
rom the President's Desk

PROJECTS

1990: Launching Sight First

Through Sight First, Lions are restoring sight and preventing blindness on a global scale. Launched in 1990, Lions have raised more than \$346 million for this initiative. Sight First targets the major causes of blindness: cataract, trachoma, river blindness, childhood blindness, diabetic retinopathy and glaucoma.

Giving the Gift of Sight!

In 5 days alone, more than 6,500 men, women and children worldwide lose their sight to blindness, according to the World

Health Organization. More than 80% of those cases are preventable or reversible.

Lions Club of Harare West in conjunction with Eyes for Africa and Sekuru Kaguvi Clinic do one thing: Save Sight. The Lions Club of Harare West Sight First annual project is dedicated to providing excellent vision care to economically disadvantaged people in our community (undergoing eye surgery costs between US\$800 to US\$1500 at private hospitals and those that cannot afford, have to wait for their turn at Sekuru Kaguvi Eye Unit at Parirenyatwa Hospital). Our goal is to

eliminate preventable blindness and visual impairment by organising for the correction of blindness through cataract eye operations for the disadvantaged members of our society.

We work with a dedicated group of local ophthalmologists and optometrists who donate their time and expertise to help the economically disadvantaged in our community. Special mention goes to Dr A Kufa, Dr D Sibanda, Dr Guramatunhu and Dr C Kumora, doctors and nursing staff at Sekuru Kaguvi Parirenyatwa Eye Clinic.

Throughout the years, Lions Club of Harare West Sight First program has saved the sight of hundreds of people and improved vision care for thousands of people by providing cataract surgeries, screenings, medication, treatment and community education to prevent blindness.

Lions Club of Harare West facilitated 150 free eye cataract operations from August 22-26th

2011. The kits for this Eye Camp were sourced from Aurola, Madurai, India and fully funded by the Lions Club of Harare West through two fund raising dinners in April 2010 and February 2011.

The President and Members of the Lions Club of Harare West would like to express their sincere gratitude to individuals and organisation for their generous support towards our SIGHT First Project.
