LCIF Report

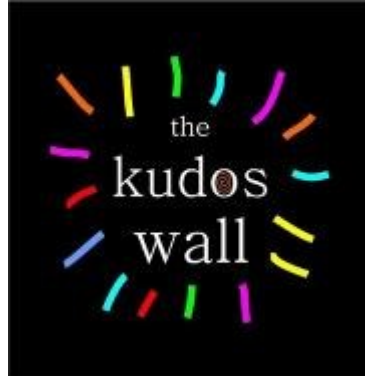

The Santa Chase awards, costume prizes and fabulous holiday raffles will be distributed at 5:30 pm in the Martinak State Park Nature Center. All participants and volunteers are invited to enjoy tasty goodies and hot cocoa following the chase.
