#### LIONS VISION CENTER FELLOW ENDOWMENT CAMPAIGN

#### Fellow 22B Lions:

As most of you know, I am currently serving as one of your trustees on the Lions Vision Research Foundation Board of Directors. Last year, we kicked off a new endowment campaign that will insure that the most elite medical students that specialize in the field of Low Vision can further their studies at Johns Hopkins in the Low Vision Center at Wilmer. Many of you have had the pleasure of hearing many of these students known as Fellows speak at the annual LVRF dinners. They are truly the best of the best. This is a highly competitive Fellow Program, as only one student per year is chosen. This campaign is unique in that we are asking for donations from many sources including individual Lions, corporations, foundations, and Lions beyond the borders of the MD 22. However, individual clubs, while not being singled out for requests, can also contribute.

In December, every Lion in Multiple District 22 received a letter asking for a donation to the LVC Fellow Endowment. I am asking that you please consider making a donation to this most worthy campaign. Once we have this \$2 million dollar endowment in place, we can free up \$100,000 annually from our LVRF operating budget. However, the most important reason to donate is that we will be known as the Multiple District that sends out the best specialists in Low Vision to medical & vision centers around the world. The impact of this has already been felt in Massachusetts, Illinois, California, and right here in MD 22 as past Fellows are becoming leaders in Vision Centers in these areas. As our population ages, the need for these specialists increase drastically. You can help make the difference. There are over 6500 Lions in our Multiple District. If every Lion was able to donate just \$50.00 from this letter campaign, some \$325,000.00 could be added to the already \$300,000 raised. That would be huge.

I want to thank all of you for the opportunity to serve as one of your trustees on the LVRF Board of Directors and again I ask that you please consider a donation of \$50 to the LVC Fellow Endowment Campaign.

## CUB CLUB CORNER ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS OF OUR LEO CLUBS

#### The Ocean City-Berlin Leo Club

The Ocean City-Berlin Leo Club, chartered in 2006, remains a vital part of its community. With a membership of about 40 members, the Stephen Decatur High School based club stands ready to serve. Every year the Leos assist the OC Lions in raising awareness and funds for their many eyesight programs. The Leos also support the Leader Dogs for the Blind Program.

At the 22B District Leader Dogs Dinner in Willards last year, members presented a check for \$650.00. In October, the club partnered with the Ocean City American Legion and other school groups, to collect food and personal care items for our troops The Leos also made a \$150.00 donation to this important effort. The event was hugely successful, and the American Legion will now be able to distribute many items and funds to the troops.

In November, members held a bake sale at the school and raised \$137.00. Later in the month, they had their annual pancake breakfast at the Applebee's in West Ocean City. English teacher and school adviser, Nikki Zervakos and Lion Wayne Cannon of the OC Lions guide this outstanding group of civic minded students. Stephen Decatur Seahawks Serve!

#### North Caroline High School Leo Club

The North Caroline High School Leo Club is a testament to the high ideals of service. Lion Donna DiGiacomo, serves as their adviser. In celebration of Ridgely's 150th Birthday, the club built a float and it won first place! The Leos also helped the Ridgely Lions Club, one of their club's sponsors, at their annual car show.

To help the children affected by the flooding in Houston, the club participated in "Helping Houston Heal" by collecting and filling backpacks with school supplies. In October, the Leos and other school clubs sponsored Haunted Hallways at their school. The school was decorated, and candy was distributed to the many children trick or treating that night.

Members have also undertaken fundraising which netted over \$2,000 for Imagination Library. Recently the club created a school fund called "Helping Hands" to help the 30 homeless students in the school. Although actively involved in other causes, the Leos decided it was just as important to help students in their own community. So far, a little over \$3,000 has been raised for this worthy cause. Currently they are collecting clothes, food, toiletries, etc. to go along with money. Another worthy project the Leos have undertaken is collecting canned goods. Most of the food will be given to local food banks and the rest will be kept in their Helping Hands food bank. In November members of the Leo Club helped with the local Shop w/a Cop event. In the spirit of Christmas, the club has also "adopted" a local child. Future projects in 2018, include starting a collection for box tops and can tabs, making "Bags of Hope" for children in the hospital, conducting a fund raiser for the local Humane Society, and helping to sponsor Relay for Life in Caroline County. #### Somerset Intermediate School Leo Club

The Somerset Intermediate School Leo Club, sponsored by the Marion Lions Club was chartered in May of 2017. The club currently has 14 members. Since their inception, they have been very active serving the communities of Marion, Crisfield, and Princess Anne.
