Congratulations to District Governor Elect Wayne Benjamin and to First Vice District Governor Elect Mary Alice Carroll. On 1 July 2020, we will be putting the reins of District 22-B into good hands. I look forward to the next year and know that all of us will help our new officers to succeed and make District 22-B even better. Please read their acceptance speeches later in this newsletter.

Our Lions year suffered a serious slowdown in March with the onset of the coronavirus and the closing of many of our activities. Planned service projects and fundraisers had to be postponed or cancelled. Some of our charitable giving needed to be curtailed due to lack of funds. However, I am very proud of the ways the Lions of District 22-B found to be of service to those in need. This included making facemasks and face shields, shopping for shut-ins and elderly, staying in touch with neighbors and friends, and even in staying at home unless we really needed to get out. Of particular note is the food distribution operating out of Salisbury, covering 6 counties, and involving several Lions clubs. Please see the article about this project in this newsletter. As Lions we can continue to serve in this time of great need.

One thing that has been hindered during this crisis is the recruiting of new members and to date we are down 24 Lions in the District. However, several clubs have prospects waiting the in wings. Note that it is not necessary for a new member to attend a meeting before being voted on, but rather that the Board of Directors be satisfied that the prospect would be a good Lion. This could be accomplished by reputation or perhaps via a virtual on-line meeting. Let's get these new Lions signed up and ready to go as we get back to more normal times.

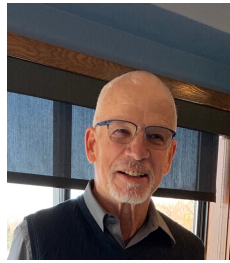

Acceptance Speech

District Governor Wayne D. Benjamin



Let me first thank Lion Glenn Owens and CT Dal Mann for nominating me for the position of DG of 22B for the year 2020/21. They are both most dedicated Lions Club members and I am honored and humbled to have them nominate me.

I do not have the experience of IPDG Wayne Cole or DG John Lawrence but I do have the passion to do an admirable job. My major emphasis this year will be to reverse the last forty years of Lion's declining membership in North America. In the last forty years because of decreased recruitment coupled with an increased yearly loss in membership we have gone from 635,000 members in USA and Canada down to 330,000 members? This is the year that LCI and 22B is going to reverse that trend! With the guidance of LCI's NAMI (North America Membership Initiative) this district is going to grow as an example to districts throughout North America. My NAMI Champion and I will work closely with all clubs to strengthen the product they give to their members. We want our clubs to be more relevant both in the service projects they provide, the organizations to which they give their money, as well as the fellowship they offer to their members. We will work particularly close with our Membership and Service Chairpersons to do exactly this. Lions will be asked to invite potential new members to service projects, fund raisers and meetings. I am encouraging 'new member meetings nights' in every club on a quarterly basis. We are all responsible for the declining membership numbers. We can all reverse the numbers but it will take a universal effort on everyone's part. Each Lion should set as his/her goal one new member for the year! We have 365 days to find at least one new member. Certainly this is not an unreasonable request. I will make visitations and we will talk about 'Just Ask', 'BluePrint for a Stronger Club' and 'Club Quality Initiative'. I encourage club presidents and vice presidents to review 'Your club, Your Way' and 'How are Your Ratings?' Having gotten new members, our membership committee will be sure to get the Lion involved in Lionism whether it be a service project or a fundraiser. We will end the 'swinging door' of getting new Lions but losing them soon after, due to disappointment in the product. Within a month's time all new members will have an orientation program either provided by their club or zone or district. Do not fret. If your club becomes too large, you will have the opportunity to divide your club into two or form a branch or specialty club! It can be done. I need you to commit to it. More hands allow us as Lions to provide greater service to our community and more funds to the needy. This is the challenge if Lions are going to remain the global leader in humanitarian service. Service is the end result. We need more members to get us there.



This is not in any way to lessen the importance of other cabinet or committee leaders. I will still look to you to provide the guidance in developing stronger clubs in your zone and fulfilling the committee roles which you are now leading. I look forward to working with each and every one of you to have a most successful year.

This looks to be a very different year. It is too early to give out definite plans for visitations and the like for this year. Whatever the case, however, this is the year to grow our district. I look forward to being the person who begins that process. I am proud to be elected DG because it represents a leader in the world's largest service organization. I am humbled because the opportunities to make a difference will not be easy. I am also enthused because we can make a difference if we all work together.

2027 International Convention

May 8, 2020

Dear Lions, Leo's and Lioness of District 22B:

On behalf of my Council of Governors, I am pleased to share with you great news for our organization of Lions; we now have the opportunity to host the 2027 International Convention in Washington, DC.

Going back to the start of my year, our Council met with the MD 22 International family for the purpose of discussing the opportunity for MD 22 to host a future International Convention. Our discussion consisted of understanding the role we would undertake throughout the convention—in both planning and actual event period—and support for all three components that make up the international convention:

1. International Board of Directors Meeting
2. District Governors-Elect (DGE) Seminar
3. International Convention

Our conclusion was to move forward with approval to the LCI Convention Division to send a Request for Proposal (RFP) to Destination DC, the official convention and visitor's bureau for Washington, DC. In addition, members of the International family and a PCC would interact with Destination DC during Phase I bidding.

In January, Destination DC coordinated a site inspection for the International Convention and invited LCI Board Member and Lions International Convention Division Staff to partake in tours and meetings with key elements including convention center, hotels, attractions/venues, and the parade route.

Shortly after the DC site inspection, LCI Convention staff qualified the DC bid, and presented it along with two other bidding cities to the International Board of Directors for review and approval by way of a virtual board meeting.

I am happy to tell you the great news that our Multiple District was selected to host the 2027 International Convention. This is a first for Washington, DC to share its city with Lions of the world.

I would be remiss if I did not ask for your help in the future to support the numerous committees, activities, and volunteer efforts within a planned schedule. With your help, we will show off our local Lions' hospitality to the many Lion member cultures.

Lions Clubs International FOUNDATION

I want to thank the individuals and clubs that have donated to LCIF. Last year we had only 70% of the clubs making donations to LCIF, the District would like to have 100% participation this year. So far this year we have 69% of the clubs that have made donations to LCIF, a little behind in participation and donations from last year. So, let's make up for it in the last quarter of the Lions year. If individuals of a club make donations, it can go toward an MJF or PMJF for them and their club gets credit. Some clubs have enough money donated to LCIF to qualify to name someone as a Melvin Jones Fellow or Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, please contact me if your club would like to know if your club qualifies. "Campaign 100" is in full swing and LCIF is requesting if your club chooses not be a model club then have your Club donate \$100.00 per member yearly for next 2-1/4 years. This donation can be through fundraisers, businesses, family members, friends or personal. Remember all donations can go towards a Melvin Jones Fellow for someone in your club, community or yourself. NOTE:

LCIF has approved 69 grants for \$3,559,090 for the full realm of our global service projects including our first grants for Hunger and Childhood Cancer. (This does not include the 218 COVID-19 LCIF Emergency Grants that total \$3.5M) That means we have spent over \$7M to fund grants, in the last two months. We need to replenish this money. **Remember donations are being accepted through LCIF's General Disaster Fund.**
