MEMBERSHIP PULSE DISTRICT 22B LIONS INTERNATIONAL

Membership Summit

MD22 began the Lions' Year on July 1, 2017, with 6,813 members. After six months, as of December 31, 2017, 22A has 801 members in 29 Clubs, 22B has 1,320 members in 46 Clubs, 22C has 1,337 members in 47 Clubs, 22D has 1,263 members in 35 Clubs, and 22W has 1,929 members in 59 Clubs. We have added 283 new Lions in the first half of the Lions' Year, but have dropped 442 Lions, for a net loss of 159. We have 216 active Clubs, but have cancelled 3 Clubs and have one in status quo. We have no pending new Clubs.

What are we going to do? Are we going to wait for our five Districts to be reorganized with all of the Districts impacted? Or, are we going to take action in each Club and each District to slow the loss of members which will allow our organization to grow?

At the request of the Council of Governors and the Long Range Planning Committee, MD22 Global Membership Team Coordinator PDG Dee Hawkins and MD22 Global Leadership Team Coordinator Lion Martin Bonura are hosting a Membership Summit to be held on two different dates and at two different locations. This is the third and final step in a two-year process. The Summit will be an interactive event with action plans provided to each participant to bring back to their Clubs and their Districts. These action plans will emphasize how to succeed in retaining members, as well as action plans for recruiting new members.

The first Summit will be held on Saturday, April 14, 2018 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the Elks Annapolis Lodge #622 at 2 Pythian Drive, Edgewater, MD 21037. The second will be held on Saturday, April 28, 2018 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the Myersville Fire Department Hall at 301 Main Street, Myersville, MD 21773. Coffee and donuts, as well as lunch will be provided.

We are asking each Club in each District to send two or more attendees to either of the two Summits. We ask that each Club or individual Lion RSVP to md22membership@gmail.com with the names of those who will attend and which Summit they have chosen.

If you are not artistically inclined, you can still make an impact through LOVRNET. Most of you are aware of the role that Lions play in the Patient Interview and Direct Services areas of the project. As the number of patients grows, so too does the need for volunteers to assist with these critical areas. There is a whole range of other opportunities to engage in beside those two.

- LOVRNET is revisiting the community of eye care providers in our Multiple to identify new businesses that we can approach seeking their participation and support. We will need help to scrub a list of providers and select those we want to target.
- A small group of Lions are currently engaged in identifying topics and gathering information that can be posted to the LOVRNET web site and distributed through social media to enhance the visibility of the project. We need Lions who can spot and report interesting articles. You can also elect to don your best Ernest Hemingway persona and create articles on your own. (You can even get a byline!)
- PDG Steve Finger has pulled out all the stops to raise the LOVRNET profile. He may be reaching his limit. Loose your imagination and offer him some thoughts on how to market LOVRNET.
- \$\$\$ It almost always comes down to dollars, doesn't it. To date, the LOVRNET project has been funded by grants. When the initial LCIF SightFirst grant was about to expire, a call went out to Lions and several clubs responded with donations to bridge an anticipated delay in receipt of our follow on SightFirst grant request. We do not intend to make this a standard practice. Until LOVRNET can become self-sustaining through revenue obtained from fees from new Lions districts joining the network and sales of the shopping carts, we need identify and seek grant funding from other organizations. Johns Hopkins has access to a database of potential grant sources. We need volunteers now to search that database and identify likely targets for LOVRNET. We then need volunteers that can put together grant requests for submittals. LOVRNET has identified a need in our communities to help our neighbors with low vision. And, Where There's a Need, There's a Lion. Please be one of those Lions that help our neighbors. Please consider volunteering in any way with LOVRNET. LIONS VISION CENTER FELLOW ENDOWMENT CAMPAIGN

Fellow 22B Lions:

As most of you know, I am currently serving as one of your trustees on the Lions Vision Research Foundation Board of Directors. Last year, we kicked off a new endowment campaign that will insure that the most elite medical students that specialize in the field of Low Vision can further their studies at Johns Hopkins in the Low Vision Center at Wilmer. Many of you have had the pleasure of hearing many of these students known as Fellows speak at the annual LVRF dinners. They are truly the best of the best. This is a highly competitive Fellow Program, as only one student per year is chosen. This campaign is unique in that we are asking for donations from many sources including individual Lions, corporations, foundations, and Lions beyond the borders of the MD 22. However, individual clubs, while not being singled out for requests, can also contribute.

In December, every Lion in Multiple District 22 received a letter asking for a donation to the LVC Fellow Endowment. I am asking that you please consider making a donation to this most worthy campaign. Once we have this \$2 million dollar endowment in place, we can free up \$100,000 annually from our LVRF operating budget. However, the most important reason to donate is that we will be known as the Multiple District that sends out the best specialists in Low Vision to medical & vision centers around the world. The impact of this has already been felt in Massachusetts, Illinois, California, and right here in MD 22 as past Fellows are becoming leaders in Vision Centers in these areas. As our population ages, the need for these specialists increase drastically. You can help make the difference. There are over 6500 Lions in our Multiple District. If every Lion was able to donate just \$50.00 from this letter campaign, some \$325,000.00 could be added to the already \$300,000 raised. That would be huge.

I want to thank all of you for the opportunity to serve as one of your trustees on the LVRF Board of Directors and again I ask that you please consider a donation of \$50 to the LVC Fellow Endowment Campaign.

22-B Charitable Foundation Exists

Yes, 22-B does have a Charitable Foundation. It provides funds to clubs, a collection of clubs, or zones to help with community projects when extra funds are needed. The Foundation will provide up to 50% of the cost of a project which includes Lions active involvement. As an example, the Kent Island and Queenstown Lions Clubs recently received a grant for \$500 for a community youth project in Queen Anne's County.

There are two ways you can help with the Foundation. First, apply for a grant to help with your Lions project. Consider a Lions Legacy Project to help celebrate our 100 years as Lions. Funds are available. The application form for grants can be found in this newsletter.

The other way to help is by donating to the Foundation. A good way to do this is by recognizing a Lion or a community leader with a Darley Travers Fellowship. They come in four levels: Basic Pin at \$100, Sapphire Pin at \$250, Ruby Pin at \$500, and Diamond Pin at \$1000. The Diamond level also includes a distinctive plaque. The required donation for the pins is cumulative. For example, a recipient of a Basic Pin may upgrade to Sapphire for an additional \$150. To date, we have awarded 70 Basic Pins, 6 Sapphire Pins, 1 Ruby Pin, and 16 Diamond Pins. Any club will also receive special recognition when they become a 100% Darley Travers Fellow club. Thus far, Salisbury Metro Lions Club has received this distinction.






