Thus, our new strategic plan, LCI Forward, has designed the Global Action Team (GAT) to strengthen and lead the way. The GAT brings together the Global Membership Team (GMT), the Global Leadership Team (GLT) with

the newly formed Globai Team (GST) to cre ate a unified ap-rech to fulfilling Global Service



The Global Action Team positions, GAT, GMT, GLT, and GST are filled with Lions from the International Chairs, to the Area Leaders, to the Multiple Districts, to the Districts, to the Clubs. Being club focused, the Club President is the GAT, club has a GMT and each (Membership Chairperson), GLT (1st Vice President), and GST (Service Chairperson) working together to form the GAT team. The entire approach puts the club at the center of action.

The Club Service Chairperson (GST) helps the club identify resources and best practices to improve service projects and community impact. The club GST has support from the District GST. Serving together with the club GMT and GLT creates a powerful team, bringing a whole-club approach to service that can energize the club. The goal of LCI is to serve 200 million lives, to increase our membership to 1.7 million Lions and Leos, by the year 2020. To reach these goals will require the type of integrated effort as defined by the Global Action Team.



1. The annual **Environmental Photo Contest** that LCI hosted is no more; unfortunately. However, since our District over the past several years has been participating with increased entries, I would like District 2-S3 to host our own photo contest for our clubs. The same rules and themes will apply, Animal Life, Weather Phenomenon, Landscape and Plant Life. Entry forms are available in this District Newsletter and on the website. The deadline will remain as December 1st, 2017. The winner will be announced at the District 2-S3 Mid-Winter Conference on January 13th, 2018 at New Braunfels. Entries will go no further.

2. Getting the Word out to your Clubs. The Environmental portion is one of the Centennial Award Patch requirements. Since we serve our communities in the Great State of Texas, let's continue the theme "Don't Mess With Texas".

3. **Report your results using MyLCI.** Be sure and check the Environmental Centennial Challenge box. Your club needs just one environmental project reported before June 30th, 2018. Two years ago we had 23 Lions Clubs (43%) from our District that submitted Environmental Service Reports; during the 2016-2017 term, we had 18 Clubs (35%) submit projects. Please track your "Environmental" service projects and hours, turn that report in to your Club Secretary. Club Presidents, please login to MyLCI from time-totime and monitor that your club is getting credit with LCI for your efforts, "We Do Make a Difference!" Have a GREAT year.

This summer, Texas Lions Camp served 1,506 special needs children! It's terrific that so many Texas children benefitted from the awesome Texas Lions Camp experience. I encourage every Lion who sponsored a camper to follow-up with that child and his/her parent(s) and get their feedback on their week at camp. Even better, invite campers and their parents to attend a club meeting, and share that experience with club members.

South Austin Lions Club is hosting a pizza party for club member-sponsored campers and their families. That's a great way to extend the excitement of TLC for the campers, and to give Lions an opportunity to hear first-hand about the TLC experience from the perspective of children and parents.

The 24<sup>th</sup> Annual Texas Lions Camp Harry Wickersham Golf Tournament also was a big success, raising more than \$91,000 in funds to help operate the camp. Lions in District 2 S-3 provided \$2,700 in hole sponsorships, an increase of \$1,000 over the previous year. Congratulations!

# Earned Media Can Provide Visibility for Lions Clubs

As Lions Clubs International moves into its second century of service, a new strategic plan – LCI Forward – has been unveiled. One of its five strategic initiatives is

"reshaping public opinion and improving visibility." Public relations is the avenue to accomplish this goal, and earning media coverage is a key part of increasing visibility and shaping public opinion. As someone who has worked in this field for almost 40 years, I know that media relations is an important element in the communications tool box.

You may be familiar with the terms "earned media" and "paid media." Earned media is free publicity that is created by someone else and published somewhere other than a communications channel owned by you. For example, a news story on a local television station is earned media. If you pay for a listing in a newspaper's special section on summer camps, the ad is paid media.

When you publish something on your website, or send a message via blast e-mail to former donors, you are publishing your content on "owned" media which you control completely.

If you aren't already using earned media to promote your activities and services, I encourage you to use this valuable, free resource. Earned media typically has more credibility than self-published or paid media. Earned media includes newspaper articles, stories on television, mentions in social media such as blogs, and "shares" and "retweets." These external sources amplify your message and help disseminate it broadly. Each month, I will share some media relations tips via this column.

I also want to encourage you to create a **Public Relations Committee for your club**, even if it's only one person. It's important that this individual or group is kept informed about club activities well in advance of their occurrence. It takes time to develop media advisories to promote upcoming events, and to write and distribute news releases. Don't wait until a few days before the event to start thinking about publicity!

As I attended the First Cabinet Meeting in July in Manor, I heard many exciting plans for the year. While some are primarily of interest to Lions, others will be of interest to the community. I am a resource to help you and your club generate publicity locally and within our district. Working together, we can help raise the visibility of Lions Clubs International and ensure that the public is aware of our community service.






