DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE

"EXPERIENCE THE JOY OF SERVICE"

Many, many thanks to their leadership and the efforts of all the Lions of District 22-B for all that was accomplished in the last year.

My theme for the coming year is "Experience the Joy of Service". One of the best is the ALLI, Advanced Lions Leadership Institute, offered once each year in North America. This year it is coming up in November, but applications are due to LCI by August 26. This excellent training not only helps one become a better Lion, but also has applications in all areas of one's life. Topics include Managing Meetings, Conflict Resolution, Goal Setting, and more. It is available for Lions who have been a Club President, but not yet a First Vice District Governor. It would be great to have at least 2 Lions in our district apply. Another opportunity for training, fellowship, and inspiration is the USA/Canada Forum being held this year in Spokane, Washington in September. With over 70 seminar offerings on all sorts of topics, the biggest problem is deciding which seminars to attend. In addition, at each of the 4 provided meals there are motivational talks from some of the best speakers in the country. Here is an example of a workshop: Leadership without Authority: How to guide and motivate volunteers who don't have to say 'yes'. Again, please see the flier later in this newsletter and consider attending this great training.

For over three decades, Lions clubs around the globe have been sponsoring a very special art contest in schools and youth groups. Creating peace posters gives children everywhere the chance to express their visions of peace and inspire the world through art and creativity.

History has shown that all too often peace is not guaranteed. While this is unfortunate, it also allows us the powerful opportunity to figure out how to achieve peace, individually and in our communities. And who better to map out the "Journey of Peace" than our youth? That is the theme of this year's Lions Peace Poster contest. While many times our Peace Poster contests are held in the public schools, this is not a requirement. The contest rules state that the contest may be held in any youth group not sponsored by a Lions club. Thus, it may be held with a scout group, a Boys and Girls

Club, the YMCA, or a church youth group, for example.

Students ages 11, 12 or 13 as of November 15 are eligible to participate in the International Peace Poster Contest. October 1 is the deadline to purchase kits from the Club Supplies Sales Department at International Headquarters. November 15 is the deadline for a club to send one winning poster (per contest sponsored) to the district governor.

LCIF Report August 2019

The report I received from LCIF this Lions year the clubs in the District have donated a total of \$ 26,955.00. However, I have a total of \$28,280.00 because 2 clubs were omitted and last year donations were at \$29,728.00, just a little less than last year. Last year we had 31 clubs to make donations to LCIF and this year we had 37 clubs, that is 80%, I would still like to get to 100%. Remember the Clubs can use their donations to go toward naming a Melvin Jones Fellow, for someone in the club or anyone in the community. This year, LCIF has changed the Model Club requirements to \$ 500 per member instead of the \$750, giving more clubs a chance to become model clubs. Campaign 100 is asking all club members to try to donate \$100 per year for the next 3 years or have your clubs make donations to total that for their membership. All clubs have a LCIF Coordinator and I will be in contact with them. IPDG Wayne has volunteered to also be a coordinator for the District, so if you have any questions about LCIF or need assistance filling out the donation form or want to be a model club, please contact us.

22-B Charitable Foundation Exists

Yes, 22-B does have a Charitable Foundation. It provides funds to clubs, a collection of clubs, or zones to help with community projects when extra funds are needed. The Foundation will provide up to 50% of the cost of a project which includes Lions active involvement. As an example, the Kent Island and Queenstown Lions Clubs recently received a grant for \$500 for a community youth project in Queen Anne's County.

There are two ways you can help with the Foundation. First, apply for a grant to help with your Lions project. Consider a Lions Legacy Project to help celebrate our 100 years as Lions. Funds are available. The application form for grants can be found in this newsletter.

The other way to help is by donating to the Foundation. A good way to do this is by recognizing a Lion or a community leader with a Darley Travers Fellowship. They come in four levels: Basic Pin at \$100, Sapphire Pin at \$250, Ruby Pin at \$500, and Diamond Pin at \$1000. The Diamond level also includes a distinctive plaque. The required donation for the pins is cumulative. For example, a recipient of a Basic Pin may upgrade to Sapphire for an additional \$150. To date, we have awarded 70 Basic Pins, 6 Sapphire Pins, 1 Ruby Pin, and 16 Diamond Pins. Any club will also receive special recognition when they become a 100% Darley Travers Fellow club. Thus far, Salisbury Metro Lions Club has received this distinction.

