





March 1, 2021 - Speech and Hearing News

Recently, I came across an article by Joy Victory, managing editor, Healthy Hearing that I wish to share with the Lions of District 22-B.

Healthy Hearing: Face masks and other personal protective equipment (PPE) help protect us from the coronavirus, but they add communication challenges for everyone, especially people with hearing impairments. That's because:

- Face masks lower the volume of a person's speech and slightly garble it.
- Face shield, social distancing and plastic barriers further muffle or reduce sound.
- Face mask ear loops may tug on your hearing aids and cause problems.
- You can't rely on lip reading clues and other facial movements that help you understand speech and emotion.

Tips for how to communicate when wearing a mask

- Reduce the room's noise and get the person's attention.
- Ask if the person can hear you.
- Speak slowly and clearly. Do not Shout.
- Make sure hearing aid users are using them. You would be surprised how some folks forget to wear them just like when you forget to put your mask on when you get out of the car to go into a store.
- Take turns while speaking. Do not talk while walking or looking away.
- Do not talk while walking or looking away.
- if obtainable, clear or transparent masks can help with lip reading and emotions.
