The Public Home page has the published address and therefore is the primary entry point for searches on "Lions District 22B"; as a result, it may frequently be the first hit on the way to finding information contained on one of the other pages.

<u>Note</u>: Page visit totals are not available for the Calendar, Photo Gallery, Member Directory or Newsletter Archive pages due to the fact that their formats prevent embedding code needed to accumulate the number of visit occurrences. They therefore can not be ranked. However there are frequent visits to the Calendar page and a few visits to the Newsletter Archive. Fewer visits are likely to the Member Directory page.

Who has Access:

Anyone on Earth who has Internet access can visit or view the District 22B "*Public*" pages, and all 2014-2015 District 22B Officers, Committee Chairs, Foundation Members, and (Lion, Lioness or LEO Club) Presidents, Secretaries and Treasures have been granted login access to the "*Member*" Pages. In addition, many former 2013-2014 Officers, Committee Chairs, Foundation Members, Club Presidents, Secretaries and Treasures who have left office, have retained authorized access to the Members Pages and a few other District 22B Lions have requested and received login access to the site.

As of February 12, 2015, a total of 233 out of more than 1,400 Lions within District 22B currently have login access to the Member Pages of the District 22B website.

How to get Access to the "Members" pages:

All Lions in District 22B who have Internet Access may access the Members pages of the website by making a one-time Email request and by providing their Email Address. The Email address will become their login ID once it is entered into the Members Directory of the website and thereafter they will be able to obtain the current password by clicking on the "Forgot My Password" link on the Public Home page within the Members login window (shown below).

Geographic Origin of Public Home Page Visits:

Since going public on April 18, 2014 our Public Home page has been viewed 897 times by 654 unique visitors who have made 160 return visits.

<u>Around the world</u>, we have been visited by residents of 29 countries; with 385 unique visits from the United States, 63 from Brazil, 6 from Italy, 5 from United Kingdom, 5 from Mexico, 5 from Portugal, 4 from Canada, and 181 unique visits from 22 other countries around the world.


Within the United States, we have had 212 visits from Maryland, 31 from Delaware, 14 from New Jersey, 13 from the District of Columbia, 8 from Iowa, 8 from Washington, 7 from Pennsylvania and 92 unique visits from the 44 remaining states.


