District Governor Wayne has asked me to serve as Research & Long Range Planning Chair for our District. I recently met with District A, C, D & W chairs to conduct research & long range planning for the Multiple District.

This meeting enabled me to learn a little about what the other districts are doing, what their concerns are, what each of the districts want to address for the next two years (short term) and what to plan for the years following (long term). I was able to share some concerns from our district 22-B that I and other Lions in 22-B have discussed at past cabinet meetings. However I've realized in order to represent 22-B at the District level and the Multiple level, I need to learn what each Club in 22-B is doing, what your concerns are, what your club wants to address short term and long term. Naturally I want to focus on 22-B for our future now and down the road. It should not come as a surprise to you that my concerns center on membership. At the MD 22 meeting for long range planning, a 10 year chart on membership was shared with everyone. There was much discussion about what might, could and should be done about membership. Our goal is to have a plan to submit to the Council of Governors by the end of the Lion Year.

Before I delve, into what I learned at this MD22 meeting, with all of you, I would like for each Club to discuss among yourselves as a group, what you see as your concerns for the short term as well as the long term for the future of your Club and E-mail me a brief list. The list can be about what your club needs from the District (onsite support for projects, fund raisers and seminars at the club level). You know membership is one thing, like getting new members but even more important is keeping the members you now have. So what is working and better yet what is not working and speaking up about it. I sense that this current cabinet wants to help 22-B become better and bigger and your input at the club level can help our leaders to put into action things that will make a positive impact. I will summarize a list from all the responses I receive. Constructive criticism along with concerns and ideas are most welcome. My time frame for receiving your input would be by December 31, 2015.


