 2015. They have both told me they are looking forward to the competition. Hopefully, we have another winner, but no matter the outcome they will benefit from participating, and they will represent us well.

Peace Poster Report - PDG Angela Nicholson - It is time again for thinking about next year's Peace Poster contest. You are able to order the kits for next year's contest, with a theme of "Share Peace." At this convention, I will be showing a power point presentation of the International winners of this past year's contest. Sharing this with your art teachers or leaders will help the students learn what type of poster is required to win. Each club chairperson should review the rules of the contest and use these guidelines for judging your local contest. In the past few years, we have had to disqualify posters because of words on the poster, age of the student, and size of the poster. Honoring the student with an award will motivate them to submitting better posters. I would like to see as many clubs as possible to participate in the contest for next year. You may have more than one entry, if your school district has more middle schools or if you have a contest in a youth club. You must have a kit for each contest your club sponsors. Your club's winning poster or posters must be to the governor or myself no later than November 15, 2015.

District 2-S3 Leo Report - Lion Liz Bumguardner, District Leo Chair - The current number of Leo Clubs registered at International for the district is 25 serving around 1000 Leos. Two new clubs were chartered this year, Canyon Lake High School Leo Club (11/26/14) sponsored by Canyon Lake Lions Club and Samuel Clemens High School Leo (10/02/14) sponsored by the Schertz-Cibilo Lions Club. There are a couple of clubs that are in the formation stage and hope to send in their charter by the end of the Year. The District Leo Cabinet was made up of Leos from the Lago Vista Community Leo Club. The District officers were: Leo Madeline Ambrose, President; Leo Emily Moseley, 1st Vice President; Leo Cheyenne Saldana; 2nd Vice President; Leo Lily Jameson, Secretary and Leo Jocelynn McCaleb, Treasurer. The Leo Cabinet met in July to plan activities and held three leadership/sharing workshops in the district. The first was in Hutto at the October Lions Club Cabinet meeting, the second in February was in Austin at the

Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired, and the third was in New Braunfels in April. The District Leo Officers as well as those who attended the workshops enjoyed the time spent together as Leos. Each workshop focused on a community service project which got the group involved and eager to share project ideas, successes and concerns. The plan is to continue this type of Leo Activity this next year and the hope is to attract more clubs to the workshops. The District Cabinet officers did an outstanding job this year. Since the district is so strong in the number of Leo Clubs (we have the greatest number of Leo clubs than any other district) the focus for next year will be to improve the record keeping and public relations and to get the clubs registered quickly. The clubs need to write up their activities for the district newsletter on a regular basis. They are all working very hard but only their sponsoring Lions Clubs are aware of all that they do.

The District was also fortunate to be represented at the Texas Leo Council which serves all Leo Clubs in the multiple district. Leo Emily Moseley is President and Leo Lily Jameson is the Secretary. Our district representatives on the Texas Leo Council Board of Directors are: Leo Liliana Haus, New Braunfels HS Leo Club, Leo Jocelynn McCaleb, Lago Vista Leo Club and Ashley Seib, Lago Vista Leo Club. They all did a fantastic job this year leading the Leo Council and developing strong leadership skills. Leo Emily and Leo Lily are also representing the district in the MD Youth Opportunities Contests. We have three candidates from the district that are running for Texas Leo Council office. Leo Lily, Cheyenne wish to continue participation at the state level and Lindsay Hickman from Lago Vista is also running. In order for the Leo Clubs to vote, they need to be current on their dues. We still have eight clubs that are delinquent with dues.

The Texas Leo Council is sponsoring the Leo Awards Program in College Station on Saturday, May 23, 2015. An invitation was sent to all Leo Clubs in the multiple district but a lot of the emails were blocked. I am attaching the invitation to this report to be sure that those interested can make arrangements to attend. We meet from 10:00 to 3:00 at College Station High School. The clubs in our district could easily travel to and from the program the same day. It is important that current contact information be forwarded to me so that I can be sure that the advisors (Lions and faculty) and the sponsoring Lions clubs are aware of activities on the district and state level. I am also available to work with Leo clubs that are having issues or concerns, just give me a call or send an email and we can work together to resolve the issue or concern. Any interested Leo who wants to run for a district office can contact me and we will work it out. It would be great if there were representation at the district level from a majority of the clubs.

Keep up the good work -- Leo Clubs. We are all very proud of the work you do.

Zone 1-B – Lion Tommy Cowan, Zone Chair – Club officers and members met on April 16, 2015 at the ADFLC Club meeting room at The High Road on Dawson (Austin) for the spring meeting, hosted by Zone 1B Chair Tommy Cowan who provided a spaghetti supper. Zone 1B clubs represented were UT, West Austin, South Austin and Austin Downtown founder. Guests included GMT PDG Shirley Dillman, GLT PDG J. P. Kirksey, PDG Ray Tremblay from British Columbia.

Reports from clubs included status of membership and service projects.

UT Club president-elect Darren Tan and secretary Griffin Kubik discussed fluctuating of club membership which varies widely in attendance because of graduation, but recruiting is working better (currently in 3rd year), but recruiting is up. Projects since last October Zone meeting include adoption of Bartholomew Creek for cleanup, tree planting with the Tree Folks who recognized the UT club as Volunteer Organization of the Year. The UT club is interested in developing their own regular vision screening program next year. In addition, UT is interested in developing their own signature event that would combine all of the Austin area lions clubs. An additional report was received from President Susie Mayo-Mayes of the Capitol City Club who reported that their service projects since October have included regular weekly volunteering with Meals on Wheels, Hermitage Park Nursing Home and Norman Elementary School library.

March - In memory of Lion Sol Fuss, CLNL made a \$500.00 donation to the Texas Lions Camp Silver Leaf Endowment. During March, CLNL pledged \$100.00 for our two local Leo Clubs to participate in the annual Crop Walk across Canyon Lake Dam. Eight Lions participated in the can collection on March 13th which yielded nearly 1,000 pounds of cans for a profit of \$939.60.


