Cinnamon Roasted Almonds

4 c (1 lb.) whole raw almonds 1/2 cup sugar 1 egg white 1/4 tsp salt 1/2 tsp cinnam

Preheat oven to 250 degrees. Lightly grease 10"x15" baking sheet. In medium bowl, lightly beat egg white. Add water & beat until frothv but not stiff. Add nuts & stir until well coated. In a small bowl mix sugar, salt, cinnamon & sprinkle over nuts. Toss to coat and pour onto prepared baking sheet. Bake 1 hour stirring occasionally. Let cool & store in airtight jar or bag. Freezes well. Chop & add to your salad.