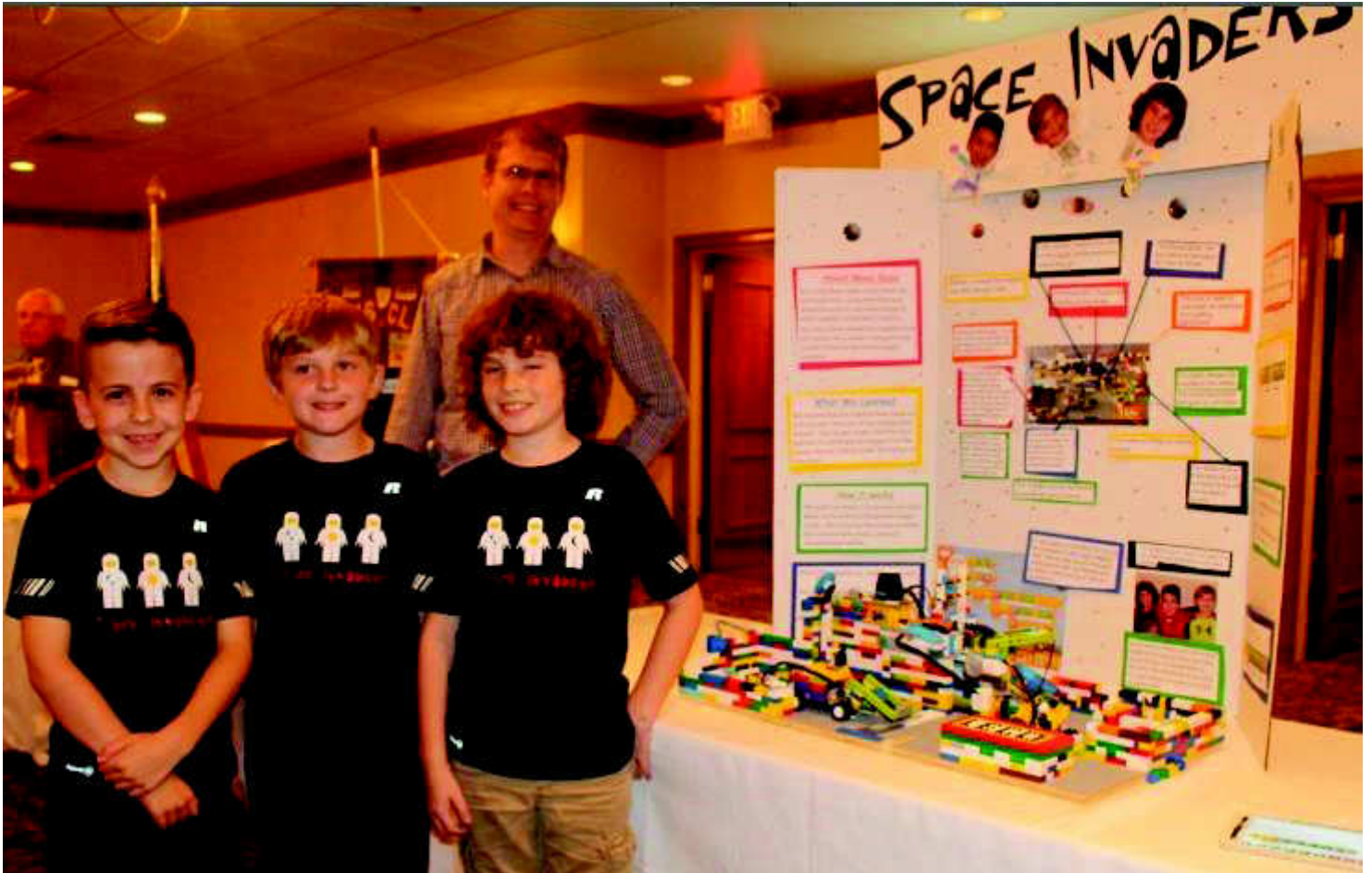

Location: Houston, TX, USA

Dates: January 18-20, 2020

Application Due Date: November 4, 2019

Applicants: Lions from Constitutional Area I & II - United States of America, Its Affiliates, Bermuda & The Bahamas & Canada

Languages Offered: English

Purpose of the Faculty Development Institute (FDI):

To enhance training delivery skills and training techniques that will increase the quality of training and overall effectiveness of Lions leadership development programs.

Participant Qualifications:

1. **Applicants should have experience serving as instructors for Lions training events.** This experience should include using PowerPoint to support training delivery. (Note: Participants will not be expected to create any materials while at the FDI, but it will be necessary to use PowerPoint and other provided materials for some activities.)
2. Applicants must be willing to commit to a three-day institute, including classroom sessions and meals, and understand that personal time is extremely limited. **Attendance at all classroom sessions and scheduled meals is mandatory.**
3. Lions participating in this three-day course will be required to conduct a local training event within six months of the institute, in order to complete the FDI.
4. Applicants must be capable of understanding and participating in at least one of the offered languages of instruction at this institute.

Cost of the Institute:

Lions Clubs International will provide meals and lodging according to the schedule of the institute. Please note a non-refundable fee of **US\$150.00** is required for participation in this training event. Please do not send fees until you receive a letter of acceptance to the institute. Participants are also responsible for their own transportation and related travel expenses to and from the institute site.

Selection Process:

Because of the high number of applications received, acceptance into the institute is not guaranteed. Qualified district governors will be considered for participation in a Faculty Development Institute only if space is available. **All applicants will be notified of selection status no more than three weeks after the application due date via the email address provided on the application form.**

The Leadership Development Division of Lions Clubs International reserves the right to cancel any institute or language-specific classroom due to insufficient applications submitted by the stated application due date.

Expectations of Lions Who Complete the FDI:

1. Serve as a leadership resource and pursue additional leadership and training roles and responsibilities in their respective zones, regions, districts, and multiple districts.
2. Share their institute experiences with members of their zones, regions, districts, multiple districts, and constitutional areas, and encourage other qualified Lions to apply to the institutes.
3. Utilize your newly acquired skill set to facilitate future Lions Leadership Development events.

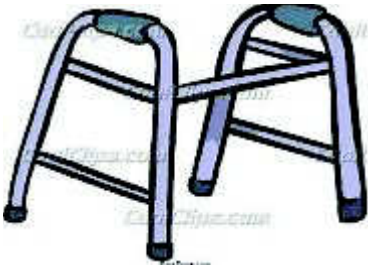
