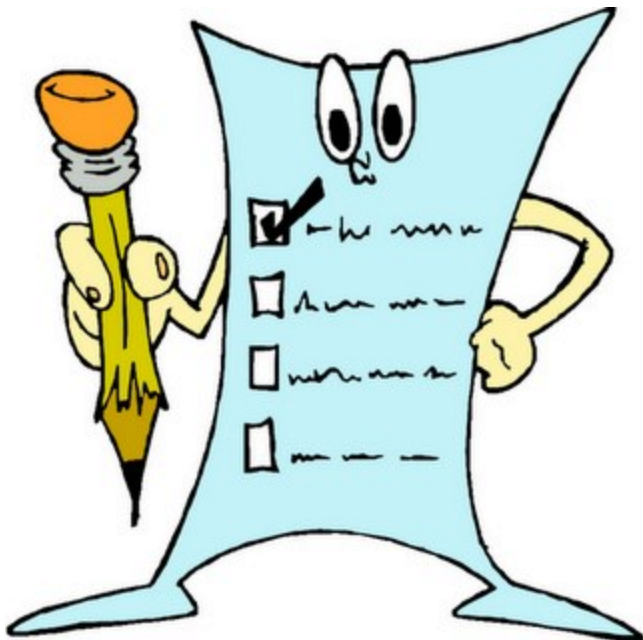

22-B Charitable Foundation Exists

Yes, 22-B does have a Charitable Foundation. It provides funds to clubs, a collection of clubs, or zones to help with community projects when extra funds are needed. The Foundation will provide up to 50% of the cost of a project which includes Lions active involvement. As an example, the Kent Island and Queenstown Lions Clubs recently received a grant for \$500 for a community youth project in Queen Anne's County.

There are two ways you can help with the Foundation. First, apply for a grant to help with your Lions project. Consider a Lions Legacy Project to help celebrate our 100 years as Lions. Funds are available. The application form for grants can be found in this newsletter.

The other way to help is by donating to the Foundation. A good way to do this is by recognizing a Lion or a community leader with a Darley Travers Fellowship. They come in four levels: Basic Pin at \$100, Sapphire Pin at \$250, Ruby Pin at \$500, and Diamond Pin at \$1000. The Diamond level also includes a distinctive plaque. The required donation for the pins is cumulative. For example, a recipient of a Basic Pin may upgrade to Sapphire for an additional \$150. To date, we have awarded 70 Basic Pins, 6 Sapphire Pins, 1 Ruby Pin, and 16 Diamond Pins. Any club will also receive special recognition when they become a 100% Darley Travers Fellow club. Thus far, Salisbury Metro Lions Club has received this distinction.

CUB CLUB CORNER ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS OF OUR LEO CLUBS



Colonel Richardson High School Leo Club

The Colonel Richardson Leo Club celebrated the end of a busy and successful year of service with a pizza party. Some of their projects have included collecting food and supplies for the Caroline County Humane Society and making fleece blankets to give to area churches. Sponsor Lion Bobbi Bee and Liaison Frankie Bennett of the Federalsburg Lions Club joined in the year end celebration. This upcoming year Lion Karen Mensonides will serve as liaison.

Perryville Middle School Leo Club

The Perryville Middle School Leo Club has been busy collecting can goods and nonperishable food items for their annual food drive. Company D of the Maryland Infantry Civil War Re-enactors learned about the Leo project and has joined in their efforts. Together they will make a huge difference in the community. Lion Michele McKay is the Leo advisor.

The History of Leo Clubs

Coach Jim Graver started the first Leo Club in 1957. Graver was a Lion and baseball coach at Abington High School in Pennsylvania. With help from his fellow Lion, William Ernst, the first Leo club was chartered on December 5, 1957. As the world's first Leo club, the Abington High School Leo Club created the Leo acronym: Leadership, Equality, Opportunity and chose their school colors, maroon and gold, to serve as the Leo club colors. Later, Equality was changed to Experience.

In October 1967, the board of directors of Lions Clubs International adopted the Leo Club Program as an official program of the association. The Leo Club Program has continued to grow within the last 50 years. Leos now constitute an international network of over 6,500 clubs in over 140 countries. Community service remains the cornerstone of the program, fostering a lifetime commitment to helping others.

Sponsoring a Leo club provides Lions with opportunities to mentor and empower young leaders. Through involvement with a Leo club, Lions can energize and inspire members and even increase the sponsoring club's community exposure, attracting potential members.

We currently have 10 Leo clubs in the district. If you follow the District 22B Facebook page or read the District Newsletters, you have learned about all of the wonderful projects our Leos do every day.

Common Questions About Starting a Leo Club

1. What are the costs to start a club?

The sponsoring Lions club will pay a one-time organization fee of \$100.00. A sponsoring club will then receive a certificate of organization, a Leo club officer kit, a Leo Club sponsor kit, and lapel pins for charter members. Each year the sponsoring club will pay a levy of \$100.00.

2. What are the age limits for Leos?

Leos are between the ages of 12 and 30.

3. Is there more than 1 type of Leo club? Yes.

Alpha- designed for youth between 12 and 18

Omega- designed for young adults between 18 and 30

4. What does a Leo Club Advisor do?

A Lion appointed from the sponsoring Lions club guides Leos and helps them with projects. A school - based Leo Club usually has a faculty member as the advisor or one of the advisors.

5. Can more than one Lion Club sponsor a Leo club??

Yes, the number does not matter. According to PDG Coverdale (Delaware) a zone there sponsors a Leo club.

Is your club thinking about starting a Leo Club? Please contact me and I will be glad to meet with your club and answer any questions you might have.

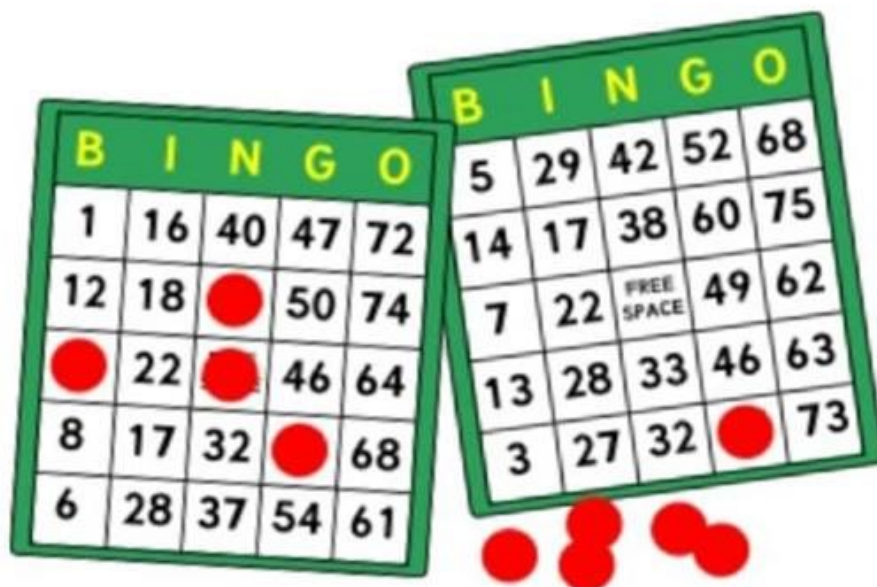
